

Ansel Adams on Horseshoe Hill by Uri Korn

In the late 1930s Ansel Adams drove down Horseshoe Hill in Bolinas, California with his 8x10 camera and made a photograph. Adams later exhibited the photograph he made with the title "Stump and Barn near Olema, California" in a group show he had curated titled "A Pageant of Photography" which took place on Treasure Island in San Francisco in 1941. The image was also published that same year in a printed catalog about the exhibition. In the late 1950s he then provided a reproduction or "press print" of the photograph to be used for reproduction by the National Parks Service, who often used Adams images during the planning and creating stages for parklands. In May of 2013 I moved to Bolinas and in the same month I acquired the vintage stamped press print of this photo which till then had been in the family of the former head of reproductions for the National Park Service.

Adams images were pivotal in helping preserve wilderness because his photos swayed both public and federal opinions and gave a visual to often unseen places such as his favorite National Park Yosemite, which later named one of its mountains after him. Throughout Marin County including Point Reyes, Marshall and Tomales he made photographs of both wilderness and of the historic ranching district that had become part of the landscape and culture.

After a few months of researching the photo and looking for traces of the property I met Stinson Beach Librarian Kerry Livingston who suggested I contact her husband and local historian Dewey Livingston who knows many of the barns of the region by memory. In one quick look at the image Dewey pointed me in the direction of Horseshoe Hill and from there I was able to find the still existing barn. I went to the front door of the main house and showed the photo to the current stewards of the farm, the Mann family, who had never known about the photo. We shared our mutual excitement over the discovery that Ansel had photographed their barn and that they had just the night before been discussing their hope for finding historical and vintage photos of the property.




Stump and Barn near Olema, California, Circa 1939


Ansel Adams made a good choice in his documenting of this particular farm as its history, present and future in Bolinas make it an important landmark. The barn and the surrounding farm it sits on is one of the oldest in the region reaching back to some of the original dairy families who farmed the area. The ranch was settled in the early 1900s by the

Mattos family and when Madeline Mattos married a Balzan family member it became the Balzan Dairy Farm. Warren Hellman, creator of the Hardly Strictly Bluegrass Festival, purchased the property from the Balzan family in 1991 to house his horses who were trained and cared for by members of the Mann Family. In true Bolinas style when Warren Hellman passed away part of the farm was gifted to the Mann Family. The Mann Family Farm now continues in the tradition of tending to the land and using it wisely as a horse facility, special event center, sustainable with ecology progressive farm education tours and a place to raise their family.

My housemate found a Scottish Pointer on Horseshoe Hill Road in Bolinas about 4 months ago and named her Lyla. She was frighteningly emaciated, frantic, covered in fleas, and had no collar. After asking around to neighbors who had never seen the dog, she brought her home to figure out what to do next.

Then Lyla and I fell in love.

She's the best dog I've ever met. She's so sweet and gentle, and has absolutely ZERO aggression. She not only gets along with, but loves all people, dogs, cats, animals, children, babies, you name it! She's very energetic and athletic and going on hikes with her is a blast. And oh man! I'm not sure if I've met a better cuddler, animal or human.

She's made so much progress since we found her. She's gained 10 lbs and knows how to sit, stay, and come when called. The problem is, I wouldn't have chosen to get a dog at this point in my life. My schedule is very erratic and I travel quite a bit. Added onto that, Lyla has a severe case of Separation Anxiety.

From all the evidence we gathered about Lyla when we found her, (very long toenails, bad sense of special reasoning, everything she encountered seemed like it was the first time, no training whatsoever, milk in her teats) our best guess is that she was kept in a cage for the first 3 years of her life and used as a breeding dog at a puppy mill. Then she either outlived her usefulness then was dumped in West Marin, or she somehow escaped.

It makes sense that after a life like that she would have Separation Anxiety. It's a real, serious condition. She requires a lot of patience, training, and for her to be with someone she's comfortable with 24/7 until she gets better. I'm hoping that I can find a big active family, or at least a couple, preferably with another dog already in West Marin who would be interested in taking on rehabilitation and a beautiful life with the most tender and loveable dog I've ever known.

I would really like to still be in her life and am looking for an "open adoption" type situation. Basically, I would love to be the go-to dog sitter and dog walker when you're busy or out of town. Please contact me if you're interested, and we can set up a time to meet and talk further to see if you and Lyla are the right match.
