

Winter is often a time of reflection, so what better subject to contemplate than that of the mirror and its legacy as tool and device. The looking glass is the forerunner of the selfie. We are all Narcissus, to one degree or another. The first mirror-likely a pool of still waterallowed humans to see themselves as others did. Later came polished surfaces--copper, bronze, silver, pyrite. even stone-though the quality of the image was so very low that Paul, in Corinthians 13:12, used it as a symbol of obfuscation...seeing, as in a mirror, darkly.
