

Gabe Korty was born and raised in Point Reyes, is a musician, and creator of the Parachute Days concert series at Love Field.


Van Waring will be found most recently playing with her musical companions in the country covers group Gospel Flatters, and checking out your library items . Though you might not know it, she writes songs too.





<u>What about a Maximum Wage?</u>

 ${f A}$ ll work is important.

Different jobs pay different rates. Farm stoop-laborers, retail clerks, custodians, ditchdiggers, baby sitters, and slaughterhouse workers get a *minimum wage* of \$15 per hour, more or less. Barbers, bookkeepers, plumbers and electricians make a little bit more; bankers, lawyers and doctors are probably better off than them, and executives of Multi-National Corporations get the most.

Think of it this way: A plumber who makes \$60 per hour is worth four retail clerks at \$15 per hour. A lawyer at \$120 is worth eight slaughterhouse workers.

How much are you worth? What makes sense for a Maximum Wage. Does ten-to-one seem about right? Can a really special person be worth ten ordinary workers? \$150 per hour?

How many minimum wage workers does the President of Exxon replace? In 2016, the web tells me, Rex Tillerson was paid a little over \$24 million dollars. My iphone calculator says that's eleven thousand dollars an hour ... seven-hundred and thirty-three people. What does he do in his spare time?

Are you looking to make ends meet? Can this be right? What do you think?
