



I'll be going down to Mexico with friends for a couple of months, maybe more, and with the Trumpian effect brewing with immediacy right here in our town, I'm not sure what I'll return to.

Before I go, I wish to express my gratitude and appreciation for all the loving support I've felt from so many of you, including long-time home-owners on Brighton. You've given me plenty of encouragement in what could have been an uncomfortable situation otherwise. Townspeople, as well as many visiting passers-by smiling my way, have made me feel welcomed and I felt truly at home out there on that street. It's been fun. Even the sheriff's deputies have been courteous and conversational and I commend them for that. I want to thank you, all of you.

Of course I knew there were malcontents in the shadows. I've had two encounters, both with house-owners on Brighton. I don't wish to be mean so I won't be slanderous or nice. One party of the two house-owners doesn't live here at all, runs an ongoing BnB, often with noisy, reveling groups of six to twelve guests at a time. He has a history of curtly dismissing his neighbor's phone calls when they ask him to consider some issue, maybe of late-night lights and laughter. I looked out one day and he was talking with a deputy, gesturing darkly in my direction, so I took my cup of tea and joined the conversation. Seems he had lost some tools from his closet or shed and told me tell everyone - making accusational motions toward the vans across the street - that he had a shotgun and would use it - to paraphrase politely. I wouldn't normally advertise this publicly but he did say 'everyone' - sorry it's taken so long. I reminded him he has a lot of strangers in his house every week.

The other party, a man and his wife who own a huge house on Brighton are quiet, as they're seldom there. The latter, perhaps in league with the former have filed the complaints to the county. This has set the wheels in motion for ordinances that would – if passed – effectively make it impossible for anyone to live in vans on the streets of Bolinas – it looks like they could get their wish.

So I went over to the Civic Center on Tuesday morning to attend the public meeting. There was a slight attendance, only half a dozen – due to the fact that they gave us little time between announcing the proposed laws and the time of the hearing – but I and several others spoke to the problem of homelessness and the importance of RV dwelling being allowable. Some of the pleas from the others: That there really isn't any place to go. That even after having a successful life, it was no longer possible to afford even an "affordable" place. That recognizing the fact that vehicledwelling would be the easiest, cheapest and most immediate solution to the homeless problem in our country.

I expressed to Supervisor Rodoni the disappointment that I and members of the Bolinas Parking Committee and the BCLT felt that he attended the private meeting, (in the abovementioned private house, comprised of those who were calling for the ordinance) and not the public meeting at the firehouse that was held later on the same evening, where he

might have heard some other sentiments to mull over. If he had come he might have gained a sense of how we operate here. He might, and still may come to realize that there are few problems and very little crime from the citizenry or from the frequent unsavory-looking characters who roam our streets — from who knows where? — nor is there much vandalism from our teens. Anyone who cares to actually join in with the social life here would soon feel and be a part of our self-governing autonomy. Tolerance for what we may not like has proven to be a successful model over a span of many years. We complain and bitch, yes, but rarely call in the law. When we read the sheriff's calls for Bolinas they usually give us a good laugh. They're also the subject of a good song.

I asked the board not to finalize this motion at least until we held a town meeting with Supervisor Rodoni present, where all points of view could be aired. I also suggested that maybe we could put it to a town vote.

In their summation statements, all members of the board one by one expressed much heartfelt compassion and concern over the homeless problem, with assurances that "... it is never our intention to put anyone out of their RVs" etc. and so on... then without pause closed the session with "I put the motion before the board to pass the ordinance" — all five superintendents concurred while flipping their pages.

OK, so what is that?



# ORDINANCE NO. \_\_\_\_\_ ORDINANCE OF THE MARIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS TO RESTRICT PARKING IN VARIOUS MANNERS ON ROADS TO BE SPECIFIED IN SEPARATELY ENACTED RESOLUTIONS

**SECTION III.** Section 15.36.080 is hereby added to the Marin County Code to read as follows: 15.36.080 No overnight parking of vehicles, except for automobiles, motorcycles, and pickups. With the exception of automobiles, motorcycles (as defined in the California Vehicle Code Section 400), and pickups (as defined in the California Vehicle Code Section 471), on those County roads or locations specified by the Marin County Board of Supervisors by Resolution, no vehicle (as defined in the California Vehicle Code Section 670) may be parked at those specified locations between the hours of 11:00 pm and 5:00 am. This section may not be enforced until adequate signage informing the public of these restrictions has been installed.



# Bolinas Museum Opening Reception New Exhibitions Saturday, January 28

The museum is opening new exhibitions that explore aesthetics, insights, innovation and vivid creativity. For the main gallery exhibition *Chair Stories*, museum director Jennifer Gately invited twelve influential architects, artists and design experts--with ties to coastal Marin--to contribute a chair or two along with their personal narrative describing how the chair has influenced their life, professional thinking, or design practice. The results are intriguing, and surprising. Some chairs are worn, some are sleek modern, some are by local fine craftsmen and there is a handcrafted seat for a composting toilet.

The participants are Valentino Agnoli, architect; Joseph Becker, Design Curator, SFMoMA; Yves Behar, industrial designer and Fuse Project Founder; Tripp Carpenter woodworker /furniture maker; Lara Deam – Dwell Magazine founder and Chris Deam, architect/designer; Charles DeLisle – interior, furniture, and lighting designer; Rob Forbes, Design Within Reach founder; John Lum, architect; Eric McDougall, Design Creative; Sim Van der Ryn, Architect; and IdoYoshimoto, woodworker/artist.

Also opening on the 28<sup>th</sup>: *Home Studies: Portraits Without People*, photographs by Leslie Williamson. These are intimate interior portraits of iconic mid-century modern designer's homes around the globe. Her books *Handcrafted Modern: At Home with Mid-Century Designers*, and *Modern Originals: At Home with MidCentury European Designers* bring us a view of striking functional beauty, imagination and

Carey Cherney: Fire and Light, is an exhibition of Cherney's handsome stoneware, raku art vessels, garden water bowls and the debute of his ceramic lighting. Cherney has lived in Bolinas since 1990 and fires his work in the kiln he built. The history room exhibit The Waterhouse & Pepper Families: Their Bolinas Legacy reveals how much influence these two families had on downtown Bolinas as we see it today.

Join us for the insightful talks by artists and curators at 2 PM. The reception is from 3-5 PM. Exhibition Preview talks 2 P.M., Opening Reception 3-5 P.M. The event is free, as always is entry to the museum's exhibitions.




