Here are some facts Don explained to me about the meteorite his star gazing class

witnessed last night:

The speed of sound is 1090 feet per second. It takes approximately 5 seconds for sound to travel 1 mile: sound to travel 1 mile: (1 mile = 5280 feet; 5280 divided by 1090 = 4.84 seconds) It takes 1 minute for sound to travel 12.4 miles (60 divided by 4.84 = 12.4)

The time between seeing the meteorite last night and hearing the sonic boom was estimated by Don and his students to be between one and a half and two minutes. So the meteorite was approximately 22 miles  $(1.5 \times 12.4 = 18.6; 2 \times 12.4 =$ away.

It took about 10 seconds for the meteorite to cross the sky. This would indicate that the meteorite was very distant, and 22 miles is very distant in our atmosphere.

Its large size compared to usual "shooting stars," which are usually the size of grains of sand that are quite close to earth, indicates that it was extremely large.

The sonic boom also rumbled for about 20 seconds.
