You are invited to the celebration of a traditional Latin American holiday that combines pre-Colombian festivals and indigenous traditions with European rituals for honoring the dead. It is celebrated every year at this same time as Halloween and the Christian holy days of All Saints Day and All Souls Day.

In homes, families arrange "ofrendas" or altars. Tables are covered with fruit, flowers, vegetables, bread, candy, candles, incense, photos of the deceased, papel picado (paper cut-outs) represent the sky. Marigold petals are sprinkled to create a path for the spirits to follow on their return.

Those interested in helping to create our village altar will meet at 8am Thursday, Nov 1 in the BCC hall. Photos of those who have passed over are invited along with mementos and flowers.

The hall will be open for the honoring of "Dia de los Angelitos" (remembering children who have died) on Thursday, Nov 1 from 4pm to midnight. The BCC will have pumpkin soup and cornbread and Mexican chocolate available.

On Friday, Nov. 2, "Dia de los Muertos", the BCC will be open from noon to midnight. Mirta is making traditional pozole and Mexican chocolate. This day is not a sad time, but one rather of remembering and rejoicing. Musicians are welcome.

Minutes from the September 24, 2012 Bolinas Fire Protection District Board Meeting

Pres. Buchanan called the regular meeting of the Bolinas Fire Protection District to order at 7:35PM. Vice Pres. Kilkenny, Dir. Kimball and Dir. O'Donnell were present. Dir. Smith was absent. Also present: Chief Brown, Secretary Brown, Ed Chiera, Vic Amoroso, Don Smith and Laura Fazzini, a property specialist with Crown Castle. MSC, O'Donnell/Kilkenny (unan with one absence) to approve the agenda.

**CHIEF'S REPORT**

**MERA**  
None.

**Prevention**

Chief Brown reported that she is currently working to finish and mail brochures regarding Wildfire safety. Included in the information will be a Defensible Space Self Inspection checklist. The brochures will be mailed to every property owner and box holder in Bolinas. She added that she is pleased with the cooler weather change in the local climate.

**Inspection**

Marin County building Department will allow third party inspections for solar installations if the property owner/contractor is willing to pay for the service.

**Grants**

The District has received \$8,045 in West Marin Emergency Services funding, also known as Burton money. These funds are intended to lessen the impact of responses to incidents in and around the park lands, and is typically used for buying wild land fire equipment. Chief Brown will discuss the needs of the District with the firefighters and Officers as to how to best spend the funds.

**Training**

Chief Brown reported that firefighters trained with BCPUD personnel on Saturday morning September 22<sup>nd</sup>. The focus of the training was confined space rescue at the sewage lift station on Wharf Road. The drill on the next Tuesday night will be a continuation of this training but with firefighters only at the fire station. Chief Brown reported that Hybrid Electrical Vehicle training is scheduled for October 27<sup>th</sup> with the Stinson Beach and Inverness fire departments. The class will be taught by Delphi Automotive Systems. Dir. Kimball suggested that the Muir Beach fire department be included in the training. Chief Brown stated it is a class hosted by SBFPD, she will inquire with Chief Stevens as to room.

**Volunteers**

Fire Safety Day is scheduled for Sunday October 21<sup>st</sup>. Chief Brown invited the Board to attend.

**Disaster Council**

Chief Brown reported that the Great California Shake Out is scheduled for October 18<sup>th</sup>. Chief Brown hopes the event will raise awareness of the potential for earthquakes and the importance of preparedness. She will be contacting the school and placing informational notices in the Hearsay and the Post Office. Please refer to [www.shakeout.org](http://www.shakeout.org) for further information. Participation on any level is welcome.

**General Operations**

Chief Brown taught a second CPR class to National Park Service staff at Bear Valley on September 20<sup>th</sup>. It was well attended. She hopes to train staff there annually. The annual maintenance of all of the District's ground ladders and Self Contained Breathing Apparatus took place this month. A faulty computer was found on one of the SBCAs which cost \$750 to replace. All the other equipment including the ladders passed with flying colors. A "Toxic Away Day" was held in Bolinas on September 15<sup>th</sup>. Dir. Kimball commented that the San Rafael Dump also takes toxic materials. There is also an annual Electronics Waste day in Point Reyes Station.

**Surfer's Overlook**

Dir. Kimball reported that the work scheduled for Sept 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup> to test for soil conditions and to take soil samples for the next phase of the repair at Surfer's Overlook has been delayed until approximately next April. The sand levels on ground level are too low and inhibit the operation of large equipment. The tides are predicted to be low enough in April which would allow access of large equipment. Meanwhile, Dir. Kimball reported that Bob Beaumont, the new director of the DPW, has been very helpful and supportive of the project. He is working on getting the permit fees waived from the County for the possible repair.

Pres. Buchanan inquired about the four public assist calls listed in the August Fire Calls and Emergencies. Chief Brown answered that two were dogs that needed rescuing from under a dock and in a bush. The third call was for a pet bird stuck up in a tree and the fourth was for a person needing assistance to move from a vehicle into a house.

**Maintenance Agreement – CHA**

At the last Board meeting, the Board suggested that Chief Brown update the annual generator and sewage pump costs and draft an agreement that caps the maintenance fund at approximately \$25,000. Chief Brown is still defining a cap on the Common Area Maintenance account. She will present a figure at the October Board meeting but thinks it may be close to \$30,000 for each agency.

**GENERAL BUSINESS**

Action Item #1: Adopt Resolution #166-2012 Board of Directors of the BFPD Opposing New State Responsibility Area (SRA) "Fee" Being Imposed by the State of California. MSC, Kilkenny/O'Donnell (unan with one absence) to adopt Resolution #166-2012. Chief Brown commented that the fee is not negotiable and encouraged everyone to pay then protest through proper channels if they wish. Mutual and Auto aid agreements already exist that allow CalFire to respond to large scale incidents in Marin.

Action Item #2: Adopt Resolution #167-2012 Board of Directors of the BFPD continuing Implementation of all requirements of the Ralph M. Brown Act. MSC, Kilkenny/Kimball (unan with one absence) to adopt Resolution #167-2012. Pres. Buchanan explained how the State of California has suspended payment for meeting state compliance mandates regarding the Ralph M. Brown Act in order to reduce costs. The Board unanimously voted to comply with the Brown Act regardless.

Action Item #3: Approve Letter Supporting Wharf Road Residents' request for Speed Humps

The Board discussed the traffic on Wharf Road and concluded that there was no opposition to the letter written by Wharf Road residents to request speed humps. MSC, Kimball/O'Donnell (unan with one absence) to approve letter supporting expectation that enough information would be available from the conference call meeting being scheduled to call for a vote on the microwave antenna request. Chief Brown and Pres. Buchanan thanked Don Smith and Dir. Kimball for all of the time, energy and expertise spent on the antenna studies.

**CONSENT CALENDAR**

MSC, Kimball/O'Donnell (unan with one absence) to approve the Consent Calendar including the Minutes from the August 27, 2012 regular meeting and the warrant lists from August 28 – September 17, 2012, and the financial reports for July 2012 including the account balances.

**PUBLIC EXPRESSION**

None.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Dir. Kimball recommended researching the feasibility of refinancing the construction bond as interest rates are lower than when originally financed. He also noted that Chief Brown discovered that in the bond terms and conditions, the prepayment fee becomes \$0 in February 2013. He explained that the CREBS financing for the solar panels are interest free and are therefore not eligible for refinancing. All members approved of Dir. Kimball proceeding with the refinance.

None.

**ANNOUNCEMENT**

**GOOD OF THE ORDER**

Vice Pres. Kilkenny and Dir. O'Donnell thanked Dir. Kimball and Don Smith again for all of their dedication and hard work on the cell tower issues. Dir. Kimball remarked that the Volunteers' continuing contributions to the community are inspiring and make his work worth doing.

**ADJOURNMENT**

MSC, O'Donnell/Kimball (unan with one absence) to adjourn the meeting at 9:10 PM.

### Measure A

In Marin County, 95% of adults and youth report living walking distance from a park, playground or open space and 85% report visiting one in the last month. (2007 California Health Interview Survey) We all benefit from the proximity of our exquisite parks and open space as well as our family farms and ranches. Whether it be to maintain a healthy lifestyle through recreation and exercise, protect streams, baylands and wildlife habitat or have access to fresh, local foods our quality of life is dependent on these resources.

Today, these assets are at risk. As a result of funding shortfalls our forty year old parks have fallen \$23 Million behind in maintenance. Our ability to reduce wildfire risk and protect wildlife by providing for the careful management of natural lands is being compromised. Among other concerns, our nationally regarded farmland preservation program, carried out by the nonprofit Marin Agricultural Land Trust, which has permanently preserved over 45,000 acres of at risk farmland at little or no cost to the county, is finding state funding has just about dried up. Residents "are aware that parks are showing signs of budget cuts. The county's corps of rangers is stretched thin. Raising park fees has led to a decrease in use rather than a big boost in revenue." *Marin Independent Journal 8/15/12*

On November 6<sup>th</sup> we will have a decision to make. We will have the opportunity to pass a ¼ cent sales tax measure, Measure A, to protect and preserve our parks, open space and farmland. Fifteen percent of the ten million dollars raised annually will go to cities, towns and special districts, twenty percent will be for farmland preservation and sixty five per cent will go to County parks and open space. The tax will sunset in nine years. Measure A, will cost residents less than \$3 a month, protect our natural places, local parks and family farms that have taken generations to preserve and are essential to Marin County's extraordinary environment, economy, health and quality of life.

Most importantly, every penny will stay in Marin; funds cannot be taken away by the state government. Measure A requires independent citizens' oversight, mandatory financial audits and annual reports and funds cannot be spent on administrator salaries or pensions. Under Measure A, visitors from outside of Marin County will pay their fair share to fund the park and open space services they enjoy.

Measure A will help protect Marin's rolling hills, shorelines, wetlands, natural lands, forests and family farms throughout the county. It has taken decades to build the system of parks, open space and protected farmland we have today. These lands are a living legacy and it's essential that we renew our investment in them.

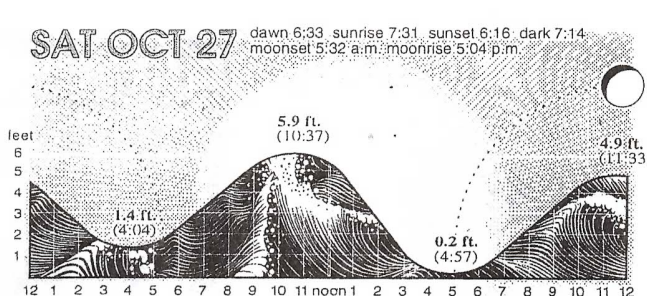
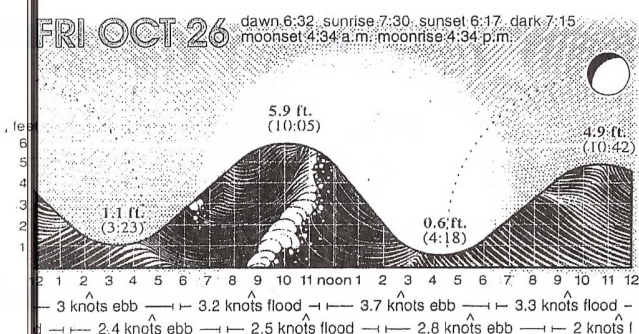
