## **BOB DEMMERLE FOR SCHOOL BOARD**

I have served the Bolinas-Stinson School District for 15 years as a volunteer in classrooms and field trips, coaching basketball and soccer and teaching an after school class for several years called Girls Club which focused on community service and the virtues. I have served on committees and have held leadership roles including Chair of Consolidation Task Force, Co-President of P.T.O. and 3 terms on Site Council, my last term just ending in September. I have two daughters, my eldest is a high school senior and my youngest is currently at the Bolinas-Stinson School. Both my daughters attended both of our pre-schools and have or are going through the Bolinas-Stinson school from K-8.

I understand the strengths and needs of our school. I believe we currently have a good school and I would like to work towards making our school a great school.

One focus I have had at our school for the past few years has been our school climate. I would like to work on adding a Social Emotional Learning (SEL) component to our Strategic Plan at the board level. SEL programs are in many if not most schools. There has been much research showing that having a focus on SEL improves academic learning. Makes sense that when a student feels good about themselves and the others around them their focus can then be on their school work.


Social Emotional Learning is the process through which children and adults acquire and effectively apply knowledge, attitudes and skills necessary to understand and manage emotions, set and achieve positive goals, feel and show empathy for others, establish and maintain positive relationships and make responsible decisions.

Most SEL programs at schools are designed to enhance five areas of social and emotional development.

- SELF AWARENESS: The ability to reflect on one's own feelings and thoughts and understand how those feelings and thoughts affect behavior.
- SELF MANAGEMENT: (Self control) The ability to control one's own emotions, actions and thoughts.
- SOCIAL AWARENESS: The ability to empathize with other people, understand and adhere to social cues and adopt behaviors so they are appropriate to a given social situation.
- 4) RELATIONSHIP SKILLS: The ability to communicate with peers, make friends, manage disagreements, manage appropriate and inappropriate peer pressure, and cooperate with a diverse range of people.
- 5) RESPONSIBLE DECISION MAKING: The ability to make healthy choices about one's own behavior while weighing consequences, safety, ethics and the well being of the group.

I have heard from many of you alumni students and parents, your personal history around school climate at our school and I know the climate over these past 15 years. We can do a much better job. At our small school physical bullying (hitting and stealing) is rarely a problem. It is the Verbal bullying (which is teasing, repeated embarrassing, name calling, and spreading rumors), Relational bullying (repeated excluded) and Cyber bullying (phone call, text, social media) which is a problem. When these students are in this situation, some day after day, where there are so few students and options this can be very damaging and lonesome. It's hard to give your best self on school work when you feel so down.

We need a cultural change at our school lead by the adults. We need to teach and model respect, kindness and responsibility. I can tell you from being with the children of our communities they suck up this positivity. They crave guidance and positive reinforcement and want to do what's right. They know in their hearts what feels good and they are capable of big change in a short time frame.



On 3 separate surveys last year from Site Council given to Teachers/Staff, Parents and most importantly Students "A sense of social emotional security" was ranked the lowest by ALL 3 GROUPS. Our current administration is behind the idea of improving this at our school. The time is ripe for movement in this area.

Next week, in this Hearsay I will write about academics, facilities bond and other school topics. The Point Reyes Light just came out with an article on all 3 candidates and I recommend all interested to read that article.






