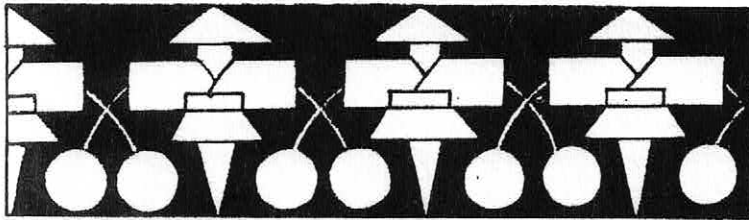
Get prepared for disaster

Time to get ready! On Oct. 14 and 21, our West Marin fire departments will offer a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training in Nicasio. This is an excellent and exciting opportunity to become prepared to help during a disaster that may overwhelm our professional first-responders. Learn basic emergency first aid, triage, radio skills, team building, fire safety and light search and rescue in this 19-hour class, for only \$45.

If you are the type to jump in and help when the going gets rough, please consider taking the time to attend this two-day class. We all hope a disaster won't occur, but when one does, West Marin will need to rely on our own resources. Let's pull together! To find out more information and to register, go to readymarin.org. 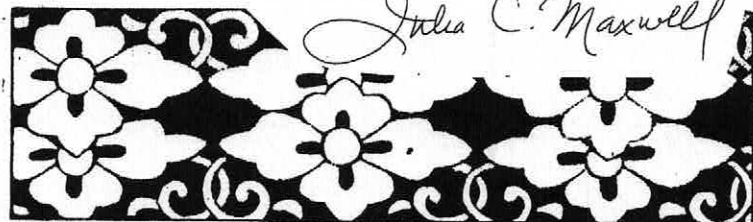

Endless Summer:

Bruce Brown's Timeless Masterpiece Comes to Bolinas on Saturday.

A fundraising event for the Bolinas Community Center, the iconic film will screen at 7PM Saturday Oct. 7. Surf legends and stars from the film, Mike Hynson and Paul Strauch, will be on hand to talk story after the film.

In 1963 with a \$50,000 budget, director Bruce Brown, surfers Robert August and Mike Hynson left California and embarked on a trip across the world in search of the perfect, empty wave.

When it first played in theaters, spellbound audiences – surfers or not -- lined up to see it again and again.

Since the film's release in 1964, The Endless Summer has become the most watched surf film of all time, inspired countless surf trips and now has an exhibit at Smithsonian Institute's National Museum of American History.

"Bruce Brown has left a permanent legacy of joy in the hearts and minds of anyone who has seen the film," says Paul Strauch, former director of the Surfing Heritage Cultural Center. "Come join us for a night you'll remember always."

Live ukulele music, food and drinks start at the BCC at 5pm.
