It is celebrated every year at this same time as Halloween and the Christian holy days of All Saints Day and All Souls Day. In homes, families arrange "ofrendas" or altars. Tables are covered with fruit, flowers, vegetables, bread, candy, candles, incense; photos of the deceased, papel picado (paper cut-outs) represent the sky. Marigold petals are sprinkled to create a path for the spirits to follow on their return.

Those interested in helping to create our village altar will meet and continue set-up after 1pm. Photos of those who have passed over are invited along with mementos and flowers.

On Friday, "Dia de los Muertos", the BCC will be open from noon to midnight. Mirta is making traditional pozole and Mexican chocolate. This day is not a sad time, but one rather of remembering and rejoicing. Musicians are welcome. Please join us for any or all of the celebration you can.
