

How Old People Eating Dog Food Can Help Our Economy

Everybody knows that the Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of how much things cost. If things cost more, the index goes up. If things cost less, the index goes down.

Many economic formulas are tied to the CPI, including rent, wages, and if you are old and retired, Social Security payments. When the cost of living goes up, as determined by the CPI, social security payments are automatically adjusted upwards so that poor old people can keep up with inflation. It's as simple as that.

Now a new kind of Consumer Price Index has been proposed by the folks who rule our country. It is called a "Chained Consumer Price Index", which, we are told, will save us a lot of

money. Here's how it works.

When the price of something goes up, people will naturally find a cheaper replacement item. If beef costs too much, people will switch to chicken, which costs less. And so on. The real cost of eating has not really gone up. They just eat something different, every bit as nutritious. This formula for measuring when something cheaper is substituted for something more expensive is called the "Chained Consumer Price Index." (CCPI)

The CCPI formula will save a lot of Social Security money. People who currently eat beef can switch to eating chicken. People who currently eat chicken can switch to dog food.

Thank you, Congresspersons. The dog food industry loves you.

The measure of a civilization includes the quality of life of the inhabitants. If the United States of America becomes a place where more old people on social security are eating dog food, at least we have saved a lot of money.

FIRST DAY - LAST DAY Reflections on 2012

So here we are at the threshold of this day of great expectations - either of annihilation or exhilaration - it seems your choice...

As I review all my different sources of information, and I must admit having a wide range from which to choose, I am left with the dream I had last night that in a simple yet sophisticated way summed up my lifetime search for meaning in an often seemingly meaningless world...

In the dream there was a man who I had known as a boy who had lived for a year in my town many years before. I was greatly surprised to see him, recalling all the memories from the time we had had together then and the beauty he had left behind him for all who had known his loving heart.

I began to frantically search for a scrap of paper on which to write his new contact information so we could make sure we stay better in touch in the future. My frustration grew as every piece of paper either had writing all over it, or every ball-point pen I could get my hands on didn't seem to work. After repeated failures I stopped and realized that I was using our precious four minutes up in anxiety worrying about a future without him.

Awakening back into this "real" world I got up and walked outside and stood under the wide-open star-studded sky, my eyes guided to Orion's belt and the star cluster known as the "Seven Sisters" with Jupiter blazing near the horns of the constellation Taurus. And the memories flooded down from this mystery held so sacred by many ancient peoples

before us...

First, there was that moment, the time I saw Barbie R., in front of the Hardware, her smile as we greeted each other for the last time on the day she died. Then my Father, and the argument we had had before I would never see him again. And all the faces of friends and lovers parading before me....and all the pieces of paper and business cards I collected now stored somewhere in boxes I'll never get to. And then the sweet faces of my granddaughters forever inviting me in to their timeless world of simple play, a world I had often too many excuses not to live. And the wondrous photo of Ben P. on FaceBook holding his new baby who had no knowledge of the Mayan calendar at birth. And the face of our President as he stood before families whose worlds had already ended the day they dropped their children off at school...

The truth is we will never know what day it will all end, but we can know what day it shall begin. As we face the end of another year and reflect on the faces and the forms that have come and gone we are left with this chance to not know....and not care if we know, because knowing isn't that important. In fact, maybe everything depends on our celebration of the fact we never will, and the way this truth informs the chance to dance between the past and the future in this gift we call the present. And just maybe we can have the courage to give ourselves this gift this time round, which is the most powerful way forward in this time of great change...

Hey Bolinas, do you know where our water comes from and how our high tech filter system works? Do you know how our organic non-chemical sewer ponds work? And who, exactly, watches over these services for us? Do you know how our water and sewer systems were pivotal in saving Bolinas from development? These are the last two weekends of the Bolinas Museum history room exhibit that tells this fascinating story!

Since 1905, generations of swimmers and surfers knew that Bolinas downtown's sewage dumped directly into the lagoon-until President Nixon signed the Federal Clean Water Act in 1972. Townspeople were resigned to a planned \$8.1 million big chemical sewage treatment plant, creating town debt and service for future expansive growth. But there was a contingent of new Bolinas residents (perceived as longhaired, dope-smoking hippies by many townspeople) who didn't see this solution as inevitable. Fesh from universities or expansive experiences, these young people had the activist spirit of the 1970s. When they presented extensive research to the community it led to a political revolution that redirected the trajectory of our community.

Today all of us benefit from the lineage of dedicated people, salaried and volunteer who serve the Bolinas Community Public Utility District. The BCPUD Board of Directors are publicly elected by our town and they work hard for us, mediating local property issues, watching over our systems, representing Bolinas public opinion when dealing with the county and state government, and spearheading many community projects. The Museum exhibit highlights the current Board of Directors but it would take many pages to list all the ways Jack Siedman, Vic Amoroso, Don Smith, Bobbi Kimball and Kim Bender have served this community over the years. General Manager Jennifer Blackman, Administrative Assistant Belle Wood skillfully oversee the complexity of BCPUD services and deal with county and state.

Then there is the crew who watch over our systems 24/7--Chief Operator Billy Pierce, Lewie Likover, Seth Kline, Scotty Hanks and part-time Dennis Dierks. These men address any problem that arises in the system at whatever hour and for as long as it takes to fix it. Remember last July when Wharf Road was a construction zone of equipment, men and big holes? They were replacing the saddles-- connections between the main water line and each building. Two of the badly rusted saddles blew in the process and the crew worked until 2 AM. Acknowledging their efforts, one afternoon Tom Diblee and Remick and Kathie Hart set up a grill and served hot juicy hamburgers and cold drinks to the appreciative crew.

The Museum's exhibit also explains the sewer ponds (serving downtown) pioneered by Dr. W.J. Oswald at UC Berkeley and now used internationally. They have worked in Bolinas for nearly 40 years using algae to purify waste water. Pretty amazing. The exhibit will close Dec. 30.
