

A pall settled over our whole town yesterday as word spread about our friend and co-worker, Barbara Rothwell, who was killed in a tragic automobile accident on Wednesday night. Barb's car ran off the road into a ravine and smashed into a eucalyptus tree near Horseshoe Hill Road. One minute she was here; the next she wasn't. It all happened very quickly. Barb was just 48 years old.

In the car with Barb was the love of her life, her seven year-old son, Jon Rene. I like to think Barb was watching as Jonny did the bravest thing he could have done. He somehow got himself out of that wreckage of a car and went for help.

A volunteer fireman who was on the scene said a Christmas candle was in the window of the house Jonny found, and it guided him as he picked his way toward it through a fog so thick it was like a rising damp. Who knows how long and how dark that night must have been for that little boy? Like his mother would have, he did the right thing and he did it courageously. She would be so proud of him.

Barb was one of the hardest working, most capable people one could ever know. She moved at warp speed, triple and quadruple-tasking. Even when Barb stood still, she was in motion: connecting people, making calls, running an errand, taking soup to a sick friend, volunteering to help. When Barb did something, she did it fully and without reservation. She was all in, all the time. Seemingly indestructible and never out of energy, Barb was as strong as a man twice her size. There wasn't anything she was afraid of tackling.

One characteristic of Barb's that stands out is her generosity. She was hard-wired to give, and she gave to anyone who needed anything. A worldclass scrounger, Barb knew every good corner in San Francisco where people put out things they found redundant. She'd discover the most amazing items: from a treadle sewing machine to a vintage movie camera or stainless steel kitchen countertops or wood flooring from a basketball court. She'd dutifully stop her pickup, load up the bounty and deliver it with her wide, blazing smile to whatever friend she'd decided couldn't live without it.

Barb will be missed terribly by her family, her sweet mother Mary Rothwell and her darling boy Jon Rene, and the many dear friends she made in her too-short life. Rest in peace, beautiful Barbie. Friday, December 14 2-4pm
