

### BOOK NEWS FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: JANUARY 16, 2013

**Double Book Launch** for memoirs by noted West Marin authors Lawrence DiStasi and Claudia Chapline **When**: February 17, 2-4 P.M.

Where: Claudia Chapline Gallery, 3445 Shoreline Highway, Stinson Beach

On Sunday, February 17, from 2 to 4 pm, a reception and reading to launch two new books will be held at the Claudia Chapline Gallery, 3445 Shoreline Highway in Stinson Beach. The two books are Bolinas author Lawrence DiStasi's *Esty*, and Stinson Beach poet/painter Claudia Chapline's memoir, *Falling Up the Stairs*.

DiStasi's new book, Esty: A Novel/Memoir, published under DiStasi's imprint, Sanniti Publications, concerns DiStasi's mother, Margaret Weisz DiStasi, who a few years before her death handed her writer son a manuscript. The manuscript contained her life story, revealing secrets from her early years—starting before her birth in Hungary with her own mother's romance—that DiStasi's family never knew. DiStasi then added a supporting structure around his mother's manuscript, adding commentary, evidence from other family members, further episodes from his mother's later life, and an imaginary dialogue with his mother. The result is Esty: A Novel/Memoir—an unforgettable story of one woman's attempt to create her identity anew, and her writer son's attempt to ferret out the truth behind his mother's fiction.

Chapline's memoir, *Falling Up The Stairs*, published under Chapline's imprint, Red Comma Editions, is a personal story of her creative life as a dancer, visual artist and writer from childhood and student days, marriage and motherhood, spanning the millennium from the East Coast to California.

The book includes family stories from the myopic eves of a depression baby, bobbysoxer, modern dancer, painter, poet, teacher, feminist and peace activist, from the time she was a No-War-Toys Mom to her more recent days as a Grandmother for Peace. It is a fascinating and inspiring story of a born artist and woman who wanted it all – education, marriage, motherhood, and a creative life despite personal, visual, and economic challenges.

Both authors will read from and discuss their works, which will be available for purchase.

Yemanja is an orisha, originally of the Yoruba religion, who has become prominent in many Afro-American religions. Africans from what is now called Yorubaland brought Yemaya/Yemoja and a host of other deities/energy forces in nature with them when they were brought to the shores of the Americas as captives. She is the ocean, the essence of motherhood, and a protector of children

Every February 2, thousands of people line up at dawn to leave their offerings at her shrine in Rio Vermelho. Gifts for Iemanjá usually include flowers and objects of female vanity (perfume, jewelry, combs, lipsticks, mirrors). These are gathered in large baskets and taken out to the sea by local fishermen. Afterwards a massive street party ensues.


#### ART PEOPLE HERE

The Farm Stand Gallery on the Bolinas Olema Road offers a rare chance to view Quilts & the Underground Railway from the Collection of Robin Bradford. Some quilts are actual survivors from the Civil War period, others are vintage, but constructed later. The exhibition is a small portion of the collection. Over 100,000 people escaped slavery with the help of Abolitionists between the American Revolution and the Civil War. During this time African American quilt patterns became a code that when hung outside a house would indicate supplies and tools available (Monkey Wrench), time to prepare for departure (Tumbling blocks), head north over the mountains (Bear's journey (Carpenter's Paw), a long Wheel), clean clothing available (Bow Tie), a safe house (Log Cabin), move on a staggered path (Drunkard's Path), protection (Crossroads), chains could be removed (Irish Chain), safe water passage (Sailboat or Compass), safe harbor close at hand (Star.) These quilts are an inspiring example of how housebound women participated in the abolitionist movement. More quilts may be seen by calling (415) 868-2900.



# On the subject of mushrooms...


There's a house in Bolinas with a great sense of humor. It's shaped like a mushroom. It's a fungi house, and its fun inhabitant is Susan Barkin. I stopped by to take a photo of it. Susan is a friend of a friend of mine. She happened to be home, so I rang the bell and to my delight she graciously offered to show me around.

In the entryway is an ordinary looking bookcase. But give it a push and abracadabra! you're in a secret bedroom. It is tucked under the spiral staircase that winds up a half-story to another bedroom, and then finally opens out, in the cap of the mushroom, to the living room, kitchen and dining area. A sliding door leads to a lovely deck overlooking the Pacific. San Francisco is directly to the south, and on a clear day you'd think you could just hop in a small boat and paddle yourself there.

A ladder from the living room climbs to a loft sleeping area. Anyone sleeping there will be awakened on a sunny morning by light streaming in the colored glass ceiling.

Susan loves living in the mushroom but she admits it has some drawbacks. The staircase is so narrow it's hard to get up them carrying groceries. And any large objects have to be hoisted up to the deck by an electric pulley.

The house was built in the late sixties by a Berkeley architect, Reis Clark, for Clayton Hughes. You can find this house on Overlook Drive, near the cliff. Peek at it from the road, please, and respect the owner's privacy.




