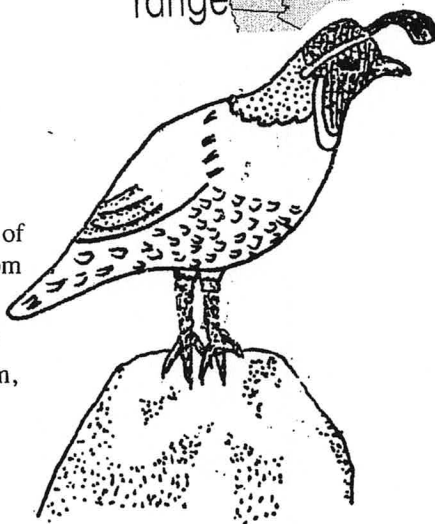

Please join the community in a Sacred Pipe Ceremony to send our collective love and support to the Water Protectors, and to all those involved in the struggle to defeat the Black Snake - including ourselves! Even as the drilling resumes, the resistance grows . . .

While Energy Transfer Partners received permission from the Army Corps of Engineers last Wednesday to lay pipe beneath the Missouri River (with no EIS, after all), and immediately began drilling, a further legal petition was filed to fight the construction, and renewed public support erupted throughout the country and the world.

The Cheyenne River Sioux have asked that the work be stopped while a lawsuit filed earlier by the tribe and the Standing Rock Sioux proceeds.

US District Judge James Boasborg has announced that he will hear the arguments on **Mon. (2/13)** during a previously scheduled status hearing.

On the ground, it seems that all the camps are being dismantled and cleaned up, *with the exception of the Sacred Stone Camp*, to which our own Jesse and Will belong, and who are putting out the call for self sufficient folks to return, or come join them, including the Veterans.

Apparently the tribal council had asked that all camps be cleared and that the rest of the battle be played out in the court rooms. But, not all Water Protectors agree. Those holding their ground believe we must remain strong on ALL fronts: peaceful, non-violent presence of bodies on the frontline, organization of demonstrations and actions worldwide, *as well as* utilizing all legal strategies possible through the court system.

And, Prayer. Always. ALL The People ask for our prayers.

If you participated in the Pipe Ceremony at the Community Center on December 4th, or in the several that have been held since at St. Aiden’s, since, you know of its beauty and power.

Mimi Calpestri, a Pipe Carrier for many years, will again be leading the ceremony. We are grateful, and blessed, to have her amongst us.

After the Ceremony, we will be collecting cash donations, specifically to be passed along to those in the camps who need financial help to remain. We’ll be sending these funds to Jesse, who will distribute as needed. May our gratitude for their willingness to stand for all of us, be felt and received through this offering of direct support.

Please join us Sunday night by the fire at the Community Center, where we will speak what’s in our hearts, send our energy to those at Standing Rock; and, at the same time, feel the love in, and for, our own community.

Together.

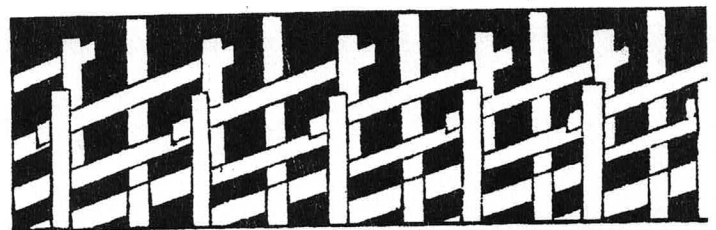
