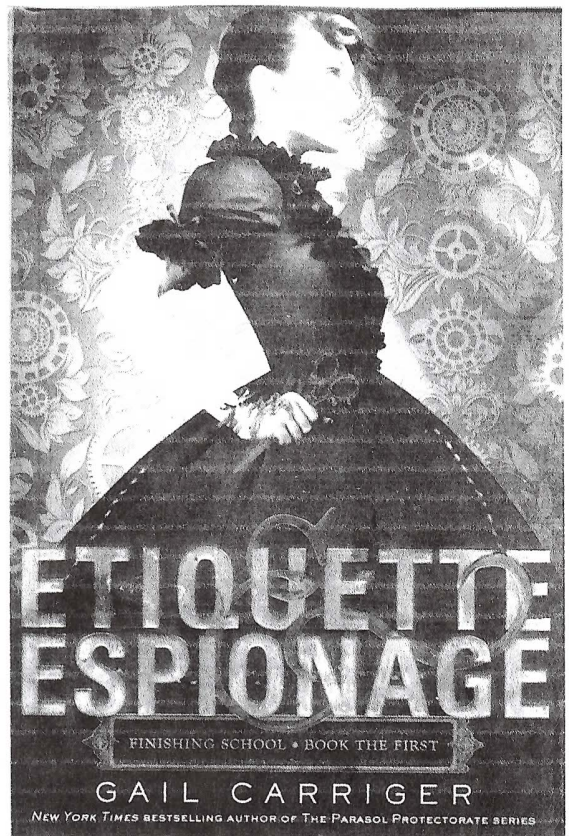

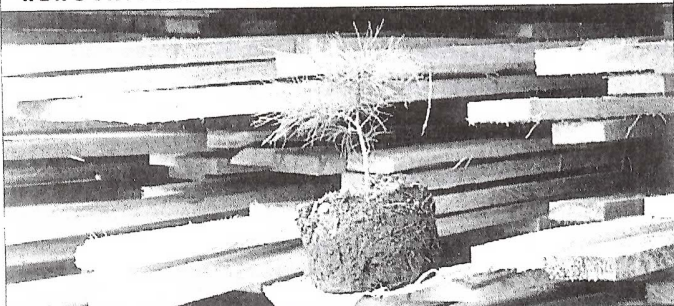

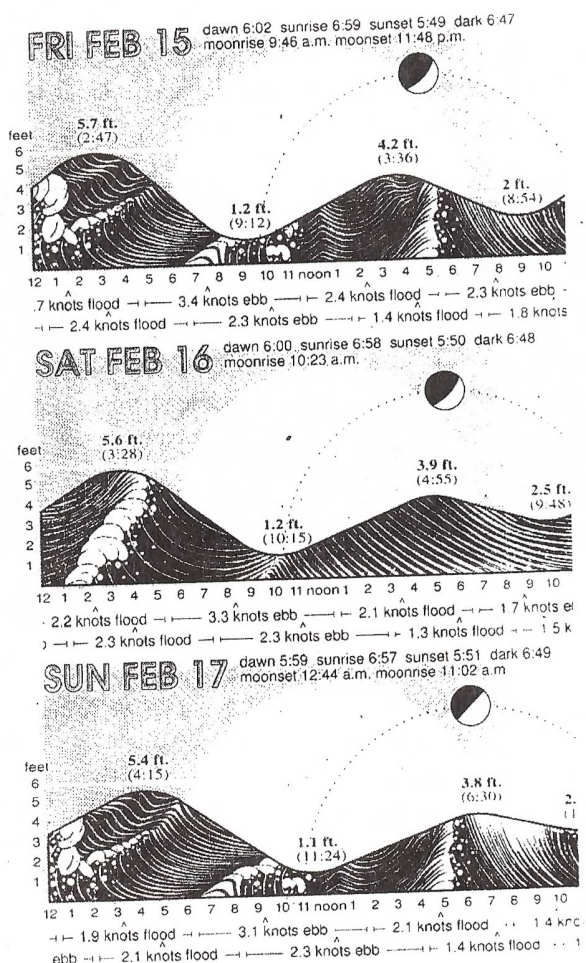

Happy Medical Marijuana Day, Bolinas. Did you know that even though California voted to legalize cannabis as medicine in 1996 and several other states have also enacted Compassionate Use laws that there are still only four people recognized by the federal government as legitimate medical marijuana patients? The federal government even went so far as to deny the advocacy organization Americans for Safe Access's petition to reschedule the therapeutically beneficial herb because, according to the DEA, there is not enough scientific research to support the theory that marijuana is medicine. Any why, you ask, does this research on a plant with centuries of documented medical application not exist? The National Institute on Drug Abuse holds a monopoly on the cannabis that can be researched in the United States and they will only provide cannabis for research that endeavors to investigate the harms that marijuana causes. Sound fair to you? No? Me either. That is why I am heading to Washington DC to join ASA in a Day of patient lobbying at the end of the month in addition to continuing my efforts to protect patients in Tennessee. I got a scholarship that covers the majority of my expenses for this trip but I'm still looking for donations to help defray hotel coast and personal expenses that are not covered. A Tribute to Paula Norton, (Persis's Mom) a neighbor & good friend of fifty years.

When Muir Beach was a handful of houses dotting a hillside of sage & lupine & the speed bumps of Sunset Way were the chuckholes of a dirt road & the armed forces had just removed the coils of barbed wire from the beach after World War II we became neighbors of Tom & Paula. Paula was an extra good neighbor especially to a ten-year old boy. She treated me for bee stings, scolded me on occasion asked me to help bring in her goats for milking & even rescued me from the ocean once.

It was one of those windy summer days when the wind comes down over the saddle & blows across Little Beach straight out to sea. I was rowing out to check a crabpot in my inflatable raft when I broke an oar. The raft was like a balloon in the wind & paddling with one oar was hopeless but I tried. Sitting back in the stern to paddle a gust caught the front & capsized the raft in an instant. As I came to the surface of the water, the raft was caught again by the wind & hurled into the distance.

There was nothing to do but swim for the beach. I was frightened & in a panic. I had never had to swim so far before. I called for help. The morning had been nice & the swimmers & sun-bathers who remained sat pressed against the rocks to shelter themselves from the wind. Paula was among them. There was a timeless long pause when nothing happened. I could see all the faces turned seaward – everyone motionless. My dog paddle faltered & I sank back treading water. I had never been afraid of the water but the beach was so far away.

Suddenly there was movement. I saw Paula running down the beach shedding some clothes – then her head bobbing in the water slowly drawing closer. When she was near enough, she called, "Don't let your feet sink! Kick harder! Keep your feet up!" She was close to me now & I looked into her eyes & saw that she was scared too. "Don't get too near me," she said. I didn't but I reached out with my hand & just touched her outstretched hand. I felt a sudden calmness. We swam the long distance to shore side by side, she having traveled it twice. Paula was quite pregnant at the time with her fourth child.

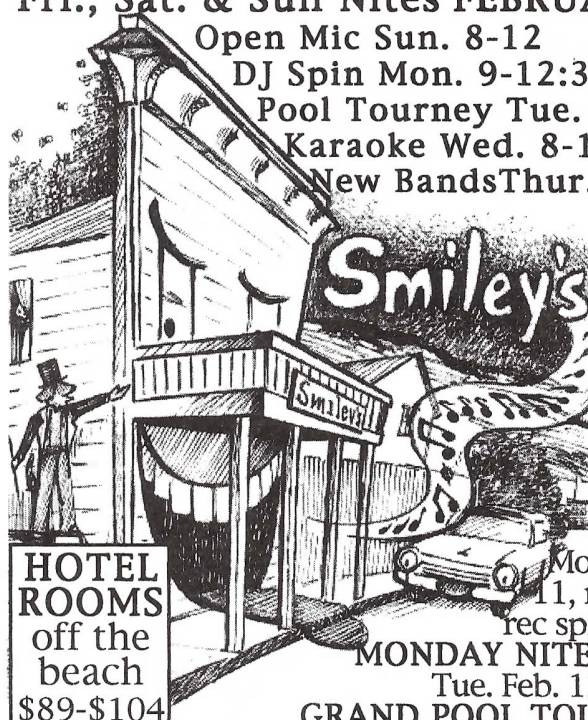

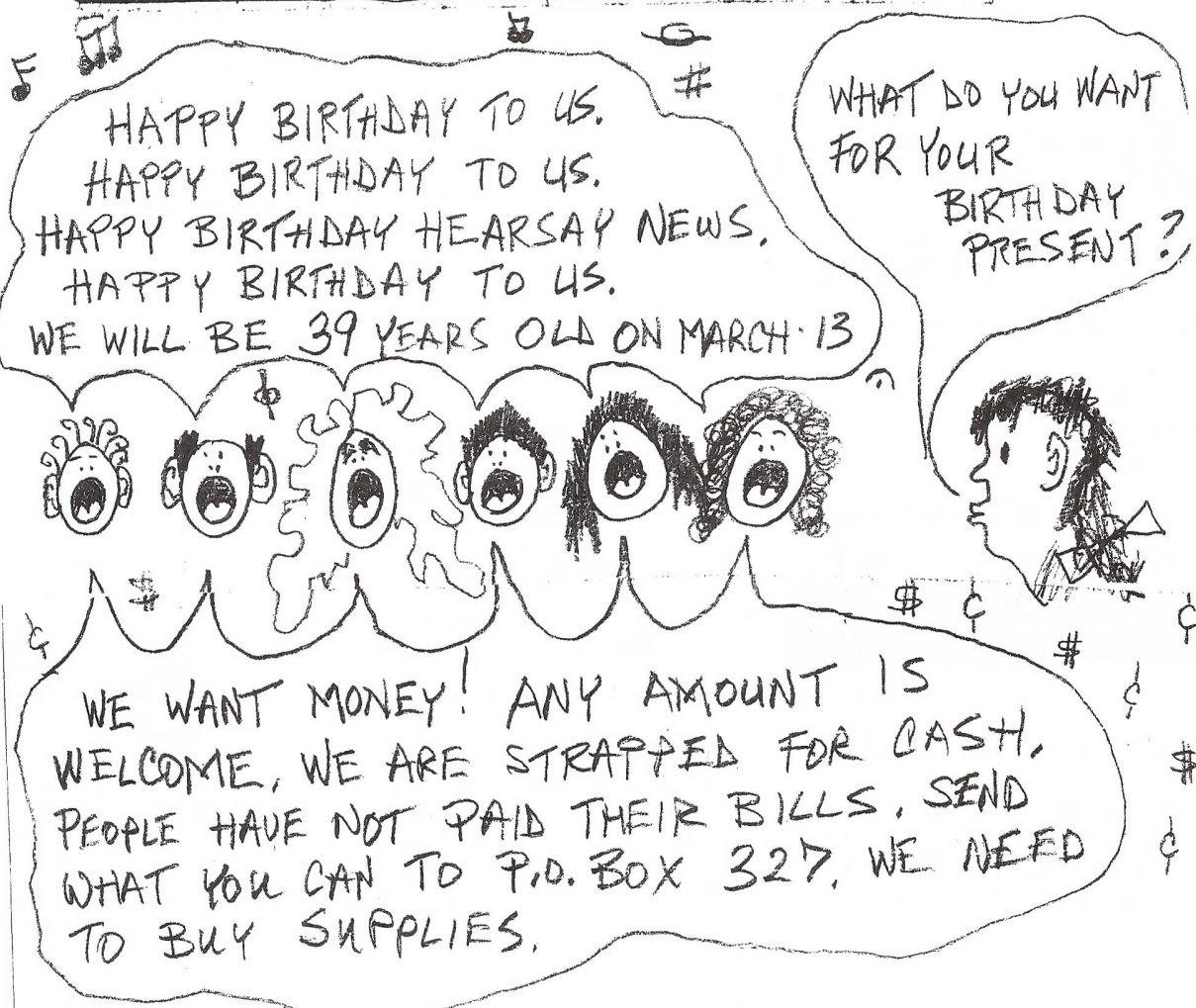

CALIFORNIA

"Out here, people don't like signs." So said Sheriff's Deputy Rob McDaniels to the *Point Reyes Light* in December, after apprehending "Sensitive Sean" for stealing more than 20 no-parking signs. This small community on the Northern California coast — let's just call it "Anonymous," since the locals have asked us not to reveal its name — boasts hobbit-esque wood homes snuggled in lush foliage within earshot of the Pacific's waves. Its residents tend to be aging hippies, who've been here since real estate was cheap, along with a handful of millionaires escaping the urban frenzy and a few youngsters trying to recapture the countercultural vibe that once made the town famous, though now it's likely to cost \$1 million or more to buy into it. The town has a proud reputation for vanishing signs: Whenever a highway placard is installed, it almost immediately disappears, stolen by reclusive locals. (Which is, incidentally, why *High Country News* decided not to print its name; we couldn't face having that many copies of our paper stolen.) It almost seems as if stealing signs has nudged its way into the town's DNA. It's not just highway or no parking signs: A few years back, someone absconded with 90 parking barricades. They've never been found.
