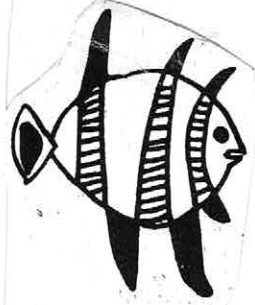

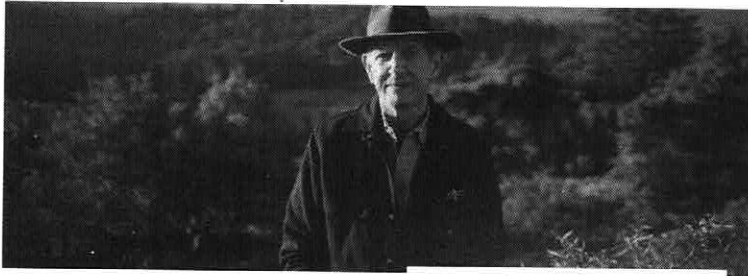

Inaccuracies in the media are nothing new, especially when they originate from corporate or military interests. But the current "fake news" era seems to have amplified the art of distortion, bluster, propaganda, and outright lying. The recent Ken Burns documentary series on the Vietnam War highlighted the pervasive use of falsehoods intended to fool the American public. For the good of all, what might be done to lessen this pervasive problem? Join Peter and TNS host Steve Heilig for a discussion of how we might clear the real fog of fake news.

Peter Coyote first became politically active in his college years in the 1960s in an anti-nuclear protest that brought him to Kennedy's White House during the Cuban Missile Crisis. From there he came west to become an integral part of the San Francisco Mime Troupe and then the Diggers, the famed anarchist soul of the Haight-Ashbury sixties scene, followed by a period in a commune in Olema. His first book Sleeping Where I Fall included a Pushcart Prize-winning chapter, and his new memoir, The Rainman's Third Cure, is a candid and searching reckoning with his childhood and subsequent life. He has recently been ordained as a Buddhist priest.

GAS STATION UPDATE

Many people have been talking and worrying about what is happening at the gas station. We apologize for not being able to keep you updated. We have been waiting for a string of professionals to help map a path forward for us and with the fires up in Sonoma in the fall, they have been extremely over booked.

For those who do not know, at the end of the summer we went ahead to do some renovations, upgrading parts that help restrict ground water intrusion and replacing parts that were badly corroded. While doing that work one of the badly corroded pipes cracked and water was allowed to get into the tank. This caused us to have to closed down and clean out that tank. Because the ground water was already high, covering the joint where this pipe attached we needed to find someone who could repair a tank that is submerged such as ours.

We have now located and contracted with a team of environmental specialists and engineers who will help us get the problem resolved, although we will have to wait until the dry season for the ground water to go down. At that time we will either have to raise the tanks out of the ground for the repair or we will be shutting the effected one down permanently by filling it in. The first option will cost roughly \$200,000, the second, closer to \$75,000. Both numbers are scary but we believe the gas station is a vital asset to our community and will do everything we can to save it. (It would coast 200,000 to close it down completely) We are in conversations with the county and are looking for both grant money as well as low interest loans that will make the repairs possible. The influx in tourist traffic has meant an increase in our gas sales and the gas station is well positioned to be able to apply for and pay back a loan in order to keep open. This will of course reduce the subsidy the gas station provides to our affordable housing downtown. However we have grown stronger in the past few years and with our growing ability to fund raise and with the new café BoVida opening, and our rent roles being complete, we do not anticipate any negative impact to our current or future affordable homes.
