



AT THE FARM STAND

Heads up! Roadside Cinema is coming to Bolinas this Spring. A new local project in the form of a seasonal screening series will be presenting films and videos in the art space at Gospel Flat Farm.

The series, curated by Melinda Stone and Jeff Warrin, will feature contemporary filmmakers who work beyond the boundaries of conventional cinema. When possible films will be presented in person by the makers.

The first show will be on Saturday, March 8th at 8 pm and will be


Let Your Light Shine: films by Jodie Mack, featuring Jodie Mack in person.

Filmmaker, songstress, and community builder, Jodie Mack, brings her post-psychedelic animations to Bolinas to illuminate the inaugural evening of Roadside Cinema.

Combining the formal techniques and structures of abstract/absolute animation with those of cinematic genres, her handmade films use collage to explore the relationship between graphic cinema and storytelling, the tension between form and meaning.

These stroboscopic eulogies celebrating the spectrum of abstraction from transcendent visual experiences to science kit optical fascinations – force a proscenium collision of the arena rock show, the planetarium light performance, and the cinema.


Curtis V. Willig, aged 72, died on February 18, 2014 in Bolinas. He was born November 17, 1941 in Brooklyn, New York, to Ida Wernick and Ben Willig. He is survived by his wife, Karen Greenblatt, and his daughter, Erica, both of Bolinas. Karen and Curt met at Lenox Hill Neighborhood Association, where they both worked for several years. They married on Valentine's Day, 1968. Curt is also survived by a sister, Nadine Willig Anai of Stratford, Connecticut.

Curt loved Karen and Erica; boating, especially hard-to-sail boats in Raccoon Straits; biking anywhere in Bolinas and Stinson Beach; hiking uphill, especially during chanterelle season; learning to surf; dog-walking, particularly Bennie and Sadie and Dolly-Monster; chocolate of any kind, cheesecake, coffee ice cream, pizza and hamburgers; movies, especially *The Thin Man*; sitting at the kitchen table near the fire with a book; playing gin or hearts; donning goggles and a leather Baron Von Bismarck helmet for rides in his old green 1937 truck—when it would start.

After graduation from New Rochelle High School in 1959, Curt attended New York University, followed by Columbia University School of Social Work, where he received his MSW. As a social worker with a keen business sense, Curtis was determined to find "good jobs and good pay" for people with disabilities such as deafness and physical, psychiatric or disabilities. He began his enterprise in San Francisco, in 1975, by negotiating a contract with Pacific Bell to repair broken tools. Hence the new agency that fixed broken tools and made them work again became known as Toolworks. More can be learned about Curt's continuing legacy at www.toolworks.org.

Curt went on to work as vocational director at Foothill and DeAnza Colleges, as well as consulting with Hearth Homes Community Builders. He was recognized for his work with Whirlwind Wheelchairs for designing durable





and highly functioning wheelchairs that performed well on rough terrain and used local materials, continuing his dedication to improving lives of people with physical disabilities in such far-off places such as Kenya, Vietnam and Laos.

Curt's last weeks were spent in the loving care of Rosie Barry and Julio Lucas and their wonderful staff at Sam's House in Bolinas. Burial will be on Tuesday, February 25, at 11 a.m., at the Bolinas Cemetery.



### Dog blamed for apartment fire

Fire officials said a dog reaching for treats turned on a stove and started a fire that caused smoke damage to an apartment in the central Washington city of Wenatchee.

Wenatchee Fire Marshal Mark Yaple said it appears the black Labrador was reaching for a bag of dog food left on a stove top when it turned on the stove with its paw. Yaple said the residents were not at home when fire crews arrived.

He said emergency crews were able to revive the dog with mouth-to-snout resuscitation. Damage was estimated at \$10,000.
