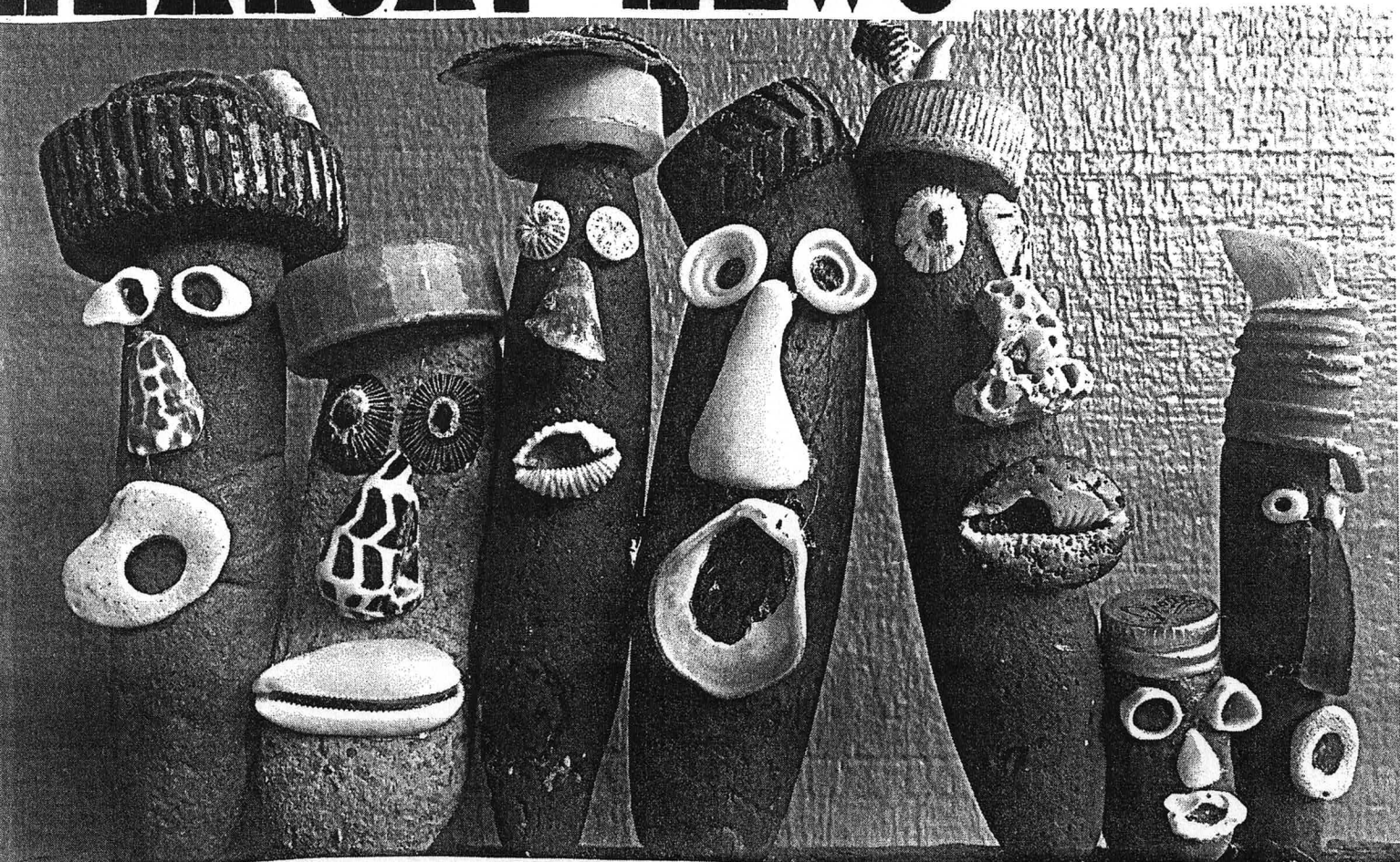

As we move into these challenging times, many of us are asking, "What can I do?" I want to share a book and a practice that many find helpful.

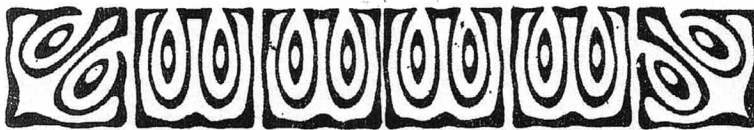

HELICOPTER AIR AMBULANCE MEMBERSHIP

As many of you are aware, emergency services in West Marin utilize helicopters for medical transport whenever an emergency situation warrants it. The typical cost of one of these transports can range from \$20,000 on up. The patient transported (or their health insurance if covered) is responsible for the costs incurred. In the past, residents needed to become members of both companies that operate in Marin County, CALSTAR and REACH. Late in 2016, the two companies merged allowing you to pay only one membership fee. Recently, I have received inquiries from residents who have received information in the mail from AirMedCare Network soliciting memberships and renewals for air ambulance service.

Not being familiar with the name, I contacted the company and was informed that when REACH and CALSTAR merged, they formed the AirMedCare Network. As stated in their website, a membership fee per household starts at \$65.00 and will cover transports by either CALSTAR or REACH. Their contact number is 800-793-0010, website www.airmedcarenetwork.com. If you currently carry a membership with either CALSTAR or REACH, or both, you will be renewing your membership with AirMedCare Network. Please, call the 800 number for any questions or concerns.

The Bolinas Fire Protection District wishes to inform residents of the membership services offered by the air transport companies, which could cover part or all of transport costs. We are not advocating for the companies, but wish to simply raise awareness of the opportunity so you can make an informed decision. If you currently carry health insurance, check with your provider to see if air ambulance transport is already part of your coverage.

GROUNDHOG DAY ACCORDING TO THE EXPERTS

STATEN ISLAND CHUCK. -- Happy Groundhog Day! At approximately 7:30 this morning, Staten Island's furry prognosticator emerged from his home at the Staten Island Zoo to let everybody know we'll have an early spring. Tradition says that if the groundhog doesn't see its shadow, spring is right around the corner. And Staten Island Chuck knows what he's talking about -- his record, according to the Zoo, is 80 percent.

But what about Chuck's rivals? Did they call for an early spring or six additional weeks of winter weather? **PUNXSUTAWNEY PHIL**, Chuck's most notorious rival, usually disagrees with him -- and this year is no different. When Phil came out of his home in Punxsutawney, Pa., he saw his shadow -- predicting six more weeks of winter.

BALZAC BILLY Another groundhog, Balzac Billy, hails from Balzac, Alberta, in Canada. He awoke from his long hibernation at the Blue Grass Nursery and Garden Centre Thursday morning and saw his shadow -- predicting six more weeks of winter.

SHUBENCADIE SAM, a groundhog from Nova Scotia's Shubenacadie Wildlife Park, came out of his burrow and gave the prediction of an early spring.

BUCKEYE CHUCK Buckeye Chuck of Ohio came out of his burrow and saw his shadow, meaning six more weeks of winter.

BIG AL While most states look to groundhogs for their seasonal weather forecast, everything is bigger in Texas -- including Big Al. The 14-foot, 1,000-pound alligator makes perhaps the most scientifically-sound weather prediction of any animal every year using his favorite food -- Kentucky Fried Chicken. According to gator-rescuer and naturalist Gary Saurage, alligators are genetically unable to eat until all danger of winter's freeze has passed; their bodies cannot digest food until warm weather is assured. The science is simple. If Big Al eats his KFC, spring is on the way. This year Al passed on the chicken, predicting six more weeks of winter.

GENERAL BEAUREGARD LEE When it comes to furry weather forecasters, few are more decorated than General Beauregard Lee of the Yellow River Game Ranch just outside Atlanta. Beau predicted an early spring.

ESSEX ED Last year when Essex Ed -- the groundhog at the Turtle Back Zoo in West Orange, N.J. -- overslept on Groundhog Day it was up to Otis the Hedgehog to fill in. According to county officials, an unusually warm December threw off Ed's hibernation schedule, causing him to oversleep. This year, Essex Ed woke up in time to predict six more weeks of winter.

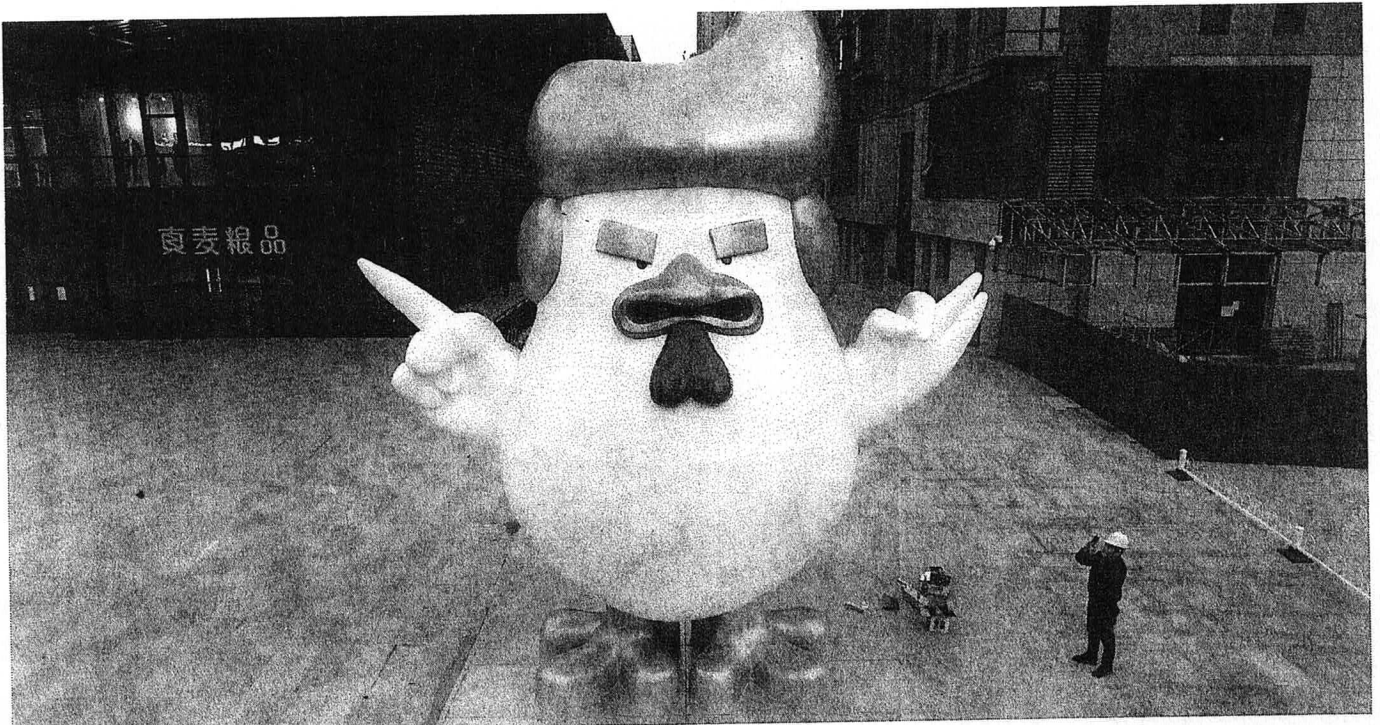
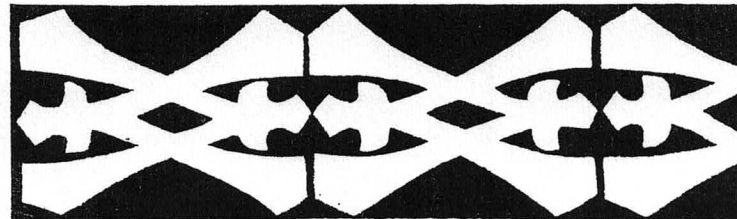

State of Bolinas Lagoon Conference Set For Feb. 9
The public meeting starts at 7 p.m. at the Stinson Beach Community Center. It will focus on design concepts for the Bolinas Lagoon Project.


MARIN COUNTY, CA – Stewardship of Bolinas Lagoon, a wildlife-rich tidal estuary designated as a wetland area of international importance for nearly 20 years, will be discussed at a public meeting Feb. 9 in Stinson Beach. The annual State of Bolinas Lagoon Conference starts at 7 p.m. at the Stinson Beach Community Center, 32 Belvedere Avenue.

Several studies have been published over the past 10 years to address the restoration of this 1,100-acre jewel of West Marin nature. The estuary, managed by the Marin County Open Space District, is separated from the Pacific Ocean by a narrow and low-lying spit of land on which dozens of Stinson Beach homes are located. About three miles of State Highway 1 (Shoreline Highway) serves as the eastern border of the lagoon, and Olema-Bolinas Road is along the western lagoon waterfront.

This year's conference will focus on draft conceptual design alternatives for the North End Wetland Enhancement and Sea Level Rise Adaptation Project, commonly called the North End Project. In 2013 a scientific review group recommended rehabilitating important wildlife habitats to address years of habitat alteration.

A key facet of the project is adaptation to sea level rise and chronic flooding while improving functions of tributary creeks and allowing for gradual expansion of the lagoon's perimeter. Roadway flooding is another component to be addressed while respecting the habitation improvement goal for shoreline birds, waterfowl, and fish, including special-status species such as steelhead and red-legged frog.
