
Oh, the weather outside's delightful, 'Cause the drought's been truly frightful. And since there's so much to gain Let it rain, let it rain!


Well, I've bought some seeds for planting, And we've got that rain dance chanting, May it rain for a month or more, Let it pour, let it pour!!!!!



TIME TO MOVE .

"We have a home. We just need a house to put it in. "Spoken by a 6 year old boy in reply to an adult's comment to him about being "homeless".

I have lived in Bolinas for 33 years and moved at least 14 times. Once when the place where i had lived for about four years was sold, the owner recommended me as a tenant to the new owners and so i lived there another 3 years until the place was sold again. Recently i have been lucky to stay in one place for 7 years.

Over all these moves i have been blessed with congenial relationships with the homeowners. Friends who have known me through the years told me they recall that i have always made the places where i have lived more beautiful.

After many years of living alone or at times with one roommate, two years ago i took on the care of my grandson, Kaydon, now age 14. This has been challenging and quite delightful. Kaydon is hoping to be able to stay here and go to Tam high with his classmates. This stability would mean a lot to him.

Through years of sharing many special times with this community i have put down some deep roots. My first job here was at the Bolinas Childrens' Center, BPUD, and now some of those nursery school kids are parents with children in grade school.

We have been given until April 1st to find a place. The owners are planning to prepare the place to be sold.

We have a movable 8x10 wooden room we've been using for storage and could become a room for kaydon. This would allow us to make do with small place. A garden is essential and i would love to be sharing a vegetable garden.

I would be glad to have a place on a property with one or two elders who need some assistance and companionshipperhaps a second unit close to their home. Or perhaps we might find a second unit where we could pay a small rent and care take a property for absent owners. Basically we need a kitchen, bathroom and space for me to have an office/bedroom and a space to have the 8x10.

We have been offered a three month sublet starting mid April. I am waiting to hear if our current landlord will let us stay those extra two weeks. If not we will be looking for a place to stay from April 1st-14th.

during our 3 month sublet during which time it will only be used for storage.

This is urgent! I need to move this asap and will pay a monthly fee for the space.

Meanwhile i am setting up an out of town longer term storage and letting go of things so we can travel light, perhaps house sit or sublet, until something longer term shows up.

We need a miracle and, as my mother always said, "Miracles are divinely natural." We do have a home and just need a house to put it in.







What a relief to get a bit of rain! Believe it or not though, we are still in a drought. So, even as we celebrate the wet earth, here are some handy water conservation tips, to help carry us through:

DID YOU KNOW THAT...

A lot more water comes out of a faucet that we realize?

A tiny drip of water can add up to 15 gallons per day.

A small stream 1/32 of an inch adds up to 25 gallons per day.

A stream 1/16 of an inch loses 100 gallons per day.

A stream 1/8 of an inch loses 400 gallons per day.

A stream ¼ of an inch loses 1,600 gallons per day.


A stream ½ of an inch loses 6,400 gallons per day.

WATER IS A PRECIOUS RESOURCE.

We should all take steps to not be wasteful and use our water supply wisely. The following chart indicates how wasteful some water use practices can be.

	Normal Use	Conservative use
Shower	Water running 25 gallons	Wet down; soap up, rinse off 4 gallons
Brushing Teeth	Tap running 10 gallons	Wet brush, rinse briefly ½ gallon
Tub Bath	Full Tub 36 gallons	Minimum water level 10 to 12 gallons
Shaving	Tap running 20 gallons	Fill basin 1 gallon
Dishwashing	Tap running 30 gallons	Wash & rinse in dish pan or sink in 5 gallons
Automatic Dishwasher	Full cycle 16 gallon	Short cycle 7 gallons
Washing Hands	Tap running 2 gallons	Fill basin 1 gallon
Toilet Flushing	Depending on Tank size 5-7 gallons	Use tank displacement bottom 4-6 gallons
Washing Machine	Full cycle, Top water level 60 gallons	Short cycle Min. water level 27 gallons
Outdoor Watering	Average hose 10 gallons Per minute	Lowest priority Reduce to minimum or eliminate altogether

We can all work together to help conserve water and as an added bonus, we can also reduce the cost of our water and sewer bills!




