



Call to Order: 7:03 pm

Community Expression: Miguel Bustamente expressed concerns about parking on the easement road between his property and the Downtown Park. Roger Peacock spoke about future plans for a moveable gate once construction is completed.

Downtown Park: [Patricia] Dylan has agreed as part of his position as treasurer to work to come up with an operational plan and budget. [Roger] We're trying to complete the project with the funds at hand and keep as much set aside for the future as possible. Currently working to complete the items we've got permits for and get them signed off. We want to do more planting on the hillside. [Vic] At one time we were going to put some collection tanks to trap water off the hill for summer irrigation. [Roger] One of the tanks is still there. We still need to add some pumps to get the water into it. It hasn't been plumbed yet. I'd like to get a budget together for the remaining projects. [Angela] Our biggest on-going expense is maintaining the bathrooms. [Dylan] We need to set up a meeting to discuss developing the budget. [Patricia] We absolutely have to have a plan to take to the county to apply for Measure A funds if possible, or county support. There are a few other items that came up: we need to get some way to control unapproved usage of the electric outlets. Can that be done easily and right away? We want to request that that be done. [Jane] I would like to see some kind of committee set up to oversee the park. [Patricia] That will have to wait until after the basic plan is designed. Let's schedule a meeting for February to do this. [Roger] I spoke with a sheriff recently and we need to meet with the sergeant up in Pt. Reyes. I'd like the sheriff to go into the park on the access road and check things out at night. [Patricia] I can go talk with them, and give them a copy of the park regulations.

Maintenance Report: Suki absent.

Pool Development: [Anna] Our surveys have come in very positive. People will pay usage fees. We have 87% commitment towards fees, so we've gone ahead and found a project manager for a feasibility study. We've had people come forward and offer financial help. We're currently working on getting lead donors. [Vic] The land belongs to BPUD, so they'd have to approve it first. You operate under the joint powers agreement. [Patricia] There are legal issues that need to be addressed right now. You also need to design a time-line for the project. [Vic] These are issues that should be settled before you begin your capital campaign for the project.

[Patricia] You need to get on the BPUD agenda and present the project.

Irrigation Report: [Bryan] I met with Oliver Co. and have their material on the lift station. Their bid had listed the Mesa Park lift station lumped into their award, but the award documents don't have an explicit listing; it's included in a larger project allocation. At this point we can go forward with the grant process. The project should only take two months or so to complete.

Treasurer's Report: Not much has happened with the Mesa Park maintenance due to winter weather, so there haven't been major expenses. [Patricia] We talked about relocating the skate park account. It's been inactive for a while. Suki's looking for an operational plan for the fields and to know what MP has the funding for. [Bryan] Safety issues are the most important concerns. [Dylan] We've got about a year's worth of funding left for Mesa Park.

Approve Warrants: Jane moved to approve; Bryan 2nd. All aye.

Up-date on election status: Jane passed out suggestion sheet on how we can pass the parcel tax next election.

Other: Jane was asked to add her consent of board position appointees decided at the December board meeting, and added her consented.

Approve Minutes: Jane moved to approve; Dylan 2nd. All aye.

Schedule next meeting: Feb. 4th

Adjourned: 8:57 pm





We have from now until Feburary 24th to tell the FDA not to approve Genetically Modified Salmon for human consumption,

On February 25th, 2013, the FDA is posed to approve genetically engineered salmon for human consumption. This would be the first time in history that a genetically engineered animal would be approved for human consumption, setting the precedent for many more animal patents to follow. Already there are 25 other species of fish and a GMO pig awaiting approval.

The approval of GMO salmon carries with it the threat of major consequences for human health, the health of the wild salmon populations and the ecosystems that depend on them, and the economy of the wild salmon fishing industry. In addition, it is a fundamental animal cruelty ethical concern.

The good news is we still have until February 25th to contact the government and speak out against this! From now until Feb. 25th the FDA has issued a public comment period on this topic, so now is the time to call in and voice your opinion against GMO salmon.
