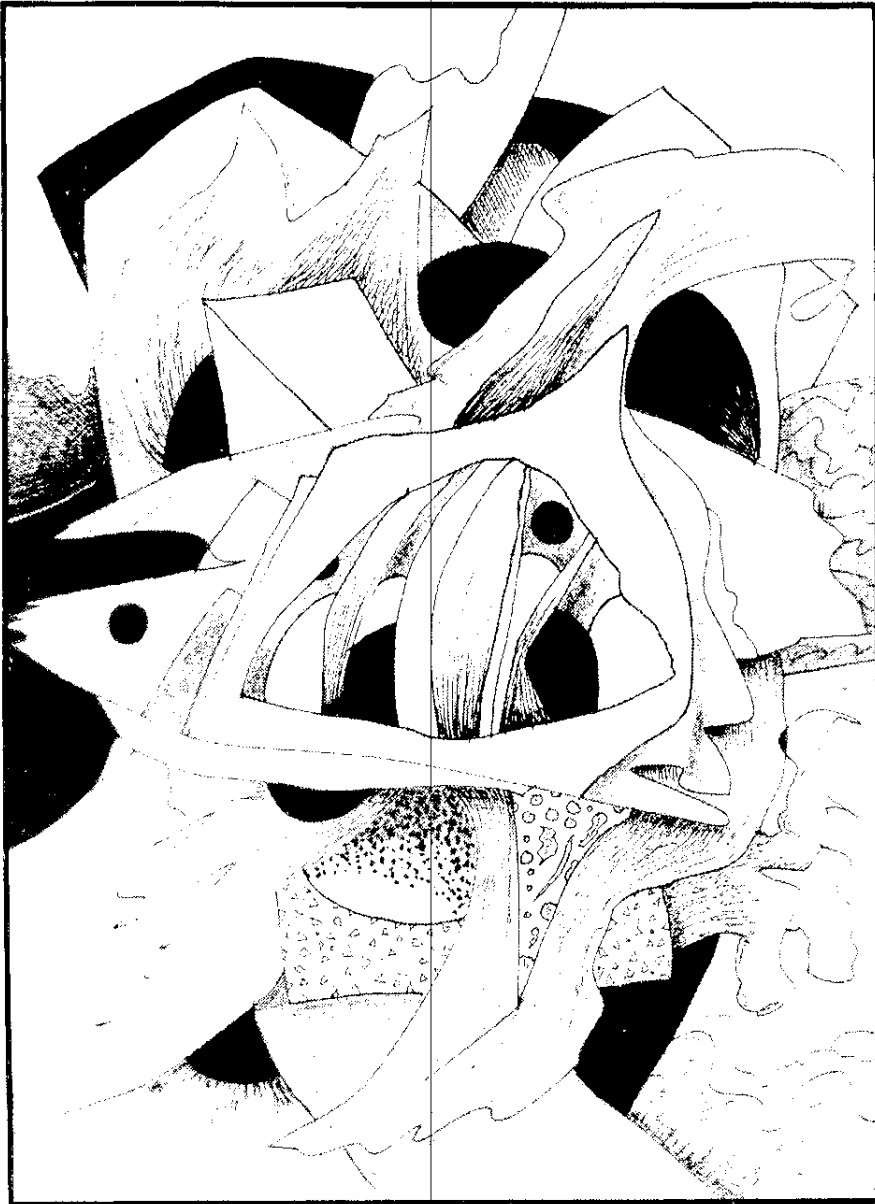

Last night, I was lucky enough to attend an intimate poetry reading by Philadelphia-based Sufi poet Daniel Abdal Hayy Moore. Kathy Maxwell graciously hosted the event in her cozy living room & about 25 West Marin folks, ranging in age from 75 to 6 months old were in attendance. We perched there way up on the Inverness ridge, slouched in soft armchairs as the sun dipped below the trees & Black Mountain glowed gold.

Abdal-Hayy had a wonderful way of seamlessly shifting from casual talk in the living room, to transcendent pondering of our place in the Universe. He read several poems from his new book, "Down at the Deep End," much of which was written last year while going through chemotherapy & radiation.

Rather than being a somber reflection on these trials & tribulations, Abdal-Hayy imbues his poems with lyrical buoyancy, exploring mortality & God with an every present twinkle in his eye.

Mola Rola

Sandy Dierks asked me to write a review of the current show of textiles in the main gallery at the Museum. I emailed her back and asked her to answer a few questions so I could write something coherent and meaningful. Here is her reply. The show is beautifully presented and the work is extraordinary. Don't miss it!

Great, I'll get started. First the Kuna, before spelled with a C, and now with a G like change, only I don't think they expected it to happen so fast with the cell phone and internet. Same with the Maya, where there is a cell tower in almost every small village throughout Guatemala. This is what the show at the museum is trying to show and why it is called Cross Pollination.

My work within the exhibit in my weaving shows what I learned from Martina, my weaving teacher and friend. Dennis and I were just in Panama in January visiting the Kuna and the Earthtrain eco-reserve of Nathan Gray, dedicated to helping preserve the Kuna lands from exploitation from within and without. My quilt in the show is to raise money for his work with the Kuna.

I have been visiting Kuna Yala since 1992 when I first went down there with a group of quilters to study mola making techniques of the Kuna women. We learned that mola is a general term, like clouds in the sky, feathers on a bird and the blouse the women wear that has worked panels on the front and back. It is a symbol of the Kuna people and recognized all over the world as such. The Mola, like the Huipil the Mayan women wear, is a store house of cultural significance and ethnic identity.

Martina is coming for the Buckeye gathering, which is a week long workshop teaching native skills in Sebastopol the end of April. She taught many Bolinas women to weave over the years. She helped evolve the new weaving styles of her village, Santa Caterina Polopo, thus allowing the textiles to have greater value for the women. There are weaving coops developing where the women are going back to hand spinning and natural dying the thread, as I have done in my huipil in the show.

Before my husband Dennis was a farmer, he illustrated books and is picking up his brushes once again as seen in the paintings on native women in this show.

I will be speaking with Jane Mickelson about the show on KWMR at 10:30 on March 26th. I'll also be talking with Jane and Camila Martinez (who just got back from Guatemala) at the Bolinas Museum on Sunday April 7 at 2pm. Before and after the talk on the 7th I will have textiles for sale at the Book Exchange next to the Post Office from 11am to 1:30pm and 4 to 5:30pm.

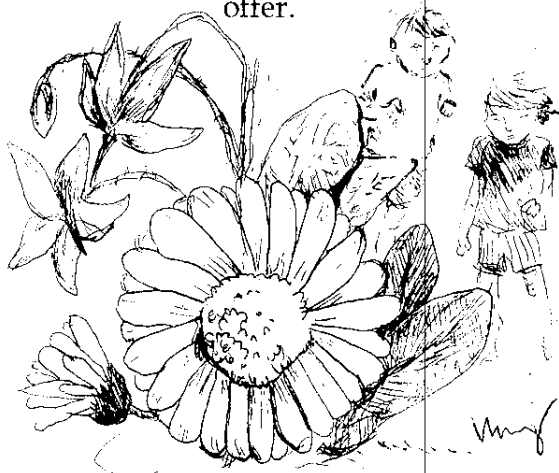


Borage & Calendula, as seen easily popping up in your garden (& continuing to do so the rest of the summer), will bring a colorful quality to your garden salad & can be announced as 'rainbow salad' for the kids.

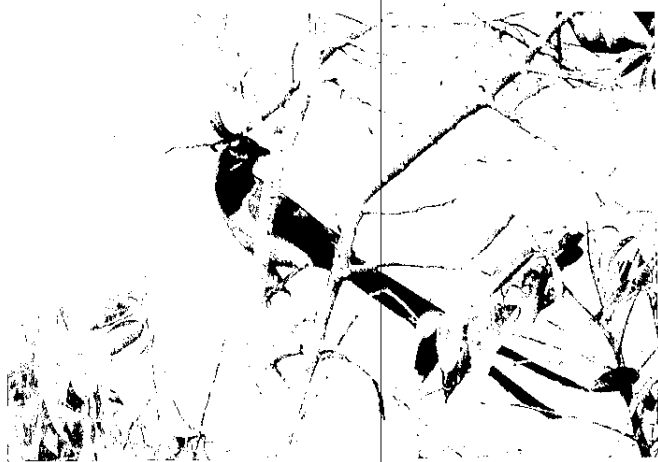
As you know- everyone I show this to loves it!!!
