

Maggi Butterfield-Brown

October 23, 1934 - February 8, 2016

Maggi Butterfield-Brown passed away at the home of her friends, Susanne Jensen and Michael Hummel, of San Francisco, California, at 9:30 am, Monday, February 8, 2016.

Margie Ann, known to her friends as Maggi, was born Oct 23, 1934, in Beach, North Dakota, to Ward Joseph



Butterfield and May Belle Brown-Butterfield. Her mother died shortly after her birth, and she was adopted by her maternal grandparents, Herman Walter Brown and Emmaline Melinda Stecker Brown.

Maggi moved as a young adult to the San Francisco Bay Area. She was a self-taught accountant, became an Enrolled Agent and managed her own accounting firm, M. Butterfield-Brown Associates, in San Francisco for many years until she retired to Bolinas, CA, and, later, to Mariposa, CA. She married her soul mate, Jerry Johnson Baldwin, on January 2, 1991, in Buckingham, VA.

After her husband died in 2000, Maggi moved to Oakhurst where she earned a Doctorate in Divinity from Emerson Theological Institute and became an ordained minister and leader in the Positive Living Center of Central California. She went on to teach lively and well attended classes at the Institute. She brought many creative teachers to Oakhurst to enrich the lives of her community with cutting edge ideas on health, meditation and art. Over the past 25 years, she traveled around the world, including to Switzerland, India and Mexico. Her spiritual talks at PLC, often integrating humor and theater, were entertaining and much anticipated.

Maggi was a renowned clothing artist and brought joy into people's lives with her vivid, colorful clothing ensembles. Her home was a beautifully decorated temple. She was adept at sewing and jewelry making. She was an enthusiastic dancer and studied with Gabrielle Roth who taught her to move every part of her body to express the sheer joy of her spirit. She enjoyed living near Yosemite National Park, and hiked the high country there.

Maggi was known for her positive attitude, her easy laughter and abundant charm. Generous and open armed; she was always available to her community with a caring hug and healing prayers. She will be greatly missed by her family, friends and community, both locally and around the globe.

She is survived by her cousins Jeanette McDanold Mefferd (Charles) of Puyallup, WA; Marlyn Stecker Wicka of Beach, ND and Henderson, NV; and numerous nieces, nephews and cousins, who were all touched by her spirit.

The Positive Living Center held a memorial celebration of her life with music by her favorite band, Good Medicine, on Sunday, March 13. Her ashes were scattered by close friends in a ceremony at Tennessee Valley Beach in Marin County on Saturday, February 27th.






I hope you'll join us in these community discussions. Our thoughts and input are very valuable and will affect her choice of issues to address as county supervisor of the 4th district.








3rd-5th Grade Chorus and Whitecaps:




