Story Polls on Overlook

A lot of Bo folks have indicated concern about those very obnoxious story polls at 370 Overlook. Yes, that is my property but it was stolen from me a while back... not only the property but everything on it. They wanted to make sure I had no money for a lawyer. I went to court many times, found favor with the judges, so they had to make sure they stopped me by evicting me with no 5 day notice, required by law. I was about to go back in to have a ruling reconsidered due to new evidence when a couple pretended to buy my much loved property (no legal right or paperwork to do so). Recently they went in front of BCPUD and in order to get an "expanded water use permit" misrepresented what was already there. They stated there is only 2 bedrooms (no, there were 3 from the day I bought it in 1973 and some of our community have lived in it.) Rick Fields wrote his famous book on Zen Buddhism there when Peter Warshall lived there. When asked if there was a 2nd unit there, they said no ... hardly true, there has been a legal 2nd unit since 1977. Too bad Paul is no longer there, he would have certainly stopped the charade. By my estimation they are intending to have an equivalent of 9 or so bedrooms. Go check it out. It will ruin the privacy of many loved neighbors, and the view of the mountain - also as you drive by. I moved to a rural town, zoned Agricultural/ Residential, as did you. The intention is to flip the property- not to love it. They have not even replaced the fence in back - required by state law since there is a Sewer Spray Area in the back, not "Open Space" as pretended in the ads prematurely advertising it. This is the property I made for survival in my old age. Not one law was complied with - I followed everything the phony hedge fund "bank" told me to do. I went to court many times alone. I need a lawyer to stop this and time to do so. New Calif. Supreme Court Ruling recorded Feb. 18 states 1 am the only one with "standing" (legal right) to go back in and get my deed back. I could not read their tiny public notice attached to stick on the ground. Please stop by and check it out if you can, write a letter to the county, and plan on coming to the Hearing.

Those of you who are concerned about Air Bud and other operations taking away Low-income housing, (my place always was that) and bringing in more out of town cars, then put your pen to work or call Marin Co. Planning. More information later. Thanks for all you can do.


















Come get free seeds from THE S.P.R.OUT SEED LIBRARY

PRO VAXX FAXX CREATE SKEPTICS: FLU FRENZY

When public health officials toll the bells for flu shots, their call to prayer is a warning klaxon. There's no evidence for benefits, only for harm. Lancet, the National Institute of Health, the New England Journal of Medicine, even the NY Times have reported numerous studies proving that influenza vaccines have no effect on preventing illness or reducing complications from influenza.

Flu vaccines are the leading cause for plaintiffs "winning" damages from the Vaccine Injury Compensation Fund. Sixty percent were for victims suffering Guillain-Barre syndrome from an autoimmune reaction to the vaccine. This causes paralysis, but hey, it's not polio. Narcolepsy is another major flu vaccine "adverse event." Good news for insomniacs.

The Cochrane Collaborative, an international medical review group, found only one case of influenza was prevented for every hundred people injected, but admitted this was skewed by industry funded research. Flu vaccines did not reduce sick days from work, hospitalizations or deaths.

The British Medical Journal reported "the optimistic and confident claims for effectiveness were so at odds with the evidence" that flu vaccine proponents were truly faith based. The frantic flogging of flu shots by public health officials is like a Shiite spectacle of religious frenzy, fueled by profits, not superstition. Their annual ritual of calling the faithful for flu shots cast doubt on medical mullahs fatwas allowing no exemptions to mandatory childhood vaccines.

The CDC, obstetrician and pediatrician prophets urge pregnant mothers to get flu shots. A 2004 Kaiser Permanente study of 50,000 mothers found no statistical difference in vaccinated and unvaccinated women getting sick, labor outcomes or hospitalization for respiratory illness. Vaccination during pregnancy doubled the rates of gestational diabetes and hypertension.


Flu shot contain mercury levels 200 times greater than the EPA's maximum allowable exposure per body weight for fetuses. Mercury levels are three times higher for most adults, fifteen times for younger kids. This rapidly breaks down into ethyl mercury.



Even the manufacturer warns that exposure in utero can cause "mental retardation and motor coordination impairment." The CDC suppressed evidence until 2014, when they were forced to release internal documents showing the mercury based preservative, thimerosal caused 800% higher rates of autism, sleep and speech disorders in unborn children subjected to vaccines with it.

The CDC claims 20% of influenza like illnesses (ILI) are actually caused by influenza viruses. A. 2006 analysis of CDC data from the previous five years found an average of 12.5% of submitted lab samples tested positive for flu virus. The dominant flu strains infecting Americans those seasons had a 54% average antigen match with flu viruses selected the previous spring. Research doctors concluded "the average vaccine effectiveness is only a dismal 7.2%." Steve Heilig claimed my estimate of 6-9% effectiveness based on Canadian calculations would get a failing grade in his epidemiology class. The curve he graded on would be a called ball.






