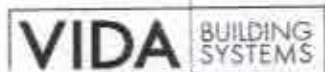

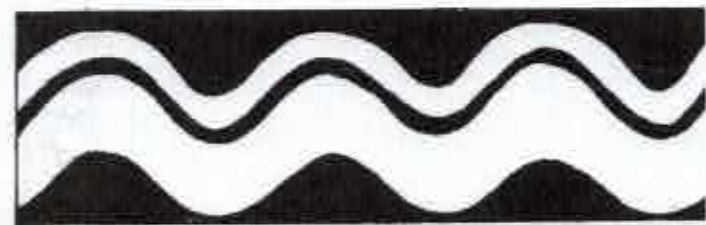

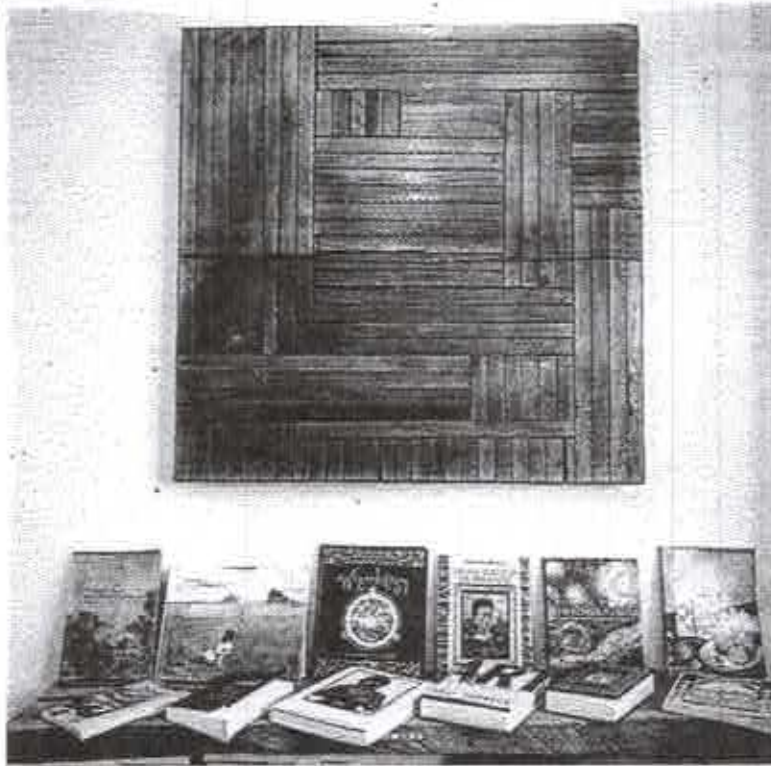

A BOLINAS WOMAN NEEDS HELP

Many of you will remember seeing Maria Luisa or Dona Mary from Escuinapa, Mexico walking along Olema-Bolinas Road on her way to clean house, serve dinners and or sew clothes for many us here in Bolinas. Maria Luisa lived and worked in Bolinas for 12 years during which time she supported family in Mexico including a married daughter and her children. Maria's married daughter died suddenly last month from complications from diabetes, making it necessary for Maria to return home precipitously without the nest egg she had hoped to put together. Her dream was to start a little business or put together a sewing business to make made-to-order dresses for events such as First Communion or Quinceanera.

Her goal was to save \$2000.00. She left without any extra money in her pocket.

She now finds herself back in Mexico, taking care of the two younger sons of her deceased daughter, her "special" daughter in her 40ties, her retired and estranged husband making up a household of five people.

She is in deep grief and is feeling helpless about her situation. Working for someone else, her salary would be 100 pesos a day or about \$8.00 US. She is 67 years old. Not good. With her own business, working would bring in enough to maintain the household.

Talking with her and understanding her desperate situation, I have taken it upon myself to ask our community to give whatever amount of money you can so that we can help her reestablish a life with some hope for herself. No amount of money you can give is too small nor too big. And anything would help. I will be collecting checks or cash for the rest of the month of March.

Please send cash or check to me, Maria Garrigues at P.O. 1109, Bolinas and I will keep you posted as to how the collection is going. This is a call to everyone in our community, and especially to those touched personally by Maria Luisa, to help to a worthy former member of our town. Thank you for your generosity.

Unknown to You and I

The Gibson House/Bo-Gas housing projects were successfully completed by a Bolinas Community Land Trust team that worked with complete transparency and received full community support.

Years later the BCLT, with a somewhat changed Board, seeks to establish affordable housing on the Mesa. As project sites are being chosen and development strategies put in place, that transparency throughout the process, seems to have diminished, allowing only what is legally required(?). Community input with a desire for 'balance' would alter the choices.

Did you know that the BCLT is purchasing a large new lot at an undisclosed location within the gridded Mesa? This is not the cleared one at the end of Overlook near Mesa Rd. This new lot is being sold directly to the BCLT, by an absentee home owner, in a closed negotiation. Those of us who sought info, even months ago, did not receive return calls from the real estate agent.

I would describe the new parcel as an increasing rare densely vegetated coastal scrub zone, large enough to allow habitat to thrive. It also serves as a buffer between the surrounding homes/project sites. This is what a Land Trust would highlight as a primary conservation project.

Meanwhile, there are several projects in place within the Overlook/Aspen area. The 'open lot' plan calls for 9-12 people, 6-8 cars, with on site parking for 6, and 1 water meter. Across the street, a home has been purchased that connects to Aspen. Also, to be commended, a private home has been bequeathed to the trust. So in that one area are concentrated all projects so far. This may have been a coincidence, but this has a huge impact on both renters, homeowners and traffic. Will there be a plan in the future to not cluster sites? Can the town have input as to the development of it's Mesa?

Can the BCLT include input that will better create a balance with housing needs and the vital balance with nature that draws us to live here? (See Bo Community Plan pg. 29, 1st paragraph). Can lower density projects be considered, for the sake of the renters and all? The Community Plan calls for 2nd units and renovation of houses. With the BCLT's plan to purchase more water meters, I feel it is essential that there be true community involvement in all phases. Also with the acceptance of personal gifts, public and private grants, and county, HUD funding, this sets demographic choices that do not solely target those here who need rentals.

The plan to fill the school needs review also. Please support affordable housing at it's best. The BCLT will hold a meeting on Wed. 3/28 to explain the new projects and plans. Hopefully time will be allowed for needed discussion. Janine Aroyan

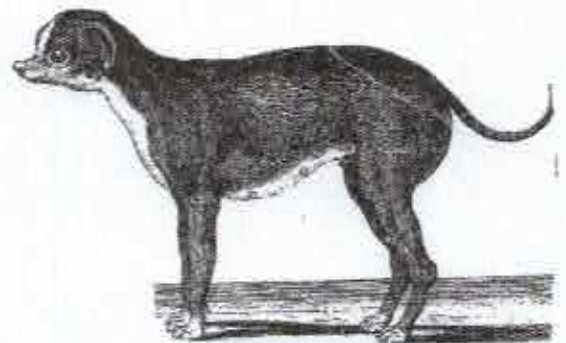

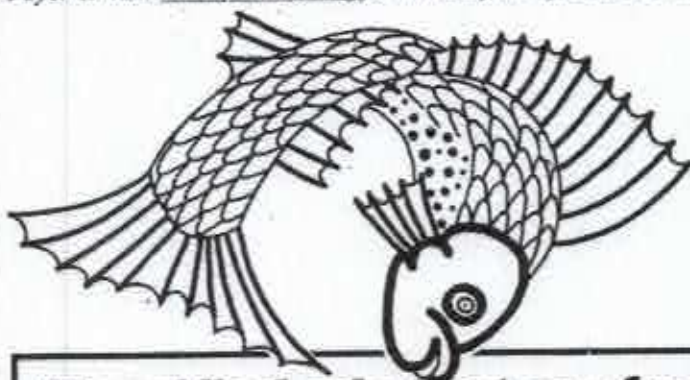
