The Belgians have insisted on fixing up Trishna's green bass guitar. As the luthier put it, "This needs like... how do you say...when you clean your house after the winter."


We got to see Micheal Hurley and Daniel Higgs perform and suggest you check them out. Maybe we'll bring them to Bo for a show.

National Radio and TV have
announced some estimated 260
thousand tons of debris from the
Fukushima earthquake- nuclear
power plant explosion is headed
toward the Canadian, Washington,
Oregon and California coast.

As of 10 April 12 higher Radiation levels have been detected in the large kelp along the CA coast.

When I heard this I contacted the head of Marin County Emergency Services (OES) representing myself as the retired Bolinas Disaster Coordinator.

The secretary of OES asked me not to say anything until I got orders from the top. I waited five days then received a very cordial call from the top.

I was thanked for my call and told Federal, State and Local Agencies are now coordinated and on alert. (Remember your body, the earth and ocean has a small amount of radiation in them. Do not be over alarmed and do not call your local Fire Department unnecessarily.

Debris has been identified in Vancouver. NASA and ships at sea are tracking it by satellite.

The debris consists of large amounts of telephone poles, house parts, roofs, plastic and anything that floats. (Japanese plastic bottles are stamped with a chrysanthemum on the bottom.)

The likely hood of the debris being contaminated with nuclear fall out after being in the ocean salt water for 13 months is slight, but I personally would not touch or go close to anything

suspect until the proper authorities cleared it.)

Out of my own concern I continued learning about Disaster Preparedness and World Geology and now radiation after I retired from BFD.

Both ours are audible. One is suitable for citizen beach monitoring; the other and more expensive detects various gases such as Radon and is more suitable for Fire Departments and Emergency Services personnel.

We carry a huge selection of emergency items at reasonable cost along with Potassium/lodine tabs (for people who come in direct contact); emergency tents and camping gear, AM/FM radios with cell phone charger; waterproof matches; Honda Generators; Gas shut off tools; 1st aid Medical Trauma kits & trunk kits; dehydrated food packs; food bars, animal1st aid kits; & water purifiers (4 Gal. Water per person per day) etc.

I personally feel that Bolinas and Stinson need to organize and join radiationnetwork.com Set up several radiation-monitoring stations along the Bolinas, Stinson, Point Reyes Shoreline and North until we understand the severity of this situation.

I would like to clarify the circumstances surrounding Sheila O'Donnell's letter that appeared in Wednesday's Hearsay News. After the assault outside Smiley's a couple weeks ago—deputies suspect Thor Manetta was the aggressor—one of our reporters at the Point Reyes Light, Trevor Bach, spoke with Sheila about Thor and his reputation in town. Sheila spoke somewhat freely, saying that Thor was a "troubled kid." Sensing that she was treading on delicate ground, Trevor asked explicitly whether she wanted to be quoted. Sheila said, "Yes, as long as it's on background." But that statement was confusing.

"On background" has a unique meaning in journalism, which is that one does not directly quote a source, but rather uses the information gathered from that source as context to help build the story. So Sheila contradicted herself, saying yes and no at the same time. But Trevor, who is still a bit wet behind the ears, understood her answer as that he could quote her about Thor's background. He asked her to spell her last name so that he got it right in the article, and she asked that he please omit any reference to her profession.

If Sheila had understood that she was not going to be quoted, why would she have asked such a thing?

When Trevor learned through a mutual friend on Monday that Sheila was upset about how she was mentioned in the article, he called her to apologize. She did not call back. Instead she wrote a formal letter to me: I later learned that she also sent it to the Hearsay News and The West Marin Citizen. After reading her letter on my computer I asked Trevor for his side of the story, and then had a few email exchanges with Sheila. I told her that I was not going to print the letter because it contained severe statements that were either gross exaggerations or unfounded. To me it was apparent that she and Trevor had a misunderstanding; certainly he had not deliberately and maliciously defied her wishes. Her statements that she was misquoted and quoted out of context were untrue, and on top of that she labeled our story "yellow journalism." I take pride in printing nearly every letter to the editor I receive, but I will not print letters that I know contain false information.

I succeeded in stopping the Citizen from printing Sheila's letter today, Thursday, but the Hearsay printed it before I knew they had it. I wish the editor had called me to ask about its veracity and context. In fact, I cannot understand why an editor would print such a letter without fact-checking or seeking to understand its circumstances. Furthermore, the letter referred to an article that was exclusively in the Light.

I'm writing this for Bolinas readers as a friend and former Bolinas resident. I'm disturbed at the speed at which people jump to vilify the newspaper I work for, and I have the impression that people often distrust my reporters, who can be more or less trained as journalists but are always, in my estimation, people of integrity, honesty and intelligence, who work hard to write accurate, informed and unbiased news about our community.
