



KNOW YOUR BO

In 1909, Oliver Longley built himself a two-story building in downtown Bolinas. The top floor was the family residence and the ground floor a blacksmith shop where he worked shoeing horses and working on wagons among other schooner, logger and ranch equipment. In 1913, near the Great Lakes, Henry Ford's Model T car gave people the opportunity to travel like never before. In 1917 the Model TT, a one-ton pickup truck with a reinforced chassis and rear axel replaced the need for wagons, horseshoes and the people that made them. So Oliver changed with the times. By 1920, he had a full service auto garage with gravity gasoline pumps and a tow truck service. For eighty years the garage adapted to new owners and new technology. Longley's Garage became the Bolinas Garage and its end was often called what it's sign read: "Bo ina rage."

In 2004, the Bolinas Community Land Trust transformed the top floor into housing for local residents and opened the ground floor for businesses to take root. The pumps are now on the side of the building, the station's sign advertises "BoGas" and coffee is served where horseshoes once were forged.
