# Coastal plan update will destabilize Marin ag economy

For the past nine years I have been honored to work with fellow farmers and planners from the Marin Community Development Agency on the update of Marin's Local Coastal Program.

Sadly, the promise of progressive farming policies to help future farmers has deteriorated into a struggle to defend Marin agriculture from a sweeping expansion of Coastal Commission authority over routine farming activities. Instead of integrating our suggestions for viable agriculture into the update, the commission staff and local environmental activists have utilized the LCP update process in a bold attempt to reclassify food production changes on the Marin coast as "development."

If approved, the pending LCP update before the Marin County supervisors on Tuesday will only destabilize the farming economy of Marin. Representing the Marin County Farm Bureau, I call upon our citizens to reach out to their supervisors and urge them to reject the current LCP update.

The Coastal Act is quite clear about "encouraging coastal agriculture." It also notes that the California coast supports some of the best, unique growing conditions for pasture and crop production in the state. Marin's historic coastal farms produce award-winning dairy products,

renowned row crops and world class shellfish. Our environmentally friendly food production has attracted national and international attention. After decades of a declining agricultural economy, many coastal farms have survived and successfully diversified under the 1981 LCP rules. The emergence of local farmers' markets and an array of new products such as cheese and pasture raised meats is a trend we should not stifle with new regulation.

As they say, "if it isn't broken, don't try to fix it."

The vote on Tuesday is a fundamental turning point, affecting the future viability of agriculture in Marin. If our county supervisors vote to approve the proposed update to the 1981 LCP, the effect would be a down-zoning of Marin's coastal agriculture from a primary use to a "grandfathered" activity, frozen in time. Many production changes would require costly permit processes, involving the years of studies and public review currently required for new residential development. Permit processes would prioritize wildlife habitat over farming in historically farmed areas. The proposed LCP update would also open the door for environmental activists to wage campaigns against farming activities they don't agree with.

With shifting market trends, extreme weather events and climate change, we should not be tying the hands of our future food producers.

As natural ecosystems are best left alone to thrive, the agricultural ecosystem is much the same. Up until now, new and young farmers of modest means have always been able to innovate and establish new products and business on our working lands. The ranch I farm in the coastal zone near Bolinas seamlessly shifted from orchard to pasture in the 1950s, pasture to row crop in the 1960s, back to pasture in the 1970s, and again to row crops in the 1980s. Without the ability to freely establish and adapt their operations, agriculture on this ranch would likely have died out long ago.

The 1981 policies have fostered a renaissance of local food production in Marin. Under these original rules, the Marin Agricultural Land Trust has become a national leader in farmland preservation, so far protecting 50 percent of the county's farmland for future use. We must not jeopardize our county's investment in agriculture by acquiescing to the Coastal Commission.

While some argue that the county has already wasted too much time and money on the nine-year update process, we must also consider the tens of millions of dollars Marin has spent to protect agricultural land through conservation easements in comparison. We can save all the farmland we want, but that effort is meaningless if future farmers are unable to make a living.

Keeping the 1981 LCP in place is well worth the added expense. Santa Barbara County faced a similar dilemma and rejected their LCP update in 2011. Please urge your supervisor to do what's right for our local food system and reject the proposed LCP update.

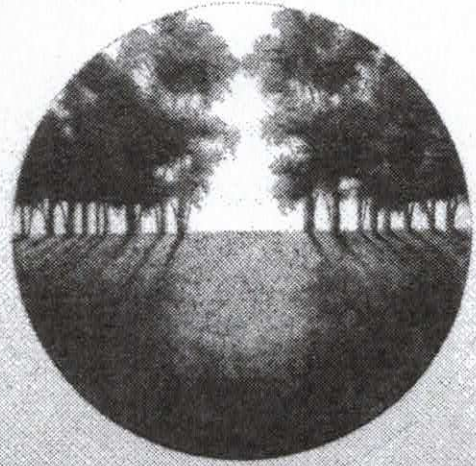
