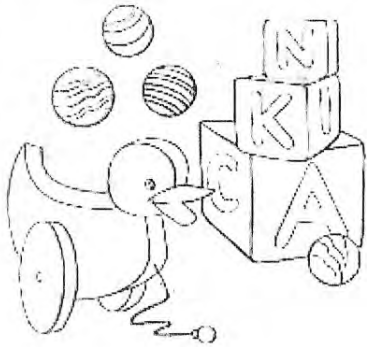

Dear Bolinas,

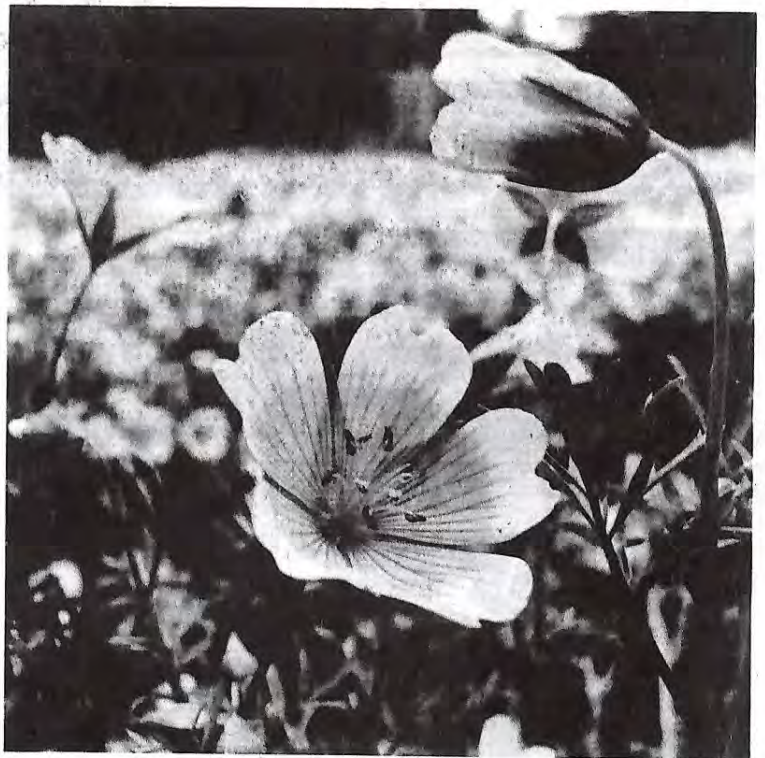

Bolinas Public Land Farm Lease

Bolinas public land lease

I am responding to your March 27 article, which states that the Gospel Flat Farm lease revision was about "appeasing the neighbors." Community input has been encouraged and has shaped decisions throughout the revision process. Those who walk this Bolinas Community Public Utility District land more frequently were the first to witness some of the initial problems. Had there not been valid concerns to begin with, BCPUD would not have moved to create a committee to address them. Only two of the eight committee members live in the direct vicinity of the farm. Three members are BCPUD-related persons.

Concerns included the need to create separate farm vehicle access that would not degrade the public trails and the need to increase setbacks along the paths from new metal fencing. One of these public setbacks has since become a drainage runoff area for the farm, out of necessity.

Farm equipment can in fact be parked in the field. Farmer Mickey Murch agreed that 30 consecutive days of machinery on site was fine, with some flexibility for circumstances. A crane was stored for a longer time. No one complains. We are trying to work out what is practical for the farm and also respect the public's 40 years of enjoying these paths, the wildlife and the open space. Many factors were weighed in all decisions regarding the original lease, leading to a revision unanimously passed by the BCPUD board.

It is important to not see victims here, but a process of compromise. Allowing some public input on the lease is fair to all parties. There are hopes of restoring the surrounding areas, which may become a cooperative project involving the public and assistance from Mickey Murch.
