

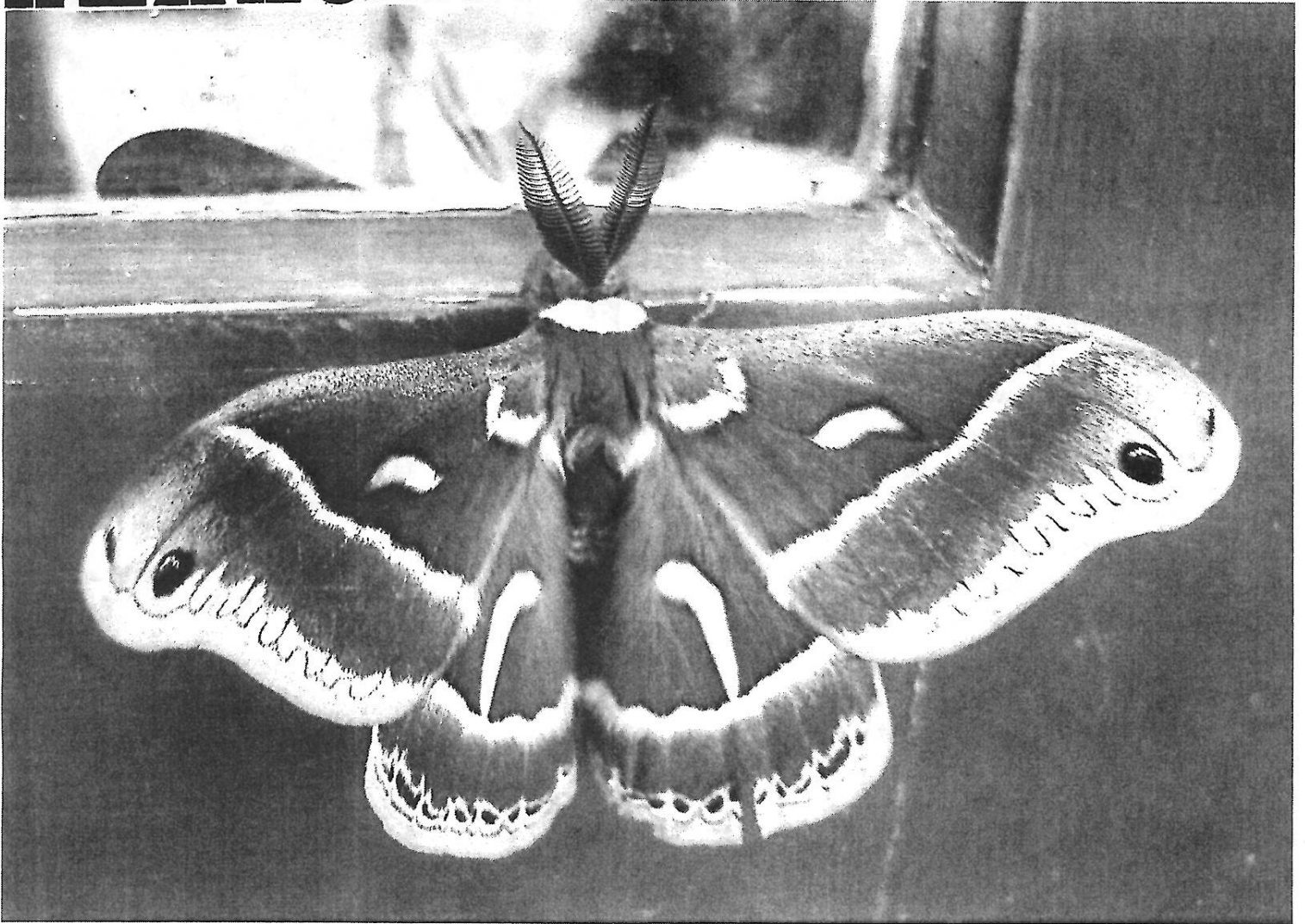

Caught peeking into a window near Rose Lane. This is a Ceanothus Silk Moth, *Hyalophora euryalus*. A big guy with about a five inch wing span, mostly a beautiful russet red with black and white markings. Found from British Columbia to Baja California. Adults are on wing from January to July depending on the location. The larvae feed on Ceanothus Rhamnus californica, Prunus emarginata, Arctostaphylos, Alnus, Betula, Corylus, Ribes Pseudotsuga menziesii Arbutus menziesii and Salix.

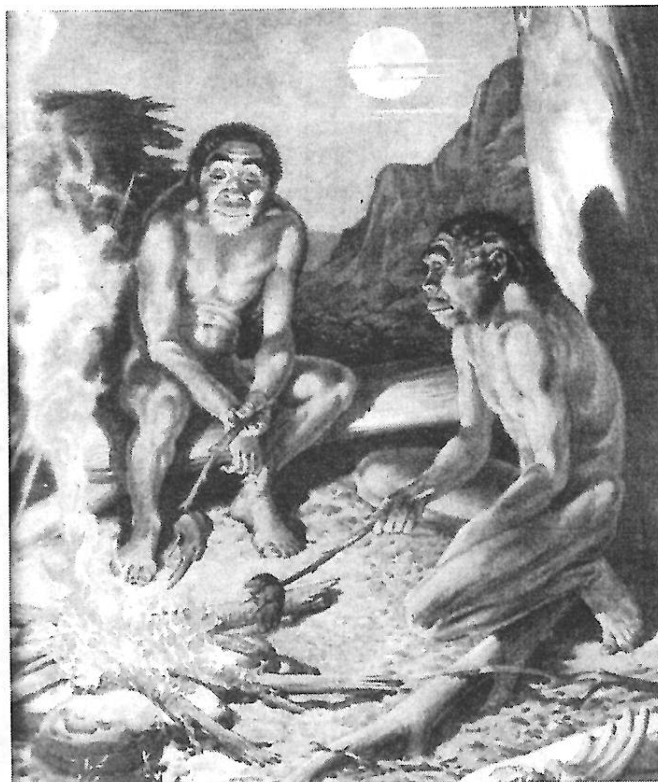

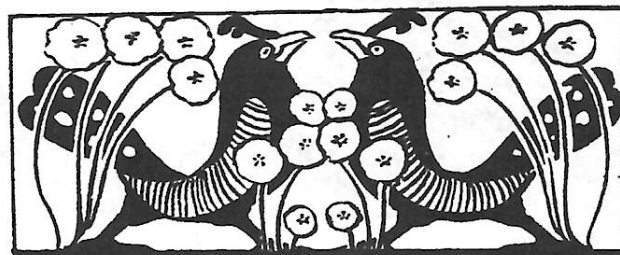

The kids from school will be making music for all to enjoy back at the Center at 2:30, and the Auction will close at 4 PM.

Oysters, Quiche, Salad, Beer and Wine will be served both days.

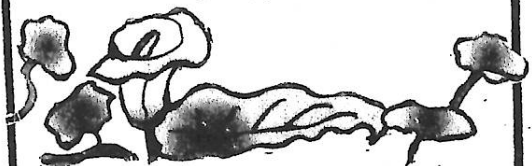

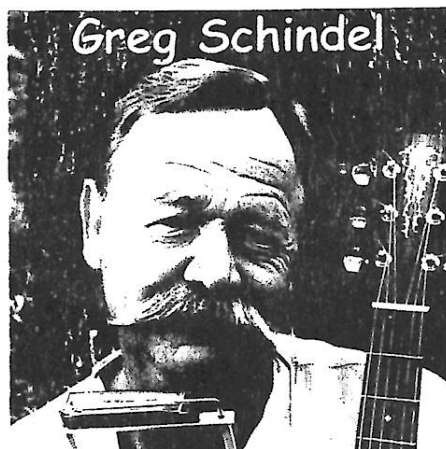

Measure A Parcel Tax Senior Exemption

Marin Emergency Radio Authority (MERA)
(APPLICATION FILING DEADLINE - on or before -
JUNE 1, 2016)

Who is eligible to receive a low-income senior exemption for the Measure A Parcel Tax for the 2016-2017 tax year?

➤ To qualify for a low-income senior exemption for the Measure A parcel tax for a single family residence, you must (1) be 65 years of age or older by December 31, 2016, (2) own and occupy your residence, and (3) not have earned a total annual household income of more than \$65,700 in 2015.

What is the deadline to file a low-income senior exemption application for the 2016-2017 tax year?

➤ The deadline to file a low-income senior exemption application for the 2016-2017 tax year is June 1, 2016.

You can pick up an application at the Bolinas Fire Station or download an application at meraonline.org. The applications must be mailed to:

You must file an application every year because the exemption is based upon income, and income may change from year-to-year.
