

THE BONES OF BURNT PARK




The new Downtown park is set in stone. Now that the dust has settled and the crew has returned home, I'd like to take the opportunity to fill in some historical details about the stonework that was recently installed. Some may call it BO-henge or the coliseum, but there was a mere 200 plus tons of local Sierra White granite that was installed since January. The large rectangular pieces where originally quarried in Madera County; fabricated and installed as part of the 1942 Union Square in San Francisco. The material went into service to clad the worlds first underground parking lot which was also designed to be a bomb shelter. The stone has a history of withstanding earthquakes, fire and dynamite. This material is considered to be "one of California's greatest natural resources." Local to California, reclaimed, and providing an enduring legacy, I believed that this stone was the most appropriate for the Downtown park in Bolinas.

As a native Californian and a father who's family has deep roots in Bolinas, this opportunity was very special to me. I want to thank the village of Bolinas for their patience, inquisitiveness, and bold opinions. Special thanks to my local collaborators; the donor, the designer, the design committee, project manager, John's Market, Bolinas Bay Lumber and of course Smiley's. Lot's of love goes out to my family, my mentors and my rock star crew.


