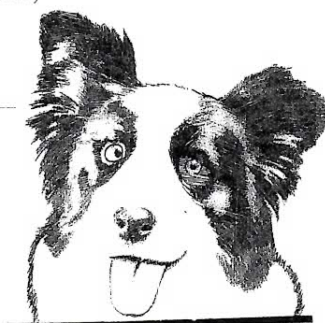

There are a multitude of benefits to training in the martial arts, some more obvious than others, from self-defense and safety of those around you to fitness, flexibility, confidence and self-discipline.

Our class is affiliated with the BuYu group ('warrior friends') created by Jack Hoban and Mark Hodel in the US, which in turn is part of the Bujinkan Dojo headed by Dr Masaaki Hatsumi. He is the 34<sup>th</sup> Grandmaster in an unbroken lineage stretching back over 900 years in Japan.

The Bujinkan school transmits the teachings of nine ancient warrior arts, including the original Samurai and Ninja (not the recent Western versions of these traditions!). Ninjutsu / Taijutsu is a purely self-defense art with no competitive aspects, our primary focus is the development of a well rounded self-defense repertoire based on respect for self and others. Classes are intended to be effective, safe and fun.

Taijutsu is based on proper body alignment, distancing and timing coupled with tactics and strategy. Upper body strength, speed and performance are not key to this art which means people of all ages and body types can benefit. Training includes punching, kicking, grappling, throwing and use of training weapons (real weapons are not permitted in the dojo).

A key component of training is the incorporation of 'warrior ethics'. This value system helps students identify 'real' threats (physical, emotional, etc.) and learn how to respond appropriately.

About the instructor: Martin Butt

I am a long time Bolinas resident; I run a landscaping business specializing in water features and enjoy many aspects of our lovely countryside. I have been training in the Bujinkan School for six years and hold a first degree black belt. My teacher is Mr Ken Lux who trains near Sacramento. He has been training for over 25 years with Grandmaster Masaaki Hatsumi, Jack Hoban and many others and holds a 15<sup>th</sup> degree black belt.

Docent Training Program Orientation at Audubon Canyon Ranch's Martin Griffin Preserve

## Hopelessly Mired

A lesson in futility

November 2011, the settlement funds from the 2007 Cosco Busan oil spill were determined for Bay Area Counties who sustained oil damage, a \$44 million settlement would be divided by all those effected. Marin, outside the Golden Gate was not high on the impacted list. I was following proceedings hoping funds would be made available for Bolinas Lagoon restoration. Marin was not awarded any restoration funds. However, for loss of recreational uses during the several day long clean-up \$720,000 was set aside for Marin.

Strolling Wharf Road last March it occurred to me that the town boat dock was in dire straits. Here was a heavily utilized public access dock and floating boat ramp used by fishers, boaters, kayakers, marine / lagoon researchers, school groups and musicians. It sees a lot of use, and yet it is marginally accessible and in fact has become a bit of a hazard. The seawall is compromising dock access.

The National Fish and Wildlife Foundation, (NFWF) was in charge of disbursement and was requesting project proposals by April 26. I followed detailed procedures and submitted a pre-application. I would need an umbrella organization who could receive funds if the boat dock was selected. Chances of receiving a grant were greatly increased if you could demonstrate availability of matching funds.

Belle Wood at BCPUD provided a map and a parcel number. I was not sure if the dock belonged to College of Marin (COM). Calls to the college were returned by senior and knowledgeable facilities personnel who claimed the dock and explained the budgetary shortages and code requirements that prevented them from even beginning on accessibility issues.

The last major restoration and amintenance work took place in 1997 with plastic sheathing for the pilings, metal plates spanning the gap between road and dock. Josh Churchman and others repaired and improved the floating dock more recently. Dependent on the tide the floating dock is nearly 6 feet below street level requiring a 60 foot long sloping ramp to provide legislated access for all.

Jurisdiction-ally mired the COM owns the dock, the County owns the road and the seawall, the Marine Sanctuary supervises the water that ebbs & flows and has say over armoring of it's bodies of water and the property owners own the Lagoon mudflats under their homes and decks to the mean low tide line.

The seawalls along Wharf Road have been contended by property owners forever! Always exerting pressure on those homes and businesses on pilings. There are some in good repair and some like near the boat dock in serious need of repair. Repair gets complicated! Seawalls hold road fill and the slumping little Mesa in place. Slip sheeting, a process of driving steel plates in deep and parallel to the failing walls would be a huge and involved process requiring permits, probably closing the road entirely for a period of time. Wharf Road sewer lines run below the road in the fill. The violent hammering of pile drivers would likely compromise foundations and utilities, possibly creating a domino effect of wall failure.

As much as I would have liked to tap into that ¼ million dollars for a project as worthy as the dock. Alas, it is not in the cards at this time. Building restrictions, permits and disability access requirements all are very much prohibiting factors. So for now the dock remains a hazard for those who use it and an embarrassment for Bolinas and the County. I welcome your thoughts!
