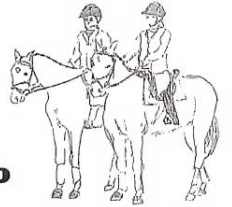

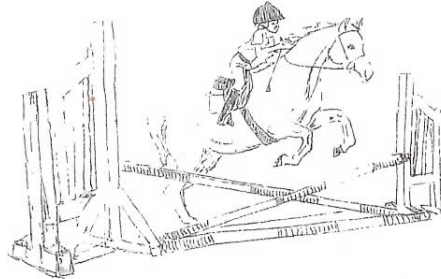

Final Weeks of 2012 Public Season to Visit Audubon Canyon Ranch's Martin Griffin Preserve

West Marin residents are invited to Audubon Canyon Ranch's Martin Griffin Preserve on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, until July 15, 2012, when the preserve closes for its public season.

The 1,000-acre Martin Griffin Preserve offers visitors opportunities for bird and wildlife viewing from multiple platforms, which provide elevated views of one of the most significant Great Egret nesting colonies on the West Coast. Each viewing platform is outfitted with spotting scopes and binoculars, and staffed by ACR's Volunteer Ranch Guides.

There are currently 59 active Great Egret nests at the preserve. Visitors are likely to see baby egret chicks and birds in-flight.

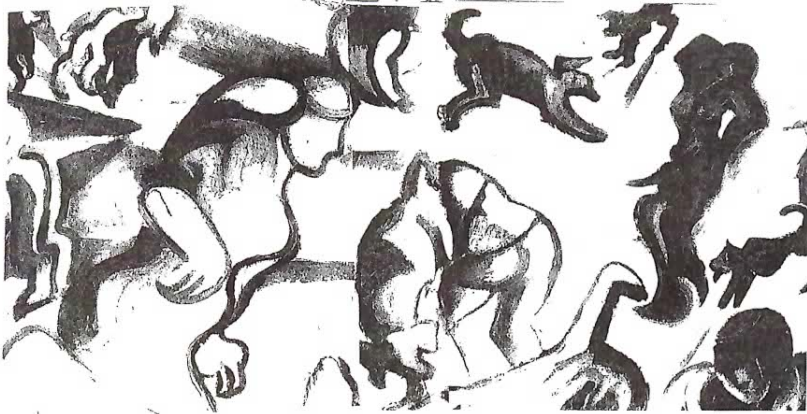

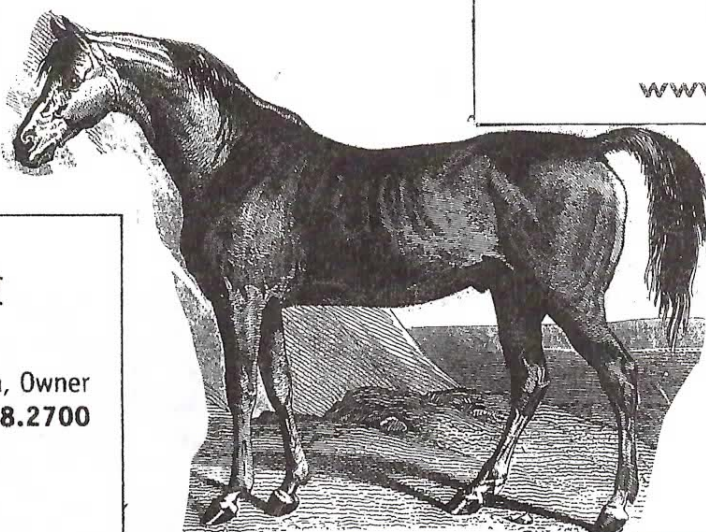
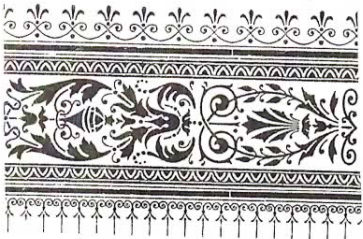

Minutes from the May 28, 2012 Bolinas Fire Protection District Board Meeting

Pres. Buchanan called the regular meeting of the Bolinas Fire Protection District to order at 7:30PM. Vice Pres. Kilkenny, Dir. Smith, Dir. O'Donnell and Dir. Kimball were present. Also present: Chief Brown, GM Blackman of the BCPUD and Secretary Brown.

MSC, Kilkenny/Smith (unan) to approve the agenda.

CHIEF'S REPORT

**NERA**  
Chief Brown attended the May 13<sup>th</sup> meeting. Discussion included the proposed Amendment 5 to MERA JPA and restated Bylaws regarding the change in the governance structure as well as Budgets for FY 12-13. Another meeting is scheduled for June 5<sup>th</sup> to vote on Amendment 5. Bolinas will pay an increase in fees of \$602 in the next fiscal year.  
Dir. Kimball asked if Scott McMorrow of the IPUD will be representing West Marin on the MERA Executive Board. Chief Brown answered that Scott currently sits on the Governance Committee and will not serve on the Executive Board unless elected to do so.

**Training**

Chief Brown reported that Wildland training began as of May 22<sup>nd</sup>. The first month will focus on fire behavior and safety. Chief Brown has spoken to Capt. Martinelli and BC Thompson of the MCFD regarding assisting in training officers and volunteers. Both have agreed. Training will be scheduled in the near future.  
The Board discussed evacuation procedures in the event of a large fire on the Mesa or downtown. Chief Brown reiterated that life safety/evacuation is the number one priority in any catastrophic event. Evacuation is technically the responsibility of the MC Sheriff's Office; however, the fire department would assist and is most knowledgeable about local roads and terrain. Dir. Kimball suggested that deputies be partnered with Disaster Council Coordinators during disaster trainings. Chief Brown concurred.

**Volunteers**  
BFD/BCPUD Shared Personnel Update: The reciprocal training issue is yet to be resolved.

The annual Mother's Day Pancake Breakfast was a huge success again this year. 270 people were served and the profits netted at \$500 for the Volunteer Association and \$500 for the Disaster Council. Chief Brown especially thanked the Disaster Council representatives who came at 7AM to cut fruit for the occasion and Dana O'Connor for making so many beautiful flower bouquets.

**Apparatus**  
Equipment for the new U231 is expected to arrive soon. Barcomm will install the brackets, control heads, siren, and light bar. When finished, the Unit will be ready for service.  
E253 received an annual safety inspection, no notable problems. E265 is currently out of service for its safety inspection. E285 and U219 are next in line for service.

**Disaster Council**

Chief Brown thanked the Board for attending the May 1<sup>st</sup> Tsunami Awareness presentation. Asst. Chief Marcotte, Ian Johnson, Richard Dillman and Chief Brown met to discuss the disaster communication needs for the firehouse. Ian and Richard were extremely helpful at identifying necessary equipment and ideal installation options. Two base stations need to be installed in addition to the MERA system which is already operating. One for the Disaster Council radio system and one for the high band radios. The District already owns a majority of the equipment needed, thanks to Ian. The budget for FY12/13 will accommodate an expenditure of approximately \$1,000 to complete the two systems. Chief Brown thanked Ian and Richard for their help and expertise.

"Operation Riptide", the County wide Tsunami exercise took place on May 10<sup>th</sup>. Bolinas used the time to inventory, organize and identify needs for our Department Operations Center (DOC). Ian Johnson set up and tested all of the radios and phone lines that would be deployed in an event. Chief Brown stated that it was an extremely useful exercise which she plans to conduct again with more Disaster Council volunteers present. The West Marin Disaster Council will be conducting a communications drill in the near future. Chief Brown sits on the planning committee with representatives from Inverness, Marin County Fire and the Marin County Office of Emergency Services.

Chief Brown reported that the May 12<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> CERT class was very successful. Twenty five people attended with three from Bolinas. She plans to contact past Bolinas CERT trainees to attend future classes.

**General Operations**  
Crown Castle recently installed the final 3 Verizon antennas approved in 2009 on their communications tower during the week of May 7<sup>th</sup> and successfully removed the two Omni whip antennas. Crown Castle and Verizon will soon commission a licensed third party to measure radio frequency (RF) emissions for the new configuration in conjunction with their pending request to install a microwave antenna on the communications tower. They have agreed to coordinate their field survey with Chief Brown so that Don Smith can attend and concurrently measure RF emissions with his own monitor and compare the results.

Pres. Buchanan commented that the community and Fire board are so lucky to have volunteers such as Ian Johnson, Richard Dillman and Don Smith.

**Maintenance Agreement – CHA**  
Chief Brown reported that she is still awaiting a response from CHA regarding the draft MOU.

**GENERAL BUSINESS**  
Action Item #1: Approve Memorandum of Understanding Between the BCPUD and the County of Marin Regarding Phase Two of a Geotechnical Assessment of Terrace Avenue at Surfer's Overlook in Bolinas: Approve Proposal from Sanders & Associates Geotechnical engineers ("SAGE")

Dir. Kimball explained that the proposed assessment is needed for the next body of work to be completed at Surfer's Overlook. An inquiry of subsurface conditions needs to be completed in order to plan for a full bluff stabilization. Test borings into the substrate are planned to be completed before the BCPUD moves water lines along Terrace Avenue after Labor Day. GM Blackman explained that collaboration between the Districts (BCPUD and BFPD) is favorably viewed by the County. Funding for the 3-4 million dollar full bluff stabilization project is an issue so contributions from both agencies are important to show wide local community support. GM Blackman explained that if the MOU is signed by the Fire Board, it will next be passed on to Ernest Klock at the County and presented

at the June 5<sup>th</sup> Board of Supervisors meeting for approval. After further discussion, the Board decided to approve the MOU.

MSC, Kilkenny/Smith (unan) to approve MOU between the BCPUD and the County of Marin regarding Phase Two of a Geotechnical Assessment of Terrace Avenue at Surfer's Overlook in Bolinas: Approve Proposal from SAGE and payment of \$100 toward the cost of the assessment to SAGE.

Dir. Kimball reminded everyone that the MOU is unencumbered and therefore requires no future commitments from the BFPD. He acknowledged GM Blackman's thoroughness and professionalism regarding her work on this issue and described it as a great gift to the District and to the community at large. GM Blackman in turn thanked Dir. Kimball and described their work as a mutual effort to find the right solution.

Action Item #2: Accept proposal for FYE 6.30.12 Audit from Doran & Assoc. Chief Brown recommended that the Board accept the proposal as Doran & Assoc did a fantastic job with the last audit from the previous year and continues to be helpful.

MSC, Kimball/Kilkenny (unan) to accept proposal for FYE 6.30.12 Audit from Doran & Associates.

Action Item #3: Approve Independent Contract Agreement with Kaaren Gann. Chief Brown highly recommended Kaaren Gann to the Board based on her previous experience as the GM of Inverness Public Utility District. She currently is a bookkeeper for the BCPUD and is very familiar with the District's needs and requirements.

MSC, Kimball/O'Donnell (unan) approved independent contract agreement with Kaaren Gann.

Pres. Buchanan thanked Chief Brown for handling communications regarding the change of bookkeepers.

Discussion: Verizon request to add microwave dish to existing Crown Castle tower located on Fire District property. Chief Brown reported that there has been no recent communications with Verizon of late. She is waiting for a response from the last communication.

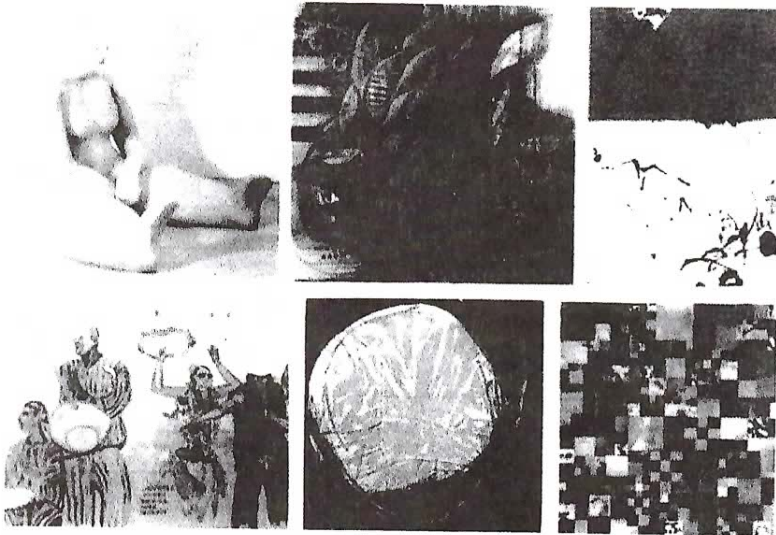

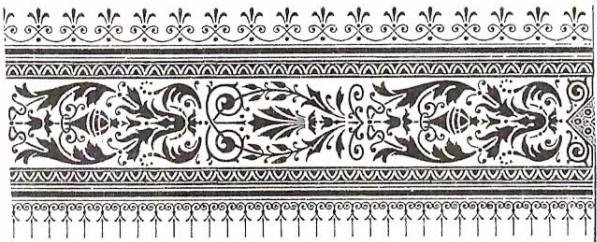

Everyone was fond of Drake Jordan. As a skilled layout artist before computers, he was at the center of publications activities in Bolinas in the late '60's and early '70's, helping local poets, artists, and writers with pasteup advice and elbow grease on numerous local newspapers, books, and magazines including *Beaulines*, *The Paper*, and the *Bolinas Hearsay News*. Roger Kovach sent me this clipping (pictured at right) which appeared in the Chronicle's weekend *This World* section, Sept. 8, 1968, noting that Thomas Albright, the paper's notoriously negative critic gave the show a positive review. Drake helped me personally many times with printing and layout questions in the early days of the Hearsay News. When old and elegant layout techniques were taken over by computers, Drake embraced the changes with enthusiasm. I remember vividly when he showed me how to send a picture by modem over the phone lines to a print shop in San Rafael at 2800 bps in 20 minutes, saving a car trip over the hill. He said it was going to change everything. His acerbic humor and deep kindness and generosity will be missed by everyone who knew him.
