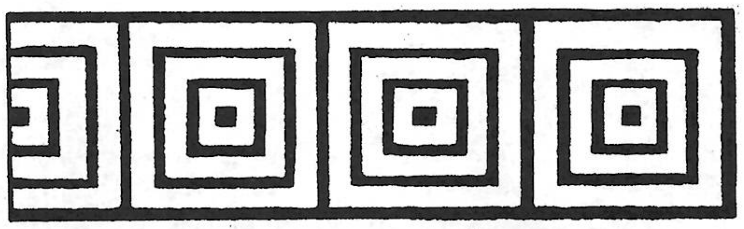

Bolinas 4th of July

Regardless of how we feel about it, the 4th of July happens every year and how Bolinas handles it is the subject of this letter.

For years, the Briones Lions Club has sponsored the event and has held the tug of war, a parade, a food booth and more to make our nation's birthday a fun event. Our responsibilities around the event have grown considerably in the past few years, mostly because of the number of people who come from other places to be a part of the festivities or just to enjoy the beach. Bolinas has been discovered and not just for the 4th of July as we all witnessed on the Presidents' weekend debacle and subsequent weekends.

Most people are unaware of what the Lions Club is, how we are involved in the Bolinas 4th of July and the magnitude of work involved.

We are a small group of folks from Stinson and Bolinas. We are part of Lions International but mostly raise money to help local people who need some extra support. In the past year, we've donated over \$5000 to various people with vision, dental, health or other issues, our libraries, our fire departments, our community centers, camps, youth services, local food services, and more.

The 4th is our major fundraiser of the year. A core group of about 10, mostly senior citizens, handle everything that I'm listing below:

Obtain permits for road closure

Get insurance for the event and tug of war

Get sponsors for the tug and have t-shirts designed and created

Print and distribute postcards to everyone in town so they are aware of the road closure

Rebar and caution tape about 5 miles of road (both sides – so really about 6 miles) to keep people from blocking critical fire and emergency access. Then we have to take it down the night of the 4th or the day after.

Order and place porta potties, refuse containers and recycling bins

Have someone run the tug of war and find someone to do the same on Stinson

Find a generous person with a boat to control the rope for the tug

Find volunteers to keep people safe during the tug by minding boundaries

Set up and man the food tent – break down and remove at end

Secure Mesa Park parking lot, direct visitors there and control the parking. Staff it with at least 4 people at all times

Arrange for the Bolinas Stagecoach shuttle and driver for the day

Find volunteers to man road closures at Mesa & Olema Bolinas Road, Terrace & Overlook and Downtown at Brighton and Wharf. That requires something like 20 people in 2-hour shifts

Clean up beach trash and town trash the day of and after

Numerous more items, but this is a good start

The job list of responsibilities for the Lions Club has grown much larger in the past years as more people come to Bolinas on the holiday weekends. We need help with the many jobs on the 3rd, 4th and 5th of July.

As it stands now, we do not have the manpower to hold all the events and so have decided not to do the food tent this year. We feel that the traffic control and road closures plus the no parking rebar and taping of roads is most important for our town. Hopefully the BBQ will return next year, but it's a huge amount of work and requires manpower.

There will be a lot of people coming to town on the 4th weekend. Last year, the Stinson Beach public beach closed because it was so full and they directed people to Bolinas. The same thing will happen this year and if we don't have planned control for traffic and parking it will be a nightmare and if there's an emergency, no one will be able to get through to put out fires or save someone's life.

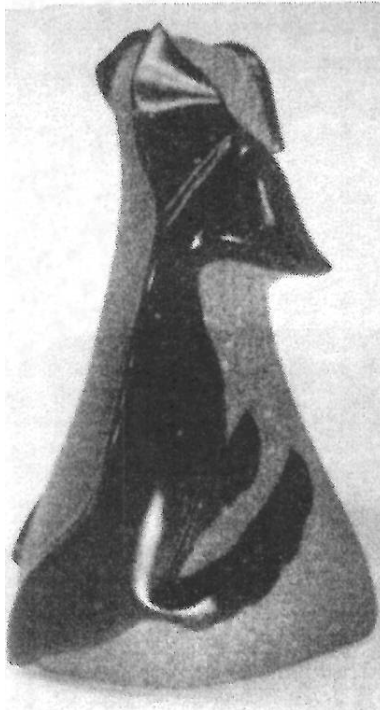
So, we need your help. On the 4th there are two-hour shifts to work in the parking lot, partner with another volunteer to man one of the road closure points, help with crowd control at the tug or check town or the beach for trash or debris. On the 3rd, there is rebar installation and on the 5th, rebar removal.

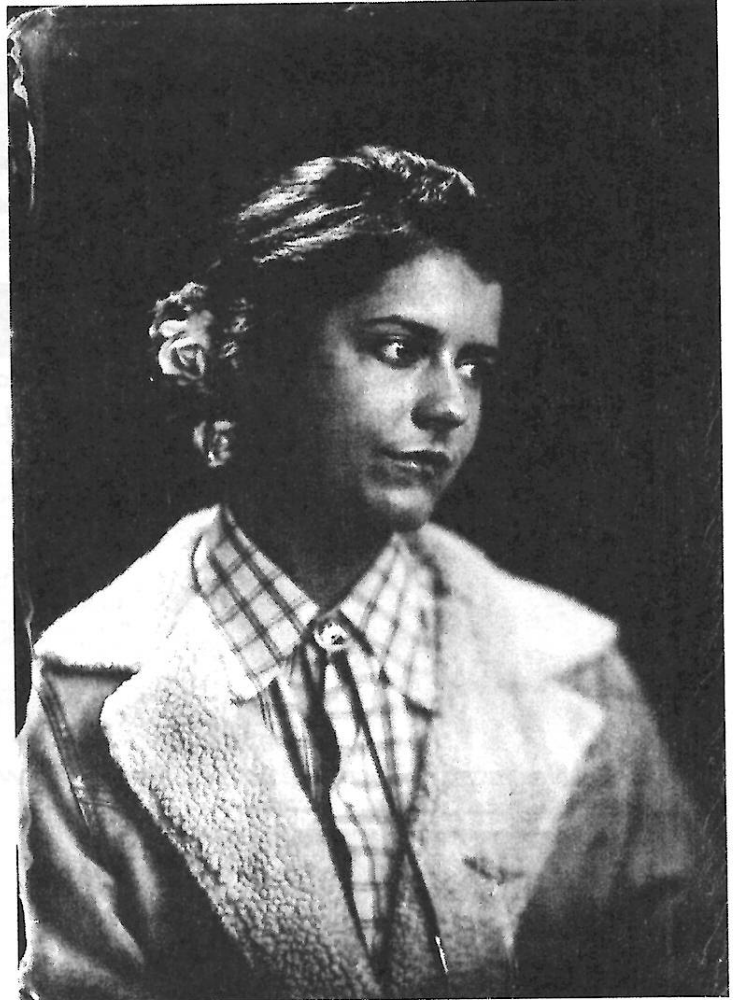

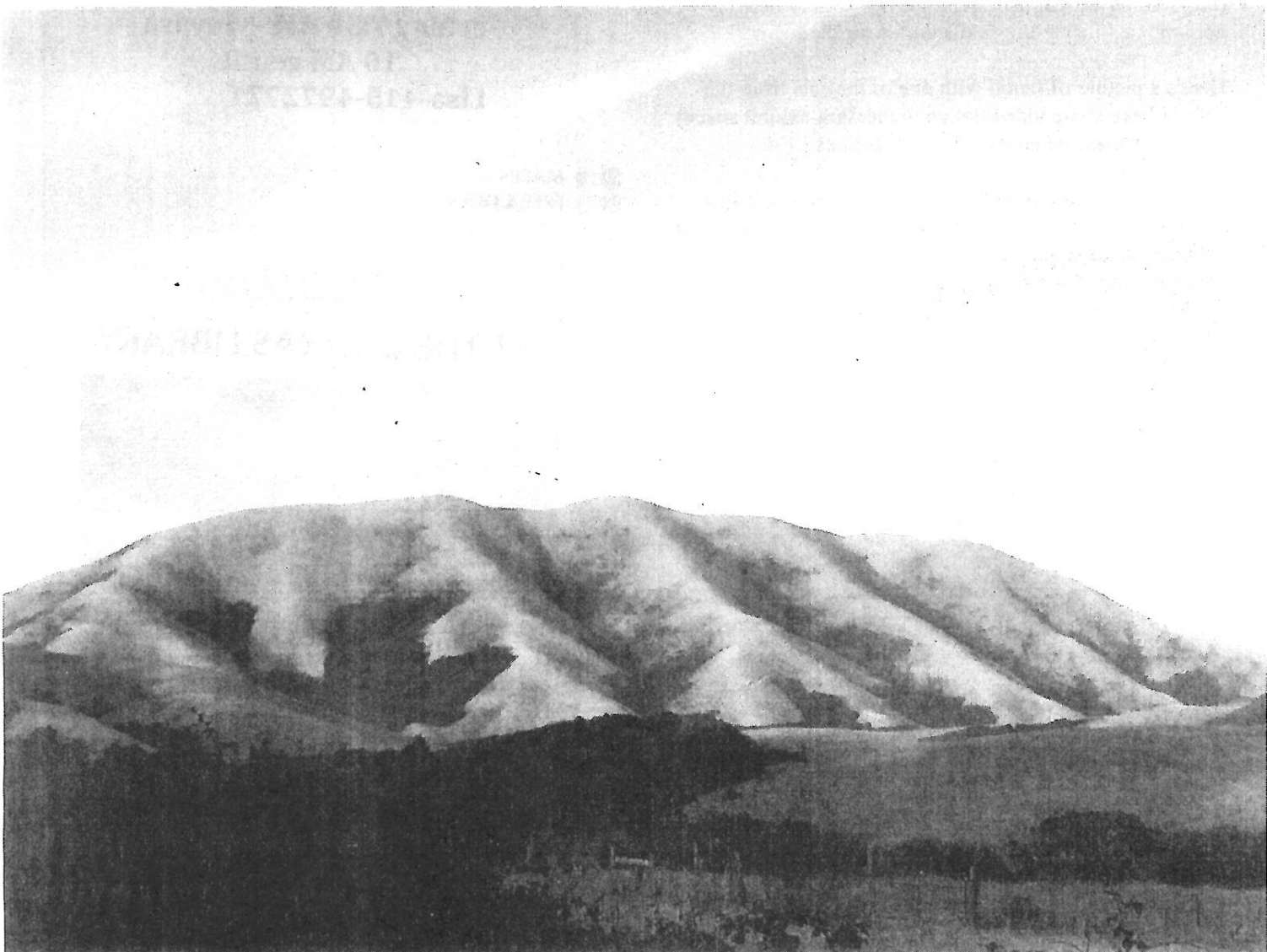

We're in Tokyo. I found a list of art exhibits that included Gallery EF (<http://www.gallery-ef.com/>), which is in the Carrot Building near Asakusa temple. The building survived an earthquake and fire in 1923, then the firebombing of Tokyo in 1945.

The exhibit tells the story of cats abandoned in Fukushima when the earthquake and tsunami caused a nuclear disaster, and all of the people were evacuated. Their pets were often left behind.

The exhibit is in a dark room. In the room is a replica of a feeding station that's being maintained by local volunteers. There is audio from the site playing, so you have a sense of the world these cats now share with various predators, crows, wind and weather.

Izumi from the gallery opened a drape and asked us to watch our heads as we ducked through a 4 foot opening into the dark space. We took off our shoes and climbed a flight of stairs. We were surrounded by sound, and in the darkness we saw the feeding station.

Izumi and other volunteers go to the site to maintain the feeding station. She has taken two cats home to the gallery, but they cannot leave the building, as they would be exterminated by the government, or by people who fear the radiation they carry.

The government would like the former residents to put the past behind them and return to their damaged property. A few farmers drive an hour or more from their shelters to grow food on their land. Many cannot afford the expense.

Izumi sells donated art and serves food at a cafe to fund the costs of maintaining the feeding station. Here's a link for donations (<http://consciouscat.net/2015/04/01/japan-cat-network-helping-cats-inside-the-fukushima-restricted-zone/>).

Here's a picture of Izumi with one of the cats from the cafe. I have some video (taken in the dark exhibit space) that I will share when we return to Bolinas.

Like the cats, we rely on the kindness of strangers in a world gone crazy from the insanity that plays itself out at the expense of society in wars and neoliberal ventures. What it is is up to us.

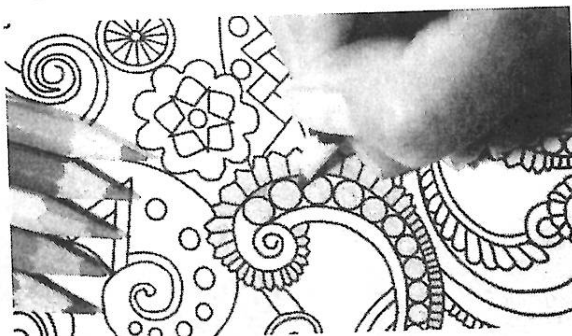

The following is from the May 13 School News, message from Principal Jason Richards. Greetings Bolinas-Stinson School Community, This week I would like to highlight an amazing project that our 4th graders participated in—it is great example of learning that engages students and makes an impact on the community. Our 4th grade students got involved with a program called Giving Through Youth—affiliated with the West Marin Fund. They wrote persuasive letters to the agency encouraging them to provide monetary grants to 3 local organizations. Our students' efforts ended up securing \$650 for each of the following groups: The Bolinas Children's Center, The Stinson Beach Preschool, and the Institute for Bird Populations. We had a wonderful assembly on Tuesday where the directors of each of these groups received checks from the class. A huge thank you goes to Gretel and Andy for guiding this work and to Harriet Kossman for approaching us with this opportunity. Of course, thank you so much to each of our 4th grade students!

Here are brief excerpts from the student letters to the West Marin Fund:

I'm really excited to give this grant to the Bolinas Children's Center. You were my favorite school and grade. I wish I could give you more but I can't. I think it is cool that you have an after school program. I never went to it but I wish I did! In your article that you sent me you said that your goal was to keep kids in a safe environment and to make kids smarter and ready for kindergarten.

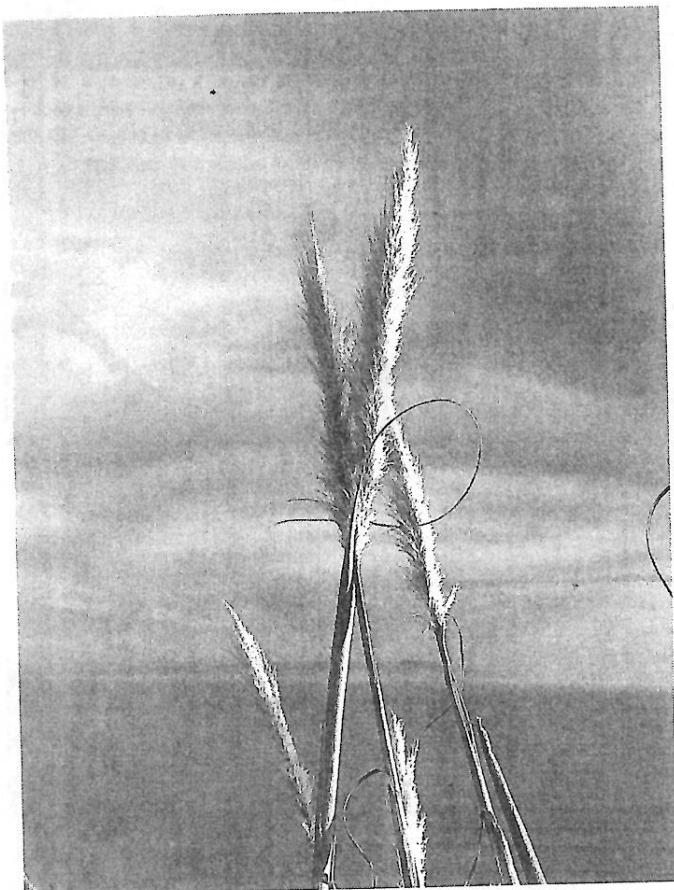
We chose to give our grant to the Stinson Beach Pre-school. It is one of the best Pre-schools that I have been to and that's not just because it's the only one that I have been to. Even if I had gone to another Pre-school this one would still be better in my opinion. This school is amazing because it teaches you so many things, but while you're having a blast!! And believe me, I know from experience.

The Bolinas-Stinson Pre-school also lets kids experience new concepts and is getting them ready for kindergarten and life. They also grow the kid's knowledge and let them do what they want to do. For instance I loved a Mickey Mouse dress and I wore it every day and the teachers

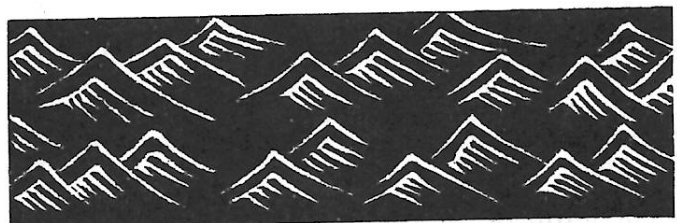
didn't care or think that it was weird they just let me do it.

We think that we should give the grant of \$650 to the IBP so they can protect the birds and make it so that less birds are endangered. Birds are important to the environment because they keep the mice, rats and other rodent's population in check.
