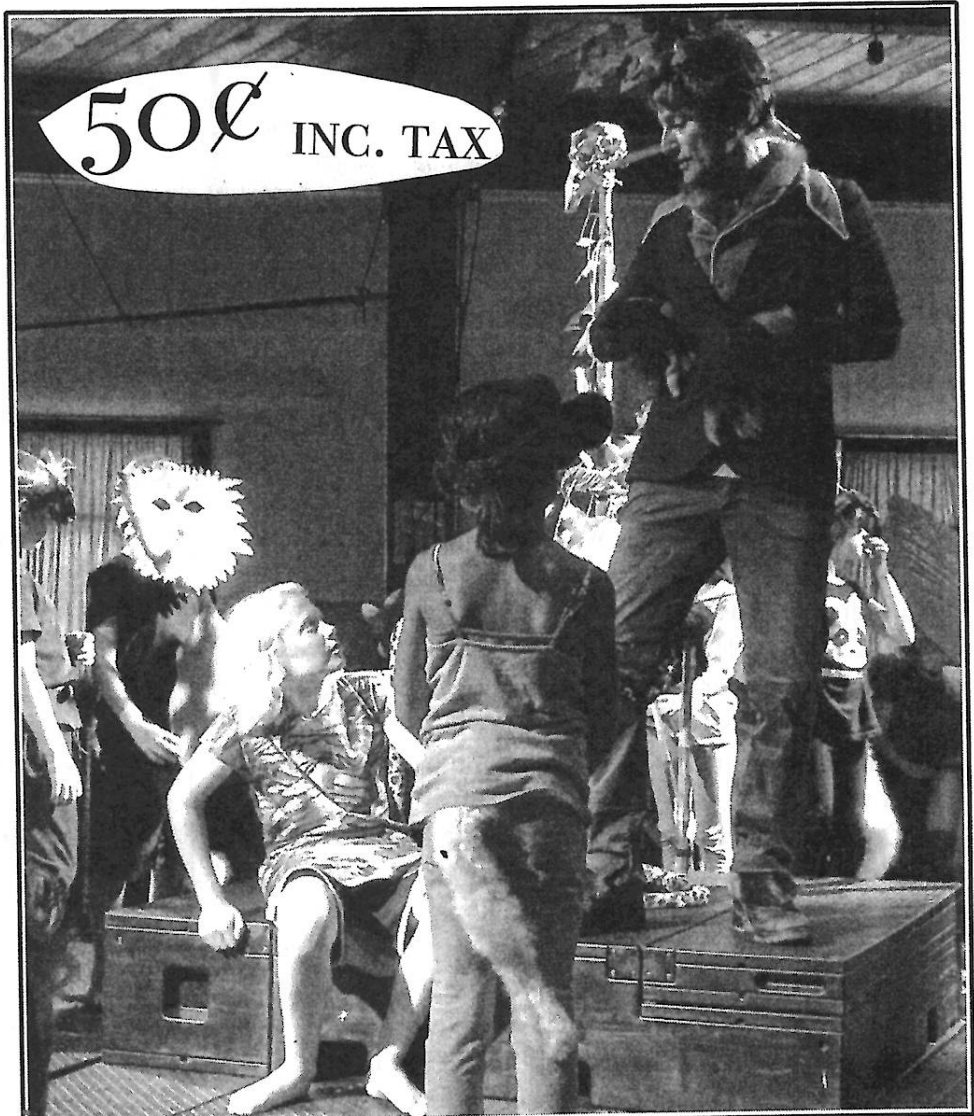

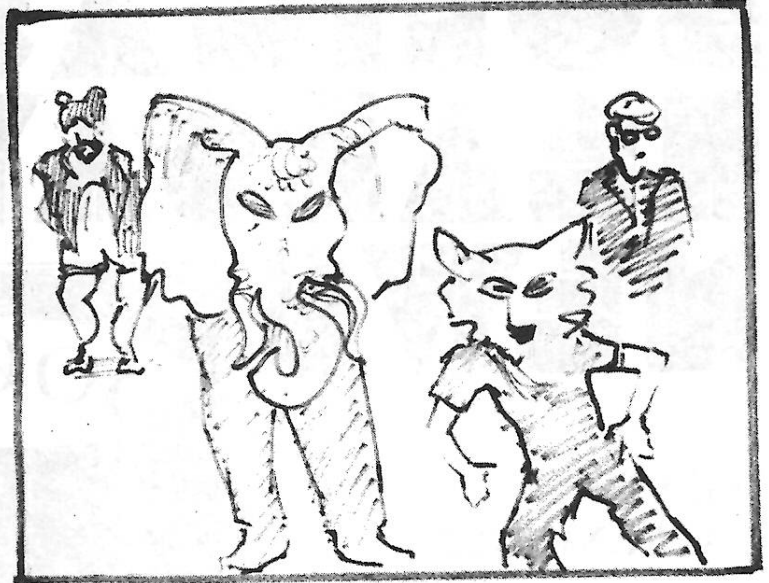

Feeling so dumb, and bum Bo bum bummed.

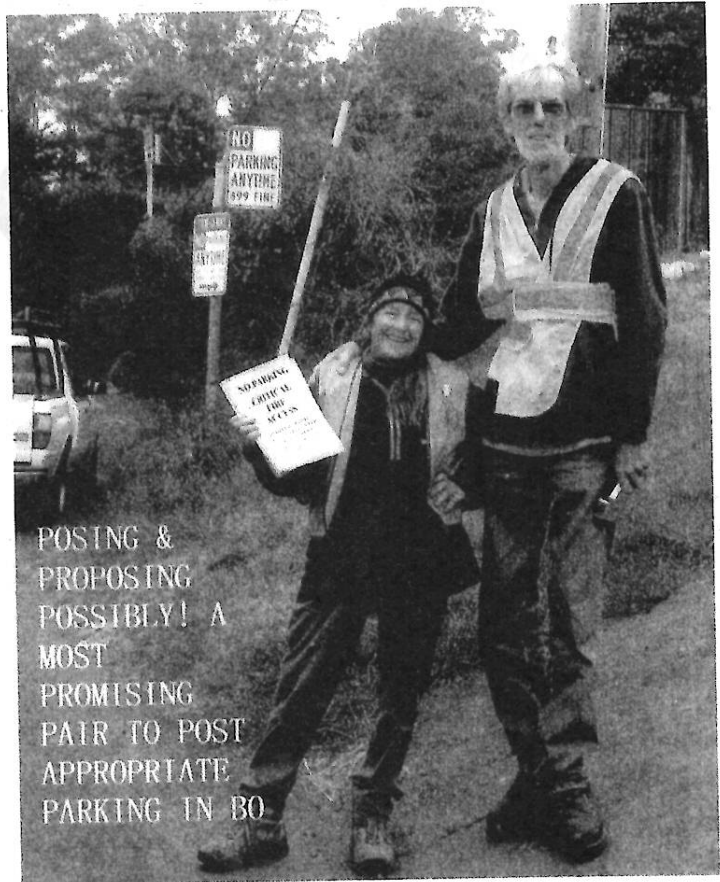
Clair lost a light green pottery bowl,



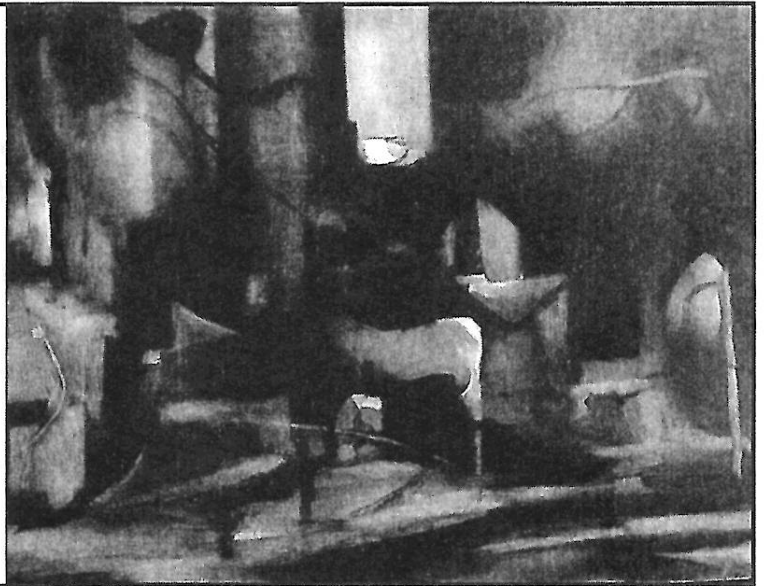

I AM AMAZED AND DISGUSTED

I read with great interest that mostly bogus article in the Pt. Reyes Light, about "low-income" housing bordering the necessary ditch (created wetland) on the edge of the Sewer off Overlook.

-That ditch was not mowed in the 40 years I lived next to it. It was much too steep, and most years way too full of water.

-We won 6 lawsuits, finally, due to a Special Magistrate's 40+ findings of limitation, including water, sewer, septic, small roads, parking, etc.

-I object to people, especially a BCPUD Director calling themselves "long time locals" when they have no clue of the intense battles we fought and won, that one at the expense of the real "long time locals".

-Those battles also include the "move the school" scam.

-Recently we voted against a \$9 million proposal at the school, promoted by Arriane Dar.

-There have been great possibilities from existing housing that the Land Trust did not bother to pursue. Apparently there is more personal possibilities in new construction (\$).

-There is much limitation in water, including under the expanded water use permit, and the new Septic systems that stop with electric..

-During the drought we had 7 days of water left (with Warren Weber graciously allowing us to use his water.) I had goats and chickens and food garden and was panicking. There were signs on the Freeway to PRAY FOR WATER. The Native Americans at Shasta were doing rain dance and all of a sudden it was over.

-The newbees have no clue, have done no research, and they are not working for us or the Plan-During the Forced Rationing it was not easy for us. Someone with a well, or with no garden, or with only two people, might not know, but should not spin bologna. -They have no right to increase our Carbon Footprint in this precious land. And, with few jobs who can afford to own houses.

-The School majorly violated the The CA Brown Act and when talking about Public Monies the Land Trust needs to wise up.

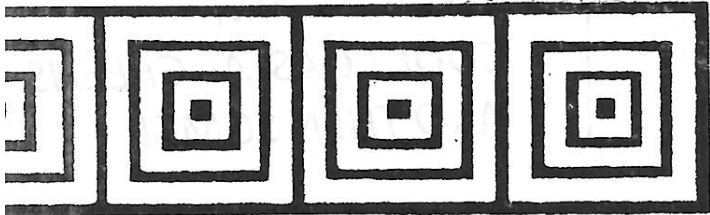

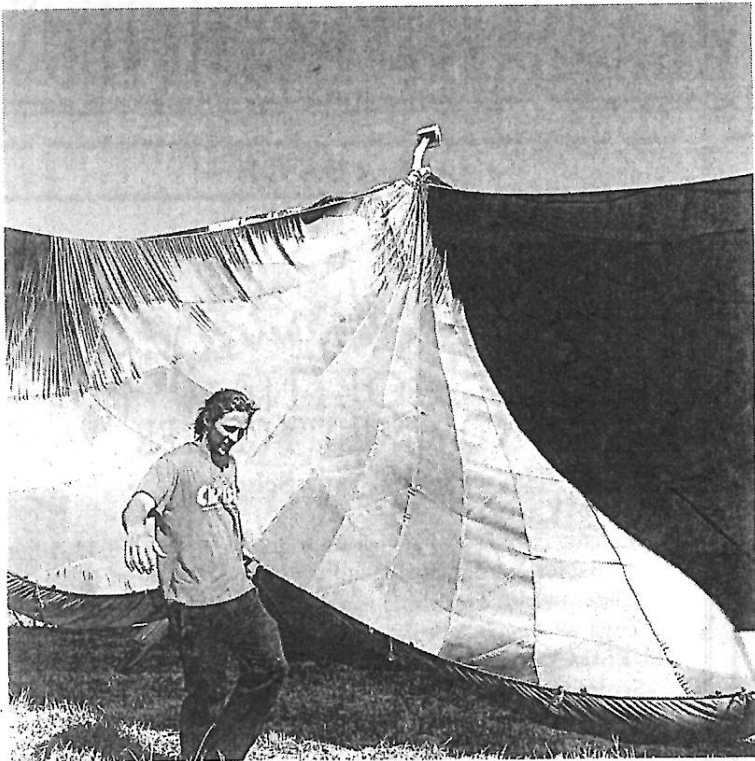
GEORGE WINSTON PERFORMS IN SOLO PIANO CONCERT AT THE DANCE PALACE

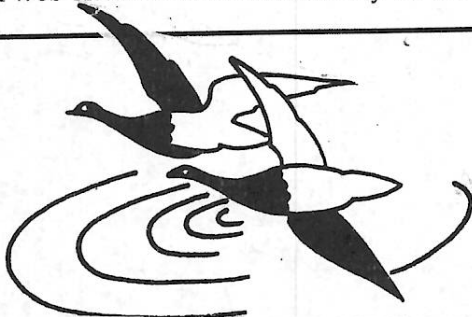

BOLINAS: At 11:47 a.m. several men were standing in the middle of Wharf Road, preventing motorists from passing.
