

Hill for his positive, generous, and wonderfully-written account in Monday's Hearsay News of the recent good-bye party for a favorite but reassigned sheriff which took place recently in the new park. A couple of corrections of fact: 1) the donor of the park is not *David* Moritz, but Michael Moritz and Michael's wife Harriet Heyman, and 2) StuArt was not *solely* responsible for the wonderful mural on the side of the store referenced in D. Hill's review. When I called Harriet Kossman for clarification, having rememberd her as the main organizer of the painting of the store's wall, she sent me a photograph (inset above) from Art Rogers' Point Reyes Family Album printed in the Pt. Reyes Light on October 22, 1998, which reads: "THE BOLINAS COMMUNITY MURAL PROJECT. The store owners donated the wall, the Marin Arts Council gave a grant, locals donated money, and everyone else donated their art and expertise. Sitting from left: Greg Hewlett, artist; StuArt, artist; Vickisa Feinberg, artist; Kathleen O'Neill, artist; Schehera Van Dyke, artist. Standing from left: Bob Demmerle, planning committee; Arthur Okamura, artist; Sandy Dierkes, artist; Harriet Kossman, project director; Martha Wax, planning committee; Charlie Docherty, artist; Kathy Sparling, artist; and Zim Caroselli, planning committee."

Harriet Kossman then sent me this email: "So here's the roster: from left to right across top first: Ocean scene, Arthur Okamura; Mola Turtle Design, Sandy Dierks; Miwok Indian Family, Dennis Dierks; Mandal Design, Charlie Docherty; Angel Wings, Kathy Sparling;...now bottom row, left to right, Tarantino's, Greg Hewlett; Bolinas Border Patrol, STUART, Lagoon Scene, Josh Churchman; Cypress, Kathleen O'Neill; Mermaid, Schehera VanDyke;;;;; The end coach going over the hill with Samira and John and Harriet was painted by Vickisa, Dennis Dierks, Harriet Kossman, Charlie Docherty.....We all painted the flowers on the fence. Harriet Kossman was Project Director; Zim Caroselli, Martha Wax, and Bob Demmerle were on the planning committee. John and Samira, the store owners donated the wall, The Marin Arts Council gave a grant, locals donated money and expertise. It was a blast! 



### Process and Timeline for Principal Selection at Bolinas-Stinson Union School District

The Bolinas Stinson Union School District Board of Trustees has authorized Superintendent Larry Enos to work with the Marin County Office of Education in selecting a new principal for the school. The following outlines the process and timeline that will be followed.

**July 10, 2012** Position announced and posted through Ed Join, ACSA, MCOE Job Hotline, other local outlets.

July 11, 2012 Screening/Interviewing Committee selected which includes 2 parents/community members, 2 classified employees, 1, confidential employee, 3 teachers (RSP plus 2 others), 2 board members, superintendent. Superintendent chairs committee.

July 23, 2012 Members of

Screening/Interviewing Committee receive link and instructions for accessing application packets from Ed Join. Screening and ranking of applications is completed electronically and begins for committee members upon submission of confidentiality statement.

**July 24, 2012** Deadline for interested individuals to submit application online via Ed Join. Only online applications will be accepted.

July 24-29, 2012 Committee members complete screening and ranking of applicants. Deadline for all committee members to complete screening is 6PM, July 29, 2012.

**August 1-6, 2012** Top five candidates identified based upon paper screening rankings. Reference checks conducted.

**August 6, 2012** Screening interview committee meets to discuss protocol, 9AM review schedule and refine questions for interviews.

August 7, 2012 Committee interviews and deliberation 8AM-4PM

**August 7, 2012** Special Meeting of the Board to conduct final interview and 5PM approve contract of employment.



MESA PARK BOARD MEETING MONDAY, JUNE 11, 2012 AT THE FIREHOUSE @ 7pm

Gade, Jenny Pfeiffer Call to Order: 7:09 PM

COMMUNITY EXPRESSION: Jenny reported that the school board is considering placing a bond for \$9.5 million on the ballot to build a new gym. Geoff commented that there had been plans years ago to build a gym at Mesa Park, and asked if the school bond funding could be used there since it's part of the Joint Powers agreement, and that perhaps Mesa Park would be a more appropriate location. Jenny reported that she raises the issue of location each month at the school board meetings.

DOWNTOWN PARK: Roger reported that the goal is to have the bathrooms open for the 4th of July. Sod and pathways are down & walkable; most of big planting is in. Underground irrigation is installed and the drip irrigation is going in. This Saturday there's a community planting opportunity to plant a tree or other plant in the park. The park won't be done by 7/4, but the bathrooms will be useable, and the labyrinth is walkable now. Discussion ensued concerning signage and clean-up of the park. Jack Siedman suggested that the job of clean-up of the tennis courts and accompanying bathrooms be removed from the county and done locally. Roger said that the conservation corps takes away the recyclables. The systems are already in place. Roger reported that they'll have a year to work out the kinks, but have a proposed budget of \$18,720. Suki offered to provide quality control, and suggested that there be a job description. [Geoff] There'd be no responsibility for upkeep of the actual tennis courts, right? The county pays for water, sewage, resurfacing, etc. [Suki] sounds like there needs to be a job description for such a hiring. Discussion ensued about insurance, concerning potential work hours, and which areas would be included in the job.

MAINTENANCE REPORT: Suki reported that the helmets in the storage unit were full of rats' nests. The old tractor needs fixing or junking. Does the board want to get rid of it? It's a small John Deer good for hauling a trailer. Jack suggested calling Rovann to discuss the issue with him. Suki mentioned Park usage: would it be good to have a hand-out about how much the park is used and what for and who to contact for usage. Geoff stated that the board does not want to be responsible for someone to police the use of the park unless there's a real problem of overuse. Jane will collect data and put together a draft for a brochure. Suki has submitted work hours for April and May and has warrants for repair parts.

POOL PROJECT: Anna reported that Alethea suggests having a survey of Mesa Park done to have an up-to-date concept. That will help site a swimming pool. The pool committee is about ready to send out the survey to the towns to see if it's possible to double the number of folks who have said they'd be members, to maintain the pool. If yes, then they begin the capital campaign. Jane reported that she and Anna would be setting up a meeting with Christine Cunha to determine what her role will be as financial liaison between the pool committee and the MP board.

IRRIGATION PROJECT: Bryan reported that he has spoken with Mary Baum concerning the grant and she assured that she would get the paperwork to Jennifer this week. It shouldn't be a problem to amend the grant, so we should know very soon. He also talked with Reid Thaler, who will apply the CDBG funds toward the permit costs. That can be accessed as soon as it's a go. The whole sum of paying for the major element, the lift station, is attributable to the matching grant. The pump needs up-grading and is included in the plans.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Some funding raised from sale of the water meter was proposed to be set aside for future maintenance. Patricia suggested that someone on the board needs to go over the MP insurance policy again to see how the DT park will fit into the picture. Bryan offered to look it over. Patricia said that the DT park has already been added to the insurance coverage. She reported on warrants to be paid and also suggested budgeting for audits.

Jane moved to approve warrants. Bryan seconded. All aye.

Patricia described her proposed Budget for the next fiscal year, including additional electric utilities, estimated water usage for Down Town park (approx. \$2200 per year for irrigation & bathrooms.) For the DT park, the county offered to pay \$3500 if we'd take over the responsibility for cleaning the tennis court restrooms. The board expressed concern that this wasn't enough. The board would need to approve a budget and recommend that it be in order to presented at the next board meeting. Vic suggested adding in administrative costs. Bryan said the budget only needs oversight expenses added to it. Patricia said we need to come up with an administrative fee and also have to change Suki's title to "general manager". Suki proposed that four more work hours a month should cover the extra work.

Approval of Operating Budget: 2012-2013 budget: Motion to approve with changes made (increase accounting/administrative services; \$1600 for Mesa Park upcoming costs,) Bryan moved, Patricia 2nd, all aye.

### OTHER

a) District Manager for the Mesa Park board (representative from county council): Jack reported that this is not necessary for our district.

b) Resolution to place parcel tax measure on November ballot: Jack reminded the board that it must include amount you're seeking, and should formalized before the next meeting. Jane will write a draft of the resolution and present it to the board at the next meeting for additions or edits.

The Statement of Facts form with the names, etc. of current board members and their terms of office must be filed at the county by June 9. Jane will send in the data to the election office.

Approve Minutes of Last Meeting: with minor edits; Bryan moves, Pat 2nd, all aye.

Approve Warrants: Approved above Schedule Next Meeting: July 16, 2012


