Radio Interview with
Leslie Acoca Goodchild
On Original Minds, KWMR 89.9
Saturday, July 29 ~ 9AM

Former Bolinas resident, Leslie Acoca Goodchild is
internationally recognized for her work on behalf of
women, including receiving a Hero of Compassion
award from the Dalai Lama.

Leslie came to Bolinas in the 1970s as a young Yale
graduate with her then husband Michael Lerner and
was instrumental in the founding of Full Circle School
and Commonweal. Her career included Director of the
Women and Girls Institute at the National Council on
Crime and Delinquency (NCCD), and Director of the
National Girls Health Screen Project. Leslie's goal has
been to identify the factors leading girls and women to
get arrested and incarcerated at twice the rate of boys
and men. To research the issue she interviewed over
3,200 incarcerated girls and women. As founder and
executive director of Health and Justice for Girls she
brought health services to incarcerated girls and
created a program that has now been adopted in Los
Angeles County, with planned expansion across
California and nationwide.

While in Bolinas, she married Jon Goodchild, the
seminal art director for London's Oz magazine and San
Francisco Rolling Stone magazine and co-curated the
exhibition of a selection of Goodchild's photo collection
of early rock and roll that is now featured at Bolinas
Museum. Join us for this wide ranging conversation that
will also include her international background and her
children.

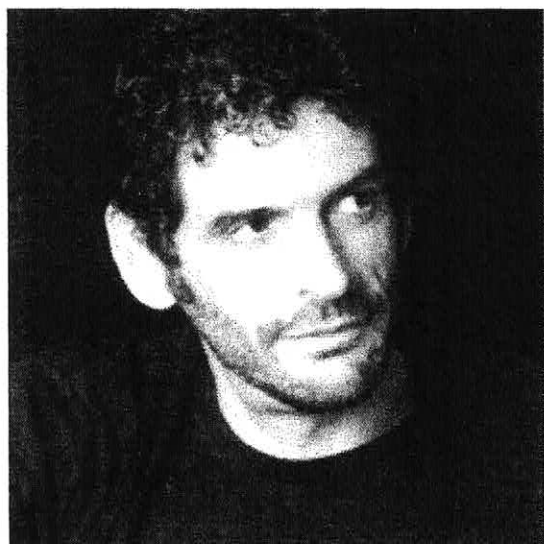

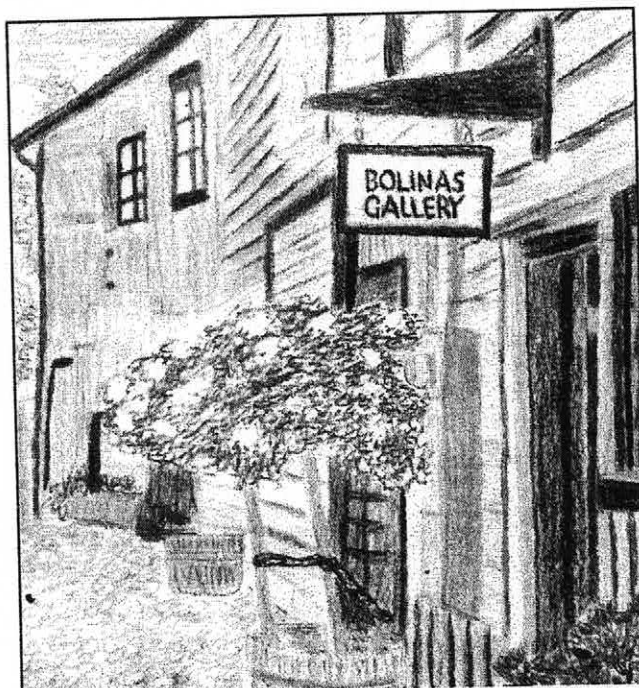

Bolinas Rod & Boat Club 53rd Annual Fishing Derby August 18, 19 & 20

The annual Rod & Boat Club fishing derby starts Friday morning, August 18 at 7:00am and runs through Sunday, August 20 at 3:00 pm. Eligible fish can be caught by boat or on the shore off Bolinas and Stinson Beach. If you know a boat owner, ask if you can join them; if you don't, come by the Rod & Boat Club at 83 Wharf Road during the Derby, and the Derby registration volunteers will try to get you on a boat. They will try especially hard to accommodate children registered by a parent/guardian.



The entry fee for the Derby is \$20 for adults, \$15 for teens 12-18, and \$10 for children under 12. The entry fee includes a free Derby tee shirt, fishing tackle, and entry into a raffle for baseball tickets and fishing rods and gear. You can register on the days of the event at the Rod & Boat Club. A trophy and fishing gear will be given for the heaviest fish overall and for the top three fish for women/girls in three age categories and for men/boys in three age categories. Twenty five "Nice Fish" awards will be given at the weigh-in to the 3-8 year old participants who reel in a fish of any size. The other awards will be given out at the Award Ceremony at 3:30pm on Sunday, August 14; and the Raffle will follow at about 4:00pm.

This year the raffle includes a first prize of a 12 person Suite at the Oakland Athletics baseball game against the Texas Rangers at 1:05 PM, August 27th, 2017. The Suite is next to A's Owners Suite and comes with two reserved parking spaces. The second and third prize is a rod and reel set valued at \$150. Each Derby registrant, volunteer and sponsor is being given a ticket for the raffle. In addition tickets are being sold for \$5 each (10 for \$40) and will be available at the Rod & Boat Club registration desk during the Derby.

The Derby this year is being sponsored by 46 club members and Bolinas/Stinson businesses. Donations from the sponsors and raffle tickets go toward the purchase of Derby trophies and fishing gear.

Salmon, halibut, lingcod and rock cod are being caught in good numbers this season, so it should be a good 53rd Annual Rod & Boat Club Fishing Derby. Please Join us!!

Minutes from the June 26, 2017, Bolinas Fire Protection District Board Meeting

Pres. Bass called the regular meeting of the Bolinas Fire Protection District to order at 7:00PM. Dir. Kimball, Dir. Shaw and Dir. Chiera were present. Dir. Gade was absent. Also present: Chief Brown. MSC Shaw/Chiera (unan.) to approve the agenda.

CHIEF'S REPORT
NERA

The next NERA meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, June 28th. Currently, operations have been working on surveying each jurisdiction for current radio equipment that will be replaced. We intend on replacing our equipment on a one to one basis without any offered upgrades. It is still expected that the cost of all replaced equipment will be covered by NERA.

Prevention

Marin County Fire Inspectors will be providing 4291, Structure Defensible Space, inspection services for Bolinas in the coming month. They will visit residences, speak with residents if they are home and only go onto private property if they are given permission. If a resident is not home, they will conduct an inspection as best they can from the road and leave information at the home.

Training

Training will now be focusing on the approach of wild land fire season. This past Saturday, Asst. Chief Marcotte led training on vehicle extrication.

He brings a wide skill set including experience with the Coast Guard Auxiliary, large vehicle and heavy equipment operation as well as currently being employed as the Athletic Director for the Novato USD. He is very interested in volunteering and our Resident Firefighter program.

Disaster Council

All has been quiet. We have helped a few Area Coordinators identify new Neighborhood Liaisons. We have been spending time ensuring everyone has the proper training and the supplies they need to support their positions. The radio drill is still on hold due to the current state of the Muir Beach Repeater. Steve, Ian, Cadance and Chief Brown will be meeting one last time to tie up any open issues with the restructuring of our DOC deployment. This will be followed up with a small scale practice deployment by "non-trained" people.

Building and Grounds

Update provided under Board Committee Reports.

General Operations/Administration

The above ground fuel tank successfully passed its annual ST-38 Leak test. BAAQMD has been notified of the test as well as the repairs made to the gasoline pump hose. Procedures have been put in place so any damage or problems with the facility are reported immediately the annual leak test is conducted in a timely manner each year. We received an advance copy of an updated report from the Marin County Civil Grand Jury: Web Transparency Report Card Update. The original report was received by the district in March of 2016. The report emphasized the need for public agencies to provide as much information as possible on their websites making it easier for residents to see where their tax dollars are spent. At the time, the BFPD website received an overall grade of F. This report was the impetus for us to completely rebuild the website, adding the majority of the information recommended by the grand jury. The recently received update gave the BFPD website a grade of D. After speaking with the foreman, Chief Brown added additional information to the website

including the procedures for running for a Board seat, a copy of the FY2016 audit, an explanation for the absence of contracts and what information will be available if one is issued. More information will still need to be added such as how to request public records, more detail on the fire districts revenue sources and copies of each Directors Ethics Training Certificates. With the 4th of July fast approaching, at the Lion's Club President's request, there was a meeting the morning of June 22nd with representatives of the Sheriff's Office, CHP, National Park Service, Mesa Park and Downtown Businesses to discuss the days plans and events. As with prior years, vehicle access will be extremely limited to nonexistent in the downtown area most of the day. There will be no extra presence of CHP or MCSO except by MCSO in the evening; they are assigning four deputies to the Bolinas area. Chief Brown also attended the Lion's Club general meeting that evening to speak to the importance of their volunteer roles at the traffic control points and parking lot. The fire station will be staffing up as much as possible in anticipation of the day.

Surfers' Overlook Repair/Terrace Avenue

Due to scheduling issues, the meeting scheduled with Chief Brown, Jennifer Blackman, and Larry Kennings had to be postponed. They are currently working on the new date.

Personnel

A total of six applications for the positions of Seasonal and Resident Firefighter were received. Capt. Krakauer and Chief Brown have been conducting interviews for the past several weeks with the last one this Thursday June 29th. Two young men have started the Resident Firefighter program. Both come with fire service education and experience on the Marin County Search and Rescue Team. There are four applications for the two seasonal positions that are still open. Once the final interview is completed this week, the best fit for the position will be decided. Three of the applicants have little to no experience but they do have the educational requirements. One applicant has the experience hoped for. Chris Deibel is now the new Monday Firefighter II.

GENERAL BUSINESS

Action Item #1- Public Hearing: Draft Budget FY 2017-2018

The Draft Budget was submitted for public review the week of June 12th and received no reviews or feedback. No changes were made to the budget since adoption of the draft at the May meeting. MSC- Kimball/ Chiera (unan.) to finalize and accept the Budget FY2017-2018.

Action Item #2- Consider California's Special Districts Assoc. Membership

After discussion from the Board it was decided the benefits are not substantial enough to warrant the annual cost of \$1,600 to maintain membership with the CSDA. MSC- Chiera/Shaw (unan.) to not become members of the California's Special Districts Association.

Action Item #3- Consider Draft Chief's Position Job Announcement

A two page job announcement for the Fire Chief's position has been put together by Chief Brown and the Personnel Committee. Board members agreed the draft was well put together. Work will continue with a meeting of a representative from the Finance Committee and the Personnel Committee with Chief Brown to discuss the salary range for the position. Dir. Kimball, Finance and Pres. Bass, Personnel will meet with Chief Brown. No action was taken on this item.

Action Item #4- Consider Doran and Assoc. Engagement Letter for Audit Services FYE June 30th 2017

The engagement letter submitted by Doran and Assoc. to provide audit services for the district was reviewed. It was noted that the proposed cost of the services was increased by 3% over last year's cost. MSC- Kimball/ Chiera (unan.) to accept Doran and Assoc. proposal for audit services FYE June 30th, 2017.

Action Item #5- Consider Establishing Fire Cadet Program

Asst. Chief Marcotte provided a memo for board members to review regarding the desire to start a Fire Cadet program. A growing number of Bolinas youth have showed interest in being part of the volunteer fire department with four or five recently spending more time at the station including volunteering to help at the annual pancake breakfast. Asst. Chief Marcotte's memo stated in part, "The program would primarily be a training program. The cadet's would attend all the regular training drills. At no time would a cadet be allowed to respond to an actual emergency. Each cadet would be given extensive didactic "book" knowledge on the aspects of being a firefighter. Only after they have demonstrated an understanding of the individual topics would the cadets be allowed to perform physical evolutions." This method of providing a Fire Cadet program has been approved by the district's workers' compensation

insurance carrier. Still to be worked out will be the qualifying requirements for program. The program would likely be limited to five or six cadets. Asst Chief marcotte understands the added responsibility running a program such as this and is prepared to take on the added work. MSC- Kimball/ Chiera (unan.) To begin establishing Fire Cadet Program under the guidance of Chief Brown and Asst. Chief Marcotte.

Updates from Finance and Budget, Personnel, Building and Grounds and Operations Working Group--
Met on June 1, 2017 to discuss Volunteer Firefighter Recruitment. Discussion focused on current number of active volunteers, how to increase that number and what the most important qualities are in a volunteer. Maturity, honesty and integrity were top. It was agreed housing/demographics has had a negative impact on our ability to recruit and retain volunteers. Discussion was had regarding mass advertisement for recruiting vs "precise" recruiting of individuals. Each member of the committee will forward a two to three sentences about what they think a recruitment advertisement should say
Finance and Budget Committee-
The Finance and Budget Committee will now begin working on scoping and planning since the budget has been finished.
The Personnel Committee-
The Personnel Committee's main focus has been on putting together the announcement for the Chief's position. There will be continued work on the personnel manual as well.
Buildings and Grounds-
The Buildings and Grounds Committee will be reviewing the memo from Jeff McPhail who graciously met with Chief Brown to inspect the fire house and clinic buildings. The B&G Committee will be determining how to proceed with any maintenance and funding needs.
