NATURALIZATION

From local denizen to U.S. citizen

A citizen of Bolinas for 12 years, French native Emmeline Louise Craig is now a citizen of the United States. Landscapes by Emmeline – she is an established artist under her first name – hang in homes and galleries across the country, in Asia, in Europe and in New Zealand. She became a naturalized citizen July 25 at a ceremony held at the Paramount Theatre of the Arts in Oakland.

“This is the beginning of a new chapter in my life,” Emmeline said after the ceremony. “I live here, have a business here, pay taxes here. I have a bank account, a house and lots of friends. At the ceremony, I became an insider. As a citizen, now I feel everything is in alignment.”

Emmeline, who had considered becoming a citizen for some time, took the oath, sang the national anthem and pledged allegiance to the flag with some 1,200 individuals from 107 countries.

“We were seated in the auditorium, with the officials on stage in front of us. Friends and family were in the balcony. After we were greeted in several languages, we were asked to stand when the name of our country was called. We saw a video from the President, congratulating all of us. Then the naturalization certificates were brought out,” Emmeline said. “I am glad I did it. It was time.”

Born in 1958 in the north of France, Em-

meline moved to Provence when she was 2. Travel has always been a passion, and as an adult, Emmeline has journeyed to India, Nepal, Italy, New Zealand, Costa Rica and Sri Lanka. In 2000, Emmeline visited a friend in Bolinas, intending to stay for seven weeks.

“I’m still here,” Emmeline said, laughing. “A serene landscape is something I appreciate wherever I am.”

Emmeline has shown and sold her work since 1990. She paints with oils and watercolors. “Sometimes my work represents Bolinas Lagoon or another body of water that is magical, but usually I take the land-

scape and twist it slightly, introduce something that creates a mood, gives a sensation of familiarity or else a flavor of the surreal,” Emmeline said.

Currently, Emmeline has an on-going show at the Coast Café in Bolinas and at the Wells Fargo Bank in Point Reyes Station. For the sixth year, she will take part in the Tiburon Art Festival, which runs from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m. August 25-26 in downtown Tiburon. Emmeline’s art is always on display at her studio at 6 Wharf Road in Bolinas, where currently she is working on several large canvases. Emmeline welcomes visitors from noon to 5 p.m. Friday through Monday, and private appointments are available.

Emmeline paints in small, medium, large and extra large. Her works range from 2 by 3 inches to 5 by 4 feet. Original works range from \$95 to \$25,000. Archival giclee ((CQ)) print copies also are available, “permitting anyone to afford a favorite piece.” To see examples of her work, go to www.emmelineEmmeline.com – but Emmeline says to visit again about a month from now. “My re-invented website is coming soon, and it will display my work even better,” she said.

Many of Emmeline’s paintings feature a lantern, an animal or a chair. “That adds something that brings you home, that evokes feelings of comfort, safety, a place of belonging,” she said. “These paintings make you long for the lost art of yourself, make you want to recuperate, heal or reunite with yourself. I’ve been told repeatedly that these paintings bring about feelings of peace.”

Peace is in short supply in many corners of the world, Emmeline noted. She is adamant that the world needs to stop focusing on negativity, bad news and negative images. “We have the capacity for bliss, for well being, for gratitude and for harmony,” she said, “and I want my work to trigger that.”

In an ideal world, Emmeline would display her work in retreat centers, medical treatment rooms, hospitals, mental health care facilities and busy office lobbies – anywhere that people need to be soothed, reassured, comforted. “I believe in our natural blueprint there is bliss, a learning to ‘be’ instead of always ‘do.’ We have to stop and admire, appreciate and feel,” she said.

Over the past few months, while preparing to become a U.S. citizen, Emmeline started making other plans for her future as well. She hopes to find a publisher for some of her images. She hopes to attract more art consultants as clients. And one thing more: “My big dream for next year is to have a small gallery in West Marin, somewhere large enough to display my work and that of others in a peaceful place, a place where visitors can relax and fully appreciate the art,” Emmeline said.

“I’m working on it!”

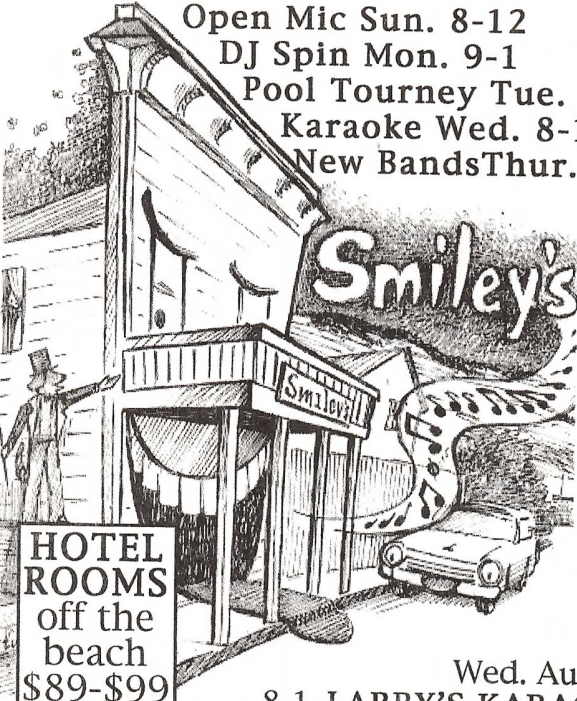

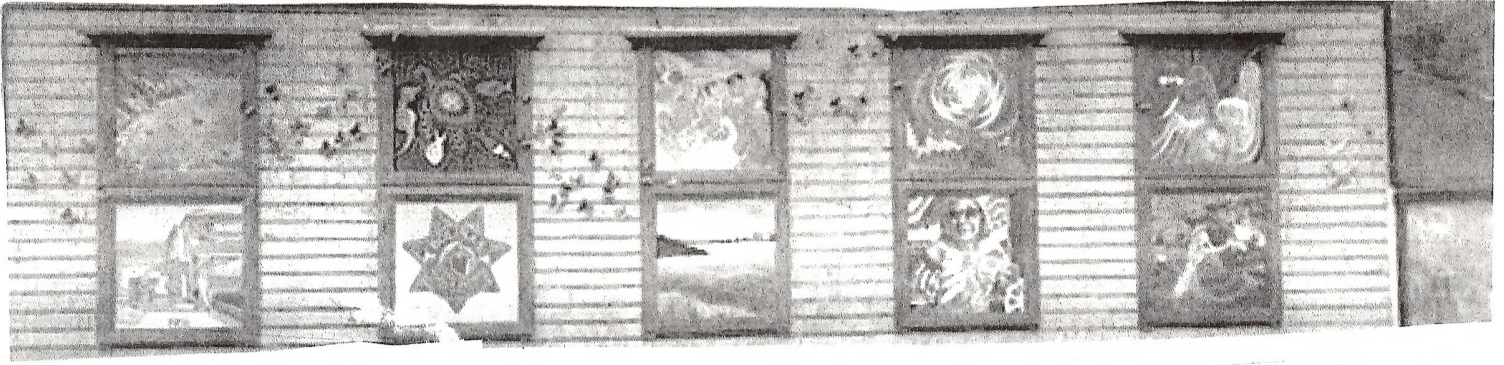

The Belated Bolinas Store Mural Report

Don't be alarmed when you look at the Bolinas Store wall!

Can you believe that the old mural on the side of the Bolinas Store was completed 14 years ago? It's hard for me to think that all that time has passed since we worked on the wall. It was a wonderful collaborative effort by many.

While working with members of the Downtown Park Design Committee (and spending a lot of time looking at the park site and the wall), it was apparent to all that the mural really needed some attention.

Since I had been Project Director of the last two mural painting projects on that wall, I took on the daunting task of organizing the refurbishing of the old wall. Hopefully, it will be completed before the ribbon cutting ceremony and official dedication of the park on Labor Day. I know it will be kind of a miracle but I think we can do it.

The plan is to take down the paintings, butterflies and fence; resurface the wall; re-paint the wall and the picture frames; seal the paintings; resurface the end painting; re-paint the stagecoach and Mt. Tam. After an initial meeting with Bob Demmerle, StuArt, Ron Brown, Jim Vest, and myself, and discussions with John and Samira, we came up with the action plan.

Ron and Todd have already taken down the paintings, Jim Vest's amazing crew have already started prepping the wall and will re-paint it soon. We hope for a butterfly painting party in the near future.

So, this is **VERY** exciting! With luck, we'll meet the deadline we have set for ourselves. Thank you, in advance.

Michael was a composer, recording artist, and natural teacher who had the gift of inspiring his students to believe in themselves. He

Michael was born in Rifle, Colorado, on October 4, 1954, to Dr. Robert Knapp and Joan Knapp. The family moved to Boulder, Colorado, in 1963. Michael graduated from Boulder High School and earned a Bachelor's degree in Music Education from the University of Colorado. He moved to San Francisco and earned a Master's degree in Cello Performance from San Francisco State University and a Master's degree in Composition from Mills College in Berkeley, California. In 1992, he married Silvia Nakkach, an internationally known musician, music therapist, author, and a teacher of the effects of sound on consciousness and health.

taught cello at the Community Music Center in San Francisco for twenty years. He also played piano for Music Makers, a program to initiate young children in the magic of music participation. He loved the children.

Michael was an intelligent, positive, and generous man who could see admirable qualities in everyone he met. He made others feel intelligent and positive.

Michael played cello and string bass in many orchestras and ensembles in the San Francisco Bay area. He was a consummate musician who could pick up an instrument and play any type of music, from Beethoven to jazz and Indian ragas. He was an accomplished accompanist, and his solo cello improvisations were creative and highly technical. He delighted his fellow musicians with his skill, his positive attitude, and his wonderful sense of humor.

He is survived by his wife, Silvia Nakkach Knapp, of Emeryville, California; his mother, Dr. Joan Knapp, of Boulder, Colorado; his sister, Linda MacDougall, and her husband, Scott MacDougall, of Clovis, California; and two brothers: Robert Knapp and his wife, Dr. Patricia Knapp, of Falmouth, Massachusetts, and Ted Knapp and his wife, Karla, of Castle Pines, Colorado.
