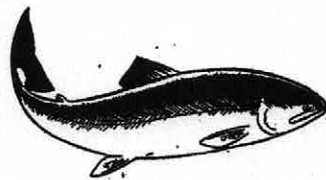

This Happening is called **The Panoramic Sea Happening**. It will soon happen on Brighton Beach in the village of Bolinas six miles from Stinson Beach and twenty four miles from San Francisco. The included sector of the beach is about 550 yards long the presence of the sea should impose itself by motion, rhythm and sound texture within human perceptual capacity.

THE RAFT OF MEDUSA (cont'd)

The Year 1987

I have chanced upon the above note already after the Sea Happening in which the raft of Medusa was an important highlight. The exceptional coincidence of ideas corroborated the validity of my choice of the theme.

With his Raft of Medusa Géricault initiated a sort of press-news accident report, but it was his method of working that turned out to be the most interesting. His passion was most powerfully discharged during the preparatory phase of collecting and investigating of data and evidence, of discovering the past as passionately as a full blood detective.

Now:

A long table covered with a white cloth is set on the beach. On the table there are handy loudspeakers, reproductions of Géricault's Raft of Medusa, papers, pointed pencils. At the table all the jury members are sitting being renowned and recognized critics. The President of the jury announces the solemn opening of its workings.

"The reconstruction of the Raft of Medusa now about to start is not intended to be a faithful and lifeless copy of the romantic master piece. We encourage everybody to use any and all objects produced by the modern tourist industry: rubber mattresses in most gaudy colors, rescue wheels, bikini bathing suits, frotté towels, nylon ware, plastics, transistor radios etc. Of course this by no means permits anyone to give up the truth of his motions, gestures and inner experience. We invite everybody to participate".

To make the general participation in the creative process at all possible, as well as to bring about the feeling of group responsibility, a number of reproductions of a work by Jean Louis André Théodore Géricault "The Raft of Medusa" had been printed and distributed among the crowd, so that the events can be calmly followed, improved upon or even judged.

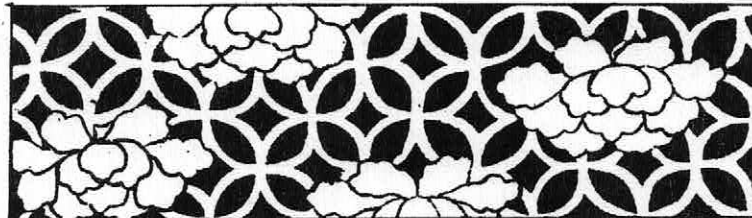

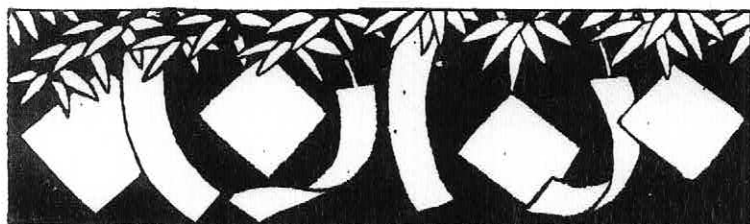

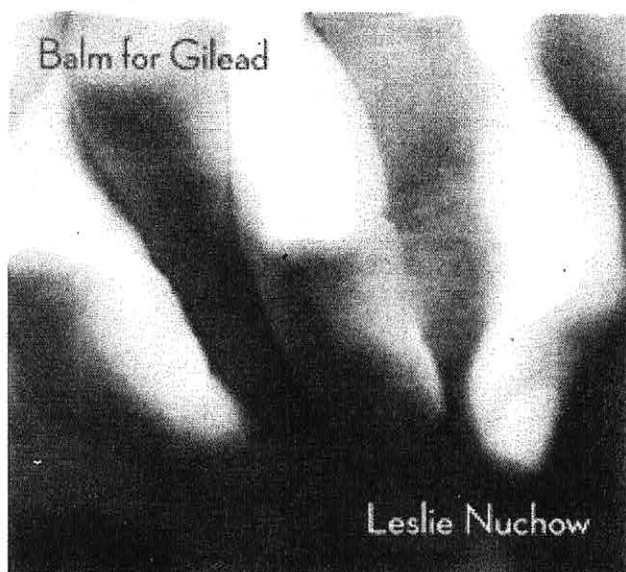

Bolinas Rod & Boat Club 53rd Annual Fishing Derby August 18, 19 & 20


The annual Rod & Boat Club fishing derby starts Friday morning, August 18 at 7:00am and runs through Sunday, August 20 at 3:00 pm. Eligible fish can be caught by boat or on the shore off Bolinas and Stinson Beach. If you know a boat owner, ask if you can join them; if you don't, come by the Rod & Boat Club at 83 Wharf Road during the Derby, and the Derby registration volunteers will try to get you on a boat. They will try especially hard to accommodate children registered by a parent/guardian.

The entry fee for the Derby is \$20 for adults, \$15 for teens 12-18, and \$10 for children under 12. The entry fee includes a free Derby tee shirt, fishing tackle, and entry into a raffle for baseball tickets and fishing rods and gear. You can register on the days of the event at the Rod & Boat Club. A trophy and fishing gear will be given for the heaviest fish overall and for the top three fish for women/girls in three age categories and for men/boys in three age categories. Twenty five "Nice Fish" awards will be given at the weigh-in to the 3-8 year old participants who reel in a fish of any size. The other awards will be given out at the Award Ceremony at 3:30pm on Sunday, August 14; and the Raffle will follow at about 4:00pm.

This year the raffle includes a first prize of a 12 person Suite at the Oakland Athletics baseball game against the Texas Rangers at 1:05 PM, , August 27th, 2017. The Suite is next to A's Owners Suite and comes with two reserved parking spaces. The second and third prize is a rod and reel set valued at \$150. Each Derby registrant, volunteer and sponsor is being given a ticket for the raffle. In addition tickets are being sold for \$5 each (10 for \$40) and will be available at the Rod & Boat Club registration desk during the Derby.

The Derby this year is being sponsored by 46 club members and Bolinas/Stinson businesses. Donations from the sponsors and raffle tickets go toward the purchase of Derby trophies and fishing gear.

Salmon, halibut, lingcod and rock cod are being caught in good numbers this season, so it should be a good 53rd Annual Rod & Boat Club Fishing Derby. Please Join us!!
