



The Bolinas Community Public Utility District is coordinating the receipt of bids from licensed, insured arborists for a public/private eucalyptus tree removal/trimming project in the Dogwood right-of-way (west side of the road) near the intersection with Mesa Road in Bolinas. The scope of work includes the removal of hazardous eucalyptus trees located in the public right-of-way and ranging in diameter from 6inches to 30-inches and ranging in height from approximately 60 to - 70 feet. In addition, the scope of work includes the removal of large branches overhanding the Dogwood road. There will be a mandatory pre-bid site meeting at the project site (Dogwood and Mesa Roads) on Wednesday, August 26th beginning at 10:00 a.m. The specific scope of work (and potential alternate scopes of work) will be discussed at the site meeting and questions will be answered at this meeting and/or subsequently to all attending arborists in writing. Arborists not attending the mandatory pre-bid site meeting are not eligible to bid on this project.



300 tons of radioactively contaminated water continue to pour daily into the Pacific from the triple meltdown at Fukushima. Formerly rich farms around the plant remain uninhabitable. What levels of oceanic contamination are detectible so far? Has it reached the West Coast? What are the effects on wild life in the contaminated areas?

Learn from two eminent scientists about their important efforts to track and document the on-going impacts of the nuclear disaster in Japan.

Ken Buesseler, Marine Biologist, Center for Marine and Environmental Radioactivity

Within months of the Fukushima disaster, Ken Buesseler assembled an international research cruise to sample the waters surrounding the nuclear plant. To date, important fisheries remain closed due to cesium levels above Japanese limits for seafood. Ocean currents are bringing the radioactive particles released from Fukushima to the West Coast. Buesseler now monitors over 50 sites along the West Coast, from Alaska to Mexico, with citizen-scientist funding and participation. Radioactive cesium from Fukushima was detected in ocean water samples in August 2014 off the coast of northern California and in April 2015, in Ucluelet B.C.

Tim Mousseau, Research Biologist, University of South Carolina, Columbia.

Professor Mousseau has studied the impacts of radioactive contaminants on biological communities in the Chernobyl region of Ukraine and Fukushima Prefecture, Japan. His research suggests that many species of birds, plants and animals have experienced direct toxicity from the Chernobyl and Fukushima disasters. This mutational load has had dramatic consequences for development, reproduction and survival, and the effects observed at individual and population levels are having significant impacts on these regions.



Minutes from the June 22, 2015 Bolinas Fire Protection District Board Meeting

Pres. Kimball called the regular meeting of the Bolinas Fire Protection District to order at 7:30PM. Vice Pres. Bass, Dir. Shaw, Dir. Chiera and Dir. Gade were present. Also present: Chief Brown and Secretary Brown.

Chief Brown added a discussion item regarding a request for an additional antenna by the State of California.

MSC Gade/Bass (unan) to approve the agenda as amended by Chief Brown.

CHIEF'S REPORT

MERA

Chief Brown reported that the next regular meeting is scheduled for June 24th. Agenda items will include the Next Generation Implementation Agreement between MERA and the County of Marin, the Next Generation Project Oversight Committee Report, and the Proposed Bay Hill Sublease Agreement.

The Next Gen Implementation Agreement is meant to provide more detail on the implementation of the new system and to clarify roles and responsibilities of MERA as the Project Owner and the COM as the Project Manager.

The Citizen Oversight Committee is now formed with representation from the five Supervisors areas. The Committee met for the first time and adopted their Bylaws and elected a Chair and Vice-Chair for the committee. The next meeting is scheduled for September 16th. The Proposed Bay Hill Sublease Agreement will address the new lease between MERA and Incline Partners due to the termination of Crown Castle's Sublease agreement with MERA at the

same site.

Chief Brown reported that the Bolinas Community Wildland Planning meeting is scheduled for tomorrow evening June 23rd at 6:30. A light dinner of soup, salad and bread made by Robin Algren will be served along with drinks. Discussion will focus on the potential for a wildland fire, what the State requires for defensible

space and why participating in Alert Marin is so important. There will be three guest speakers, MCFD BC Chris Martinelli, MCFD BC Christie Neal, and Tom Jordon of the Office of Emergency Services. Chief Brown hopes that there will be a large community presence. Chief Brown and Prevention Specialist Todd Lando discussed the effectiveness of holding Chipper Days. Usually, residents are encouraged to complete their defensible space requirements then the fire department will offer to chip vegetation left by the side of the road. In his work with other jurisdictions, he has found this to be fairly ineffective. Instead, he suggested the possibility of using the same grant money and offering residents the option of doing the work on their property. They will discuss this option further on July 1st when they meet again. Chief Brown met with OES Disaster Coordinator Tom Jordan to discuss the potential for pre designating geographic areas of Bolinas to be used in the event of a disaster and a telephone notification needs to be sent to residents. The system, known as TENs, is used to inform residents of disaster situations and possible evacuations. Notifications in an emergency would occur more rapidly if areas are pre-designated. Also noted is the importance for people to register their cell phone numbers with Alert Marin so they can receive messages as well. Chief Brown provided Tom with current area maps which he will begin working with. They plan to speak again next week.

Grants

Chief Brown will be meeting with Todd Lando on July 1st to discuss the Yucca Neighborhood Fuel Reduction Project. They plan to re-contact the residents in the area to meet again to review the project. 70% of the grant funds from the California Fire Safe Council have been received allowing for the project to move forward. Chief Brown mapped out critical access roads on the Mesa about five years ago, but stated that the map needs to be updated as vegetation changes over time. She will be contacting the National Park Service to ask them to conduct their annual mowing of the field adjacent to Poplar. The BCPUD usually mows the Poplar side of the road. Dir. Gade asked whether developed or undeveloped properties are a priority. Chief Brown answered that clearing defensible spaces around houses are a first priority, but undeveloped ones are of huge concern as well. Vice Pres. Bass mentioned the corner of Larch and Iris where there are piles of brush. Dir. Chiera remarked on the overgrowth around roadways and asked which agency is responsible for clearing brush along the madways. Chief Brown answered that the question has never been clearly resolved; typically neighborhoods will take responsibility for their roads, but if that does not happen, roads become extremely overgrown. She will be looking into using prevention monies from the District to mow some of the more critical roads. Dir. Shaw asked who was trimming the limbs along Mesa Road. Chief Brown answered that Marin County DPW is responsible for the good

Dir. Shaw asked who does welfare checks on individual residents in the community. Chief Brown said the Sheriff's office and the fire department both do welfare checks if requested..

Training

Wildland training continues on Thursday nights. PRNSS Chief Ranger David Schifsky, will be attending on July 16th as a guest speaker to review the after action report on the Arch Rock incident as well as Risk Assessment in similar incidents. Chief Brown provided a brief presentation on home and work disaster preparedness to approximately 140 employees at the Bear Valley Headquarters for the Point Reyes National Seashore, on June 17th.

Volunteers

Chief Brown announced that FF Jake Tacherra will be moving soon to Oklahoma with his family in mid July. He started as a volunteer with the District in 2000. He left for several years to join the Army, and then returned in 2008 as a Volunteer. In 2009, he began working at the station as a part time firefighter. Chief Brown noted that he is an excellent firefighter and will be missed. There is a dinner honoring Jake scheduled for July 9th. Dir Chiera suggested that the Board acknowledge him with an engraved plaque. Chief Brown offered to have one made for him to be presented at the dinner.

Apparatus

E265, Type 3 – Wildland engine, was serviced for an annual safety inspection with no negative findings.

Disaster Council

Chief Brown reported that Beth Carusillo attended the West Marin Disaster Council meeting on May 21st and gave a report on Bolinas Disaster Council activities. Other items discussed at the meeting were a recent Tsunami drill in Dillon Beach and disaster preparation work currently being done by the National Park Service.

Building and Grounds
No update.

General Operations/Administration Chief Brown thanked the Personnel and Finance Committees for all their excellent work in preparation of the FY 2015/2016 budget.

Surfers' Overlook Repair/Terrace Avenue

Chief Brown reported the Save Surfer's Overlook Committee is now waiting to hear back from County of Marin Engineer Earnest Klock regarding the Request for Proposal for the road level retaining wall repair on Terrace-Ave. at the overlook. He will also be drafting a simple Letter of Agreement between the Community Center and the County detailing the explicit use of the money by the County of Marin for the repair work. The BCC will act as the fiscal agent with non-profit status for the project and will only charge 3% for their services. Funds have been successfully raised for the road level work and 150 thank you letters have been completed and sent to all of the donors. Chief Brown thanked Ian Johnson for helping her utilize computer software for the letters and labels saving her many hours of labor, which she is volunteering to the project.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

GENERAL BUSINESS

Action Item #1: Consider final budget for FY15/16

Chief Brown announced that no changes were made to the preliminary budget since the June acceptance of the draft except for Bookkeeper Kaaren Gann's adjustment to the format of the document and reassigning account numbers. Sec. Brown will send the Board the updated version asap.

Pres. Kimball thanked Bookkeeper Kaaren Gann for her helpful changes to the budget format.

MSC, Chiera/Shaw (unan) to approve the final budget for FY15/16.

Action Item #2: Consider proposed Engagement Letter from Doran & Associates for FY14/15 Audit
Chief Brown reported that a valuation report from CalPERS is required for this year's audit. Sec. Brown has ordered the report at a cost of \$800. The Engagement Letter outlined an estimate cost of \$300 greater than last year's audit. Chief Brown recommended Doran & Associates and acceptance of their Engagement Letter.

MSC Gade/Bass (man) to accept

MSC, Gade/Bass (unan) to accept Engagement Letter from Doran & Associates for FY14/15 Audit.

Action Item #3: Consider Resolution #174-2015: A Resolution of the Board of Directors of the Bolinas Fire Protection District Determining the 2015-2016 Appropriations Limitations of Tax Proceeds

Sec. Brown explained that this annual resolution is determined by the percentage change in population in conjunction with the change in cost of living. A calculation factor is determined and then applied to the previous year tax proceed limitation. The calculation factor this year is 1.0479 x \$671,006.36(previous year tax proceed limitation) = \$703,141.27 for FY15/16.

MSC, Bass/Gade (unan) to accept Resolution # 174-2015.

Discussion Item #4: Chief Brown explained that since the agenda was written, the State of California has contacted her regarding a request to add an additional antenna to the station. There is an existing lease between the District and the State that has been in place since 1993 which allows the State to have a small antenna and radio equipment located at the fire house. They are now requesting to add another small antenna. An addition would require an amendment to the current lease. The Board asked if a permit from the County would also be required for the additional antennae. Chief Brown will inquire about the permit as well as detailed information about the request. The discussion will continue on the next agenda at the next regular Board meeting.

CONSENT CALENDAR
