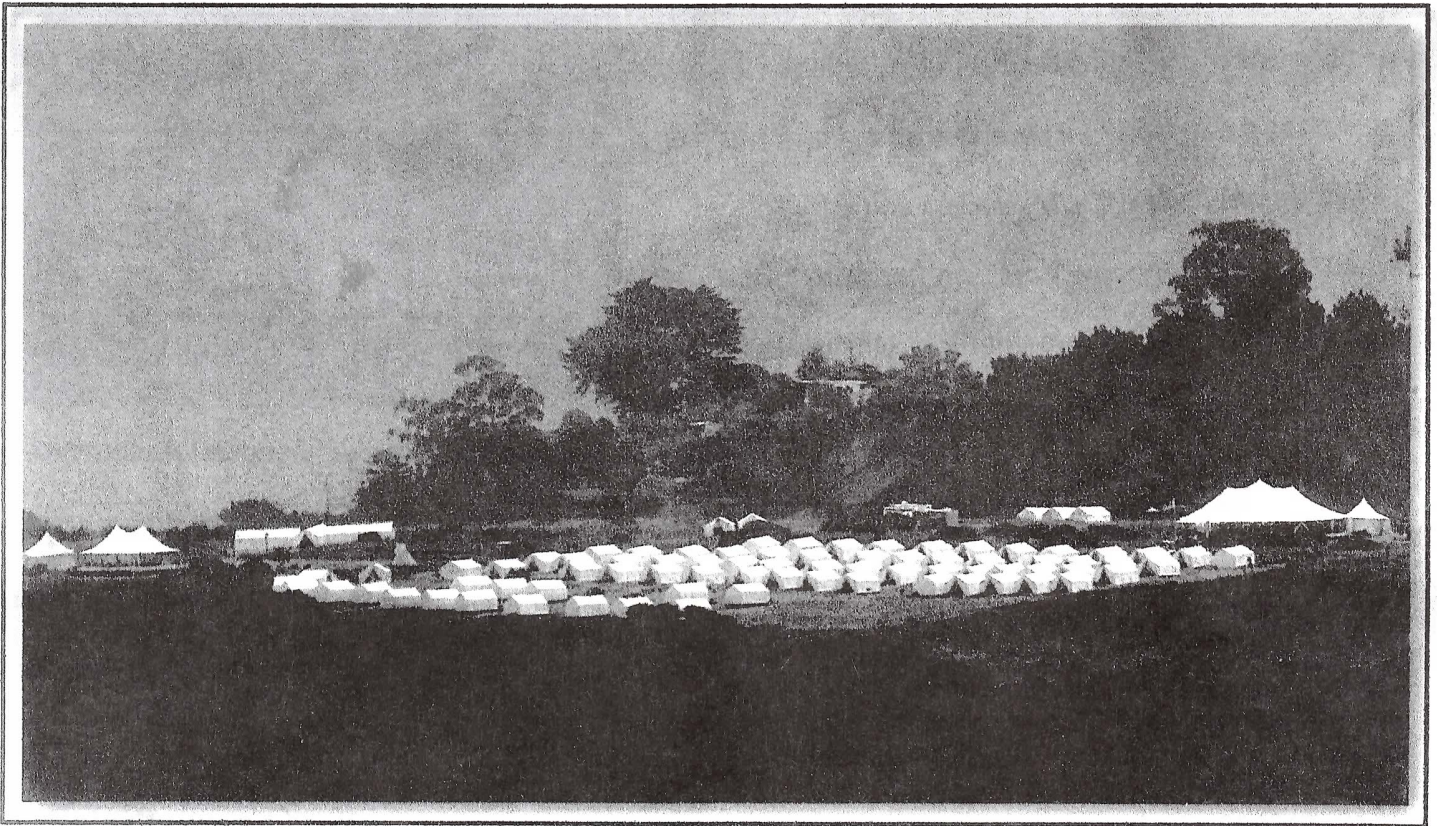

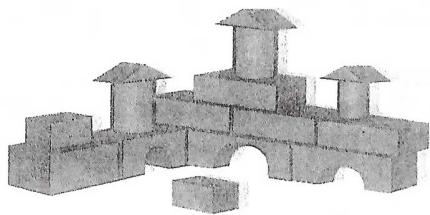
Dear friends,

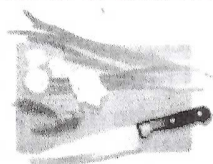


THE BOLINAS CHILDREN'S CENTER

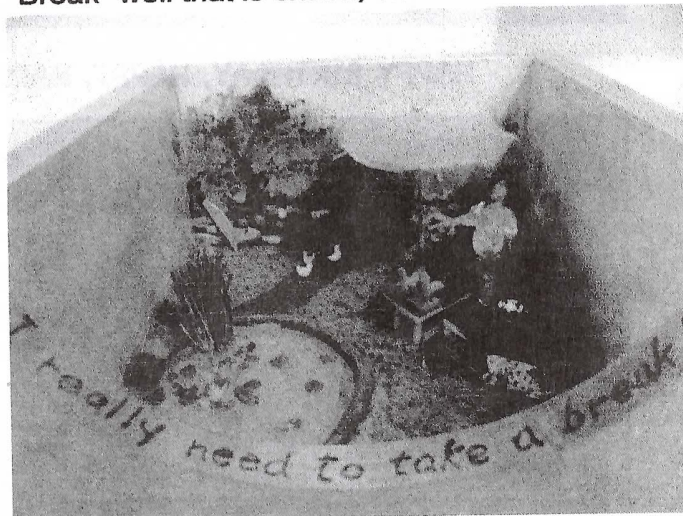

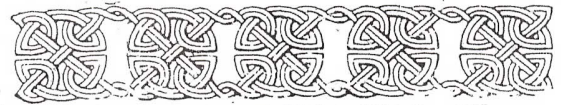

IMAGES FROM THE FILLMORE AT BOLINAS GALLERY, 1994-2012

Dan Dion, house photographer at the Fillmore Auditorium in San Francisco shows a selection of over forty black and white and color prints from over 1,000 onstage, backstage and portrait photographs of the world's greatest touring musical and comedic performers at the Fillmore over the past eighteen years. He joined the Fillmore staff shortly after graduating from the Academy of Art in San Francisco. Dan Dion credits his success with working with difficult people to his mentor Jim Marshall who taught him the importance of human relationships. "It is about trust." He also said that his height helps. He is six feet two. Dion's book, *Satiristas!* a collaboration with Paul Provenza of comedian portraits and interviews was published in 2010 and is available at the gallery. Dan Dion will be at the Bolinas Gallery on Saturdays and Sundays from 12 to 6 through August.

It had been my intention to document harrowing escapes from the police by people you see here daily. The Bolinas Peoples' Store Plaza and the routine magic that occurs there and The Bolinas Community Center have trumped this exploration for now. When you sit in the Plaza in the sun, you'll see that people don't really enter the area. No, they somehow appear, one minute not there, the next minute seated in the square or coming out of the store. It recalls the Donovan song, "first there is a mountain, then there is no mountain, then there is." There are many benign activities and excellent vibrations here; eating healthy food, charity, enjoying the company of a friend, all day sun, playing the guitar, people watching, or just relaxing and taking a few minutes' time out. Today a mother and her six-year old struggle to carry paper bags full of clothing to the Free Box; minutes later a toy is discovered by a mom for her grinning toddler, Eatdog checks it out and scores a beautiful large clear glass vase with cover. He's pleased. There is a garden with pink and white roses to the left and Carmen and Arn are seated in the shade with friends of all ages and they are laughing and speaking Spanish. There is a totem pole carved with eclectic archetypal images that compound the magic atmosphere. To the left of the Bolinas Peoples' Store door is a people post on the wall; a chalkboard sign to the right says "open all the halcyon days of summer." Inside, in the granola aisle, a stocky fourteen-year old boy is looking up and excitedly telling a lady about the 24 lb. salmon he caught in the Boat Clubs' fishing derby; he



almost won the prize for the biggest fish, "maybe next year", she encourages him. The produce always looks pretty and a great number of people, I'm not a cook, know what to do with it, and the place is always staffed by cheerful helpful local people. Charlie dishes up split pea soup for me, he'll be rocking out at Smiley's next Saturday. Clare, the woman in black, is unloading fresh fruit and vegetables in the Plaza. The smell of bay leaves and lamb is coming from "Barbary Coast Bistro" in the Community Center kitchen. The Bolinas Community Center kitchen and the entire plant reflect the work of its volunteers, donors, and Board who have worked with *consideration and deliberation to create a treasure*, a multipurpose community space. Its regular events bring health, culture, and pleasure. Howard Dillon and Molly Maguire and scores of adults and children recently brought Woody Guthrie alive here, on his one hundredth. Woody wrote the classic song "This land is your land" and was Bob Dylan's role model. There is Yoga in the morning from Trishna. This Labor Day a ton of people will be working to ensure that the BCC's most important event of the year, a fundraiser, is successful. Do what you can, give all you can. Every Thursday at noon there is a free food giveaway. Woody would have loved all of it. -D. Hill

MESA PARK BOARD MEETING  
 July 16, 2012, 7:00 PM  
 Firehouse Meeting Room

Board members present: Jane Mickelson, Patricia Hickey, Charles Whitefield

Others: Roger Peacock, Suki Ferrari, Jenny Pfeiffer.

Call to order: 7:35PM

Community Expression: Jenny reported that the school board voted last time not to go ahead with the proposed bond measure for school building construction. The survey showed that it would not pass at this time. This measure would not need a 2/3rds majority, just a majority of votes. The school principle has left to take a job elsewhere, so there will be a search for a new principal. [Patricia] We need to explore more fund-raising techniques to help support park maintenance and development. Charles offered to supply photos for a brochure.

Downtown Park: [Roger] The park was well and respectfully used on the 4th of July by all ages. Even the garbage was carefully stacked. Cleaning supplies have been purchased for the bathrooms, which are now open during the day. Arn is set up to open, close, and clean the facilities, and makes certain the lights are out. He's doing a great job.

Discussion ensued about setting up a separate, long-term budget for park maintenance, signage for the DT park, and fulfilling necessary employment laws for hiring. There is a need to have policy concerning vending in the park. Patricia suggested an evening meeting with the DT park committee and the MP board to discuss policy.

Maintenance Report: [Suki] We've had personal requests for use of the dumpsters. We have the small dumpster for the park, the larger green and recycle are someone else's, and the affordable housing has permission to top it off. The food giveaway sometimes overloads the recycle bins. Discussion followed concerning use policy for waste containers: private individuals need to receive permission in advance during off-season when the dumpsters are not full. If they want to make a donation to the MP (min. \$100) to use the big dumpsters, and separating out all the recyclables, they can meet with Charles or Suki to unlock the dumpsters. But during the summer season the bins are too full, unless it isn't a weekend. Patricia suggested bringing this up again at the next meeting when there's a full board.

[Suki] Rovon looked at the old tractor (inoperable for about 5 years) and feels it isn't restorable. We could buy a smaller one to replace it for what it would cost to repair the old one. He could take the old tractor away for parts. [Charles] This is something else we need the whole board to discuss. The water jug has disappeared. Alhambra is leaving the jugs outside and people are opening them. I need the account number to look into this. [Patricia] Is there some way we could have a lockable outside unit? [Suki] I'll ask Alhambra for suggestions for a safe way.

Pool Development: [Patricia] Christine asked about who pays for the invoices for the pool committee. It isn't included in the current MP budget. That needs to be included in the discussion between Anna, Christine and Jane.

Irrigation Report: [Patricia reporting for Bryan] He's sent an e-mail that the grant is in process still and may not come through this summer. The state is so under-staffed now that everything's been delayed. Charles reported that the large water storage tank for the system, donated by Mike Aiken, was destroyed during the tree cutting on the BPUD land. The tank was not being used because we are getting a pump adequate to bring the water up to the irrigation pump, but it could be useful elsewhere. Patricia suggested bringing this up with the full board.

Treasurer's Report: Patricia reported that at the end of this fiscal year, there's a balance of \$32,000 in MP checking account. Christine has written to the auditors and they suggest that we ask the county to help with the cost of the audit, to save money. She is taking care of the paperwork for our insurance and other issues. Charles suggested that it would be wise to have a year's budget worth in a savings account as a cushion.

Approve Warrants: Jane moved to approve the expenditures of the past month; Patricia 2nd. All ayes, 2 absent.

Other: Up-date on election status: [Jane] I've been working with Dan Miller at the Election department to meet the required deadlines for filing the data on the current board members and the necessary paperwork for filing the resolution on the proposed Measure #9.

Wording for parcel tax measure: The measure will specifically state that the parcel tax will be used for "Mesa Park located at 110 Mesa Road." [The Downtown park will not be funded from the proposed parcel tax. It will be privately funded.] Patricia moved to approve this wording of the measure; Jane 2nd. All in favor. Patricia moved that, based on the budget predictions (cost of labor & materials increases, and greater use of the park), the parcel tax be increased by \$4, from \$45 to \$49 per year. Charles seconded. All aye.

Approve Minutes: Patricia moved to approve the minutes with minor editorial changes from Geoff. Charles 2nd. All aye. Patricia moved to approve minutes for supplementary meeting on July 9; Jane 2nd, all aye.
