



The storage shed needs to be moved back a few feet.




Motion made and passed that the BCC be the fiscal sponsor for the Molly Maguire's West Marin Choir.

Prescient? Or Paranoid? From John Grissim's West Marin Journal, 1984.


One senses a mood shift in Bo Bo, or at least the anticipation of change. For example, after the great oil spill of 1971 when an influx of bright newcomers settled in and linked ideologies with the resident poets, there followed fermentation and tumult. The California vision of Ecotopia may have been born here. That elegant volume, *The Town That Fought To Save Itself* (by Orville Schell and Ilka Hartmann) was one of several gems that resulted.

However, after the tenth set of Bolinas highway signs disappeared, I remember thinking the book might well have been titled, *The Town That Dared Not Call Its Name*. Yet, in the last decade, it seems that many of the movers and shakers have moved on, while their places have not been taken by others with a similar zeal, expertise and vision. Granted, the platform stance remains intact and the Border Patrol is still a media presence, but most of the generals have retired or moved on. A sign of the times?

Howsoever one may interpret these developments, it seems that Bo Bo these days is a little less angry. To be sure, for every redneck elsewhere in these parts, there may be a corresponding Bo Bo astral fascist to keep the faith with occasional public outbursts of livid righteousness (though no names come to mind at this writing). Could it be that the inexorable forces of rising property values and the Bed & Breakfast boutiquing of West Marin now lay claim to the future? If so, the impact of such a trend bears close scrutiny.

The town of Bolinas (as distinct from Downtown Bo Bo) would certainly merit examination in this event. To that end I have made application to the Consulate for a visa. Gee, I don't know what all the fuss is about. Paul Kayfetz has graciously assured me that as soon as I tell him the desired date of my visit, he will make all necessary arrangements for my passport. Stay tuned.

Bolinas Museum's New Executive Director



After years of outstanding service as Executive Director, Vandy Seeburg (Lucy Van Sands Seeburg) is retiring. Finding her replacement has been a thorough and heartfelt process by the Bolinas Museum Board of Directors who appointed a committee to conduct the search. Committee members volunteered countless hours to evaluate over 35 applicants. The position of Executive Director requires multi-tasking and juggling complex administrative duties, detailed aesthetic decisions, producing announcements and brochures, maintaining the Museum facilities, budget management, attending various meetings and countless details for current and upcoming events, social relationships, fundraising, and setting up chairs. Vandy has managed all that and more with gracious efficiency while emphasizing teamwork with the staff, Board of Directors, Museum volunteers and supporters.

Mindful of these demands, the Search Committee's process became especially challenging after they reduced the list of impressive potential applicants to a few whose experience and interests met all the job requirements. Respecting each person's privacy, the process was not made public, though our communities were rife with speculation. It was up to each candidate to convincingly present their experience and qualifications along with their vision for the Museum. Each individual had strengths and drawbacks, so the committee gave each thorough and unbiased consideration using a criteria matrix. The day before the final candidates were scheduled for a full day of interviews with Board Members and Museum staff, each candidate was asked to write a project proposal for the Museum.

The other finalist, Deborah White, joined the Board and provided years of invaluable support, as did her husband Gordon White who assisted in the Strategic Plan process. During Vandy's tenure the Museum has flourished.

Toward the end of the interview process Vandy and Jennifer met and Vandy, who has invested so much energy into the Museum, feels confident in turning over the reins to Jennifer Gately. We know our communities, Museum members and visitors will warmly welcome Jennifer, support her, and help her to guide the Bolinas Museum into a bright future. 




