Mardi Wood ceramics: Bolinas master ceramicist known for elegant porcelain bowls, often decorated with Etruscan drawings inspired by her annual time in Italy. Sacred Tide: Kelsey Kirsch grew up in Stinson Beach. She combines hand dyeing, screen-printing and upcycling to make unique garments, accessories and home goods. Zelma Rose: Handmade fiber macramé' jewelry designed by fiber artist Lisa Anderson Shaffer of Marin County. Schehera Van Dyk, who grew up in Bolinas, has been creating meticulously detailed hand-painted ceramic vessels for twenty-two years, along with painted textiles. Benevolent Tide Club: A trio of creative women in San Francisco that include Salter Vintage, Mohinders (handcrafted) Shoes and Susan Hof who creates bags from reclaimed sails and horse harness. Birdview Distillary: Handcrafted California fine brandy made of coastal California cactus fruit. Locust House: Kurtis Major's custom jewelry design incorporates natural materials in the formal context of rectilinear design. The Heart Way: Julie Alonso creates dreamcatchers, prayer arrows, wall art, and cards, along with vintage clothing and accessories. Kelp Prairie: Lina Jane Prairie uses her biology expertise, artistry and a state harvesting license to create sculptural baskets from kelp and beach-collected materials. Wilderness Workshop: Thayer Allyson Gowdy and her father share a passion for making stained glass works, leather stools and wooden plate ware. Madime: Berkeley based fibermaker creates handmade and hand-dyed macramé' plant hangers and wall hangings. Patricia Yenawine: Bolinas ceramicist who creates fine stoneware ceramics. primarily using anagama wood-firing and salt-glaze techniques. Ashley Eva Brock: fashion designer & dyer, Brock presents hand-dyed one of a kind garments. Charlie Callahan: offers his iconic sea urchin image in prints. Live Music: Kurione: Local musicians Joe Armin (guitar) and Charlie Callahan (drums). Kate & Andrew Sweeney: a husband and wife dreamy folk duo. Kate is also half of the musical group Magic Magic

Thayer Allyson Gowdy, professional photographer and director, coordinates Native Daughter as a collaborative creative workshop in Bolinas, hosting gallery shows, pop ups, exhibits, poetry readings, record & tea parties, rock trading and craft nights, along with creative classes on photography and portfolio editing.

We are shocked and saddened to announce the unexpected passing of Pat Barton, age 67, 16 year resident of Bolinas, CA on July 17 due to a pulmonary embolism. Pat was born in Stamford, Connecticut to Gordon Brittain Whelpley and Emilie Iselin Whelpley. She is survived by her husband, Bill Barton, their two sons, Will and Sam, and siblings Katharine Draper, Anne Shaw, and Gordon Whelpley.

Born in Stamford, CT, Pat grew up in Darien. She graduated from the Thomas School, attended Garland Junior College and Boston University, and, following her great passion, went on to the Culinary Institute of America. She also trained at the Pacific Basin School of Textile Arts in Berkeley.

Pat moved to California in the early 1970's and lived in a unique mountain cabin off Panoramic. She was an avid textile weaver. She met Bill in the spring of 1977. They traveled together to Cowes, England as part of the support team of David Allen's legendary yacht Imp. Pat and Bill were married in 1981 in Darien and returned to live in Mill Valley. In 1986 they moved to Ross to raise their children.

Patty had unique culinary skills. She was assistant chef in several establishments before getting married, including the Mountain Home Inn. She was the ultimate homemaker and mother to her children and a huge supporter of her husband's interests and work. She had a heart of gold that touched all who knew her. She gave endlessly, selflessly, and enthusiastically to causes she loved and to people she cared about.

Pat volunteered continuously in the communities she lived in. She and Bill and their two sons moved to Bolinas in 2002, and for the last 8 years she had helped at the Bolinas library and was serving on the board of directors. Pat was an avid reader. She kept up with the news from all over the world and was outspoken about her liberal democratic political views, particularly with like-minded friends. She had a deep passion and curiosity for observing birds and wildlife in their habitats and volunteered as a docent for many years at Audubon Canyon Ranch. As a member of the Bolinas Rod and Boat Club, she could always be seen helping out at any event. Along with her husband, Pat was also a Briones Lions Club member. She loved her garden and taking care of her pets. All who knew her loved her. Her passing leaves a hole in many lives, and her wisdom and patience will be sorely missed.

## An Evening with Martin Shaw & Paul Kingsnorth

08/04/2017 - 7:00pm

An evening with mythologist and storyteller Martin Shaw and novelist and poet Paul Kingsnorth exploring the role of the mythic imagination in the world today. What can myths and old stories tell us about the current global turmoil? Martin and Paul will read from their recent work and discuss the role of story in the times we find ourselves in.

Dr. Martin Shaw is a mythologist and a rites-of-passage guide from the UK. He is regarded as one of the most exciting teachers of the mythic imagination. He is co-designer (with Dr. Carla Stang) of the Myth and Ecology MA program at Schumacher college, and led the Oral Tradition course at Stanford University. Martin is also the principal teacher at the Great Mother conference in the US. Author of the award winning A Branch From The Lightning Tree, Snowy Tower, and Scatterlings: Getting Claimed in the Age of Amnesia, his translations of Gaelic poetry and folklore are widely published.

Paul Kingsnorth is an English writer and thinker. His first novel, The Wake, was longlisted for the Man Booker Prize in 2014. His second, Beast, is published this August by Graywolf Press, as is his essay collection, Confessions of a Recovering Environmentalist. Paul is co-founder of the Dark Mountain Project, an international network of writers, artists and thinkers in search of new stories for turbulent times.

#### Stinson Beach and Bolinas Community Cleanup Week of September 4<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup>, 2017

Stinson Beach and Bolinas residential garbage customers may place cleanup materials from their homes at the curb for collection. You must follow all listed requirements to ensure collection. Items must be at the curb by 6 am on your <u>regularly scheduled collection day</u>. Please don't put items out earlier than the day before your collection day.

#### Who May Participate:

Residential customers: With accounts in good standing.

Multi-Family Complexes: Complexes with central collection bins must request Cleanup Week collection service. Call 800-243-0291 no later than September 1<sup>st</sup>.

Businesses: Not eligible to participate.

#### Requirements:

All requirements must be adhered to during cleanups.

1) Each participant is allowed to dispose of:

14 bags, boxes or cans of refuse up to 3 cubic yards may be placed at the curb **OR** 

7 bags, boxes or cans of refuse AND 1 bulky item OR
2 bulky items (a bulky item is considered an item too
large for your trash cart, such as a couch, chair, dresser, etc.).
Some bulky items require an appointment or may incur a
collection fee, see 'Special Handling' below.

- 2) Excess materials will not be removed.
- 3) Loose items will not be collected.

All material must be contained in bags, boxes or cans. Yard trimmings must be less than 3" in diameter & less than 3' long, and must be bundled.

4) Prohibited items will not be removed.

No construction and demolition debris. No liquids, rock, bricks, cement, dirt or asphalt.

5) Hazardous waste will not be collected.

No hazardous waste will be collected curbside: no propane tanks, paint, batteries, pressure treated wood, tires, televisions, computer monitors or "e-waste". Visit <a href="www.unicycler.com">www.unicycler.com</a> for e-waste collection & hazardous waste information.

6) Recyclable items.

Keep all recyclable and yardwaste items clearly separated from cleanup debris. Consider donating usable goods to a thrift store or other reuse program.

#### Special Handling:

Oversized, heavy, bulky item:

Bulky items must weigh LESS than 60 pounds, be less than 5 feet long and capable of being loaded easily into a truck. Large furniture requires an appointment. Call Redwood Empire Disposal at 800-243-0291 by Sept. 1<sup>st</sup> for collection of large metal items and appliances, such as washer, stove, microwaves, water heaters and refrigerators. A \$30 fee is charged for collection of any refrigeration unit.

A \$20 fee will be charged for the collection of mattress.

No appointment is needed for small items and general household garbage as described above.



with full understanding of the significance of the absurd arrangement absurd this being an orderly adjusting obedient shaping checking loyalty the sedentary square on the sand all of it turned towards the sea in which it is gradually sinking a motor boat brings a conductor in a full evening dress to a pageant yonder in the sea he mounts the wave-washed steps facing the sea in the sea concerto begins the obedient arrangement and obsessive in itself adjusting the conductor in his black he raises his hand up the sea concerto begins square of the audience flowed by the waves the he seems to be more and more remote dress-coat far from the shore he seems to be more and more remote the movements of his hands are suggestive hypnotic he raises his left hand high up along the strand among the public whizzes a motorcycle at full speed crazy fast another one after it it sprinkles the waves a third a fugue of motorcycles fifth the conductor from the other side a huge farm tractor is motors . the heavy rattle of the tractor raises his right hand the din of motors approaching sprinkles of water the conductor shoots right up a rocket rhythmic strokes of foamy waves
t a rescue boat is coming from with its buzzer set on the sea a permeating whistle of the siren the conductor turns towards the audience fish from a huge bucket and throws them at his listeners he picks dead methodically all of a sudden he strips off his dress coat then with growing fury and keeping it at its sleeves ends he veils his face
