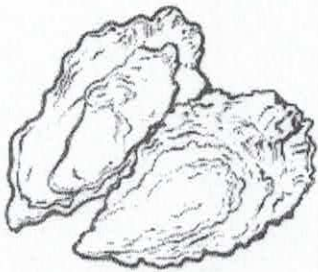

Dear Supervisor Rodoni,

The letter by Bob Johnson in the September 7 Pt Reyes Light alerted us in more depth to what I had already felt uneasy about. The subject came up in the meeting you had with us here in Bolinas. I expressed then my discomfort with the proposed installation of rumble strips.

In his article he says that among the areas especially impacted by the whirring of the rumble strips Wharf Road is listed. Bob writes that they are quite audible for a mile or more in open areas. He said he has experienced this.

I live on Wharf Rd across from Highway 1 and noise really carries across the lagoon from there.

Apparently the so-called safety reasons for installing them are questionable and for bicyclists it is said to be considered unsafe.

Apparently there has not been an analysis or a discussion with the public about the ongoing noise impacts and safety of installing rumble strips.

*Please intervene on behalf of your constituents in West Marin with Caltrans regarding rumble strips and stop this project or at least give the public a chance to consider and have a say in the matter before it happens!*

**Due to these potential noise impacts on people and wildlife this project should have been broadly noticed to the public and workshops held to gauge the opinions of West Marin citizens. This is especially needed, as the justification for the project is weak.**

## MORE NOISE COMING SOON

Caltrans justifies adding centerline rumble strips to 30 miles of State Route 1 throughout Marin County by arguing that they will reduce crossing-the-centerlines accidents. Yet most states don't use centerline strips when speeds are below 50 mph. the accident rate for fatalities or injuries on Highway 1 is not higher than the statewide average for highways, as far as I can ascertain. There are three key reasons Caltrans should drop this project.

**The strips endanger cyclists.** The main Colorado bicycle organization opposes centerline rumble strips as a danger to bikers and the Marin County Bicycle Coalition opposed the Highway 1 strips in 2014, due to the highway being narrower than the federally recommended minimum width. Caltrans has apparently not studied this type of strip and I can't find any other studies regarding safety though the Caltrans District 4 bicycle advisory committee was concerned about safety issues early on in this project.

**The second issue is noise. I have visited two sites in California with this kind of reduced-height rumble strip. They are less noisy than the older kind, but are still quite audible for a mile or more in open terrain, especially to homes above the highway. In fact, several states have stopped installing rumble trips due to noise complaints. One state even removed them due to public opposition.**

In West Marin, quiet is a critical part of our environment. I believe that Caltrans does not understand the importance of low noise levels to the people who live here. Caltrans will not install the strips in the villages due to noise impacts, but **project maps shows that other areas not in villages are likely to receive significant noise including upper Muir Beach, the Calles and Dipsea Road in Stinson Beach, Wharf Road in Bolinas, Inverness and Inverness Park, Millerton Point and Tomales Bay Oyster Company. The Coastal Act mandates the protection of scenic resources of the coastal zone, and singles out rural areas for certain protections. I would argue that we need to protect the quiet quality of these rural areas.**

**The whirring sound of the rumble strips will also interfere with bird calls within 100 yards or so of the highway. Bird calls are essential for marking territories and mating. This potential effect should have prompted an impact report and should have been identified by the National Park Service, whose lands will be affected.**

**Nor was there an analysis on the ongoing noise impacts in the California Coastal Commission's report on the project.**
