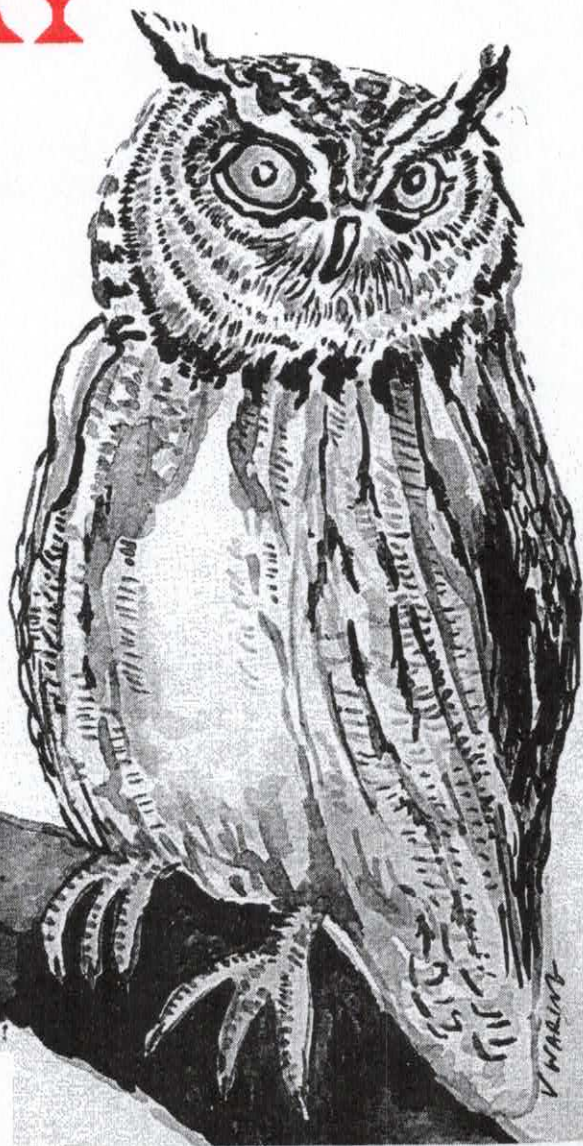

West Marin Fund Announces its Tenth Round of Community Grants – Applications Due October 4, 2017

West Marin Fund is pleased to announce its tenth round of Community Grants, supporting **“What’s Needed Most”**. Best and his crews built the first Burning Man Temple in 2000, which marked the beginning of a new and profound ritual for the tens of thousands of participants who attend Burning Man each year. After days of writing prayers on the structures, of affixing offerings from one’s life such as pictures, paintings, etc., or of leaving the ashes of loved ones, etc. the Temple were burned on Sunday nights. Best has done other major temple projects in Derry/Londonderry in Northern Ireland, London’s Burning festival, San Francisco, Detroit, and elsewhere.

In this presentation and discussion with The New School Host Steve Heilig, David will talk about his efforts and inspirations, with visual images of this striking and even awe-inspiring work.

David Best

David Best is an internationally renowned American sculptor. He is well known for building immense temples out of recycled wood sheets for the Burning Man festivals, where they are then burnt to the ground in a spectacle of light and heat. He has created sculptures from the skeletons of 36 cars and two buses, and worked with more than 10,000 people.

Best received a master’s degree in sculpture from the San Francisco Art Institute. His commitment to public art seems rooted in 1960s-era idealism. His works – ceramic sculpture, collages and more – have been shown at the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, the Oakland Museum, the San Jose Museum of Art di Rosa and elsewhere. – SUBMITTED BY STEVE HEILIG

The museum's new exhibitions blend science and fine art to explore effects and future threats of changing shorelines, warming seas and climate change.

In the main gallery **Hugen / Starkweather: Where Water Meets Land.** San Francisco collaborative team Huguen / Starkweather's Shifting Shorelines project investigates sites where land meets water, and the complex historical, environmental, and political factors that shape them. Through scientific data, maps and photographs, and interviews they gather diverse information then translate the information into abstract drawings and paintings that reinterpret the complex narratives of a landscape, creating new and unexpected forms through which to consider a place. Their latest series focuses primarily on coastal Marin.

In the photography gallery: **Camille Seaman: Melting Away.** For over a decade, Camille Seaman has documented the rapidly changing landscapes of Earth's polar regions. As an expedition photographer aboard small ships in the Arctic and Antarctic, she has chronicled the accelerating effects of global warming. Seaman's unique perspective of the landscape is entwined with her Native American upbringing: she sees no two icebergs as alike; each responds to its environment uniquely, almost as if they were living beings. Through Seaman's lens, each towering chunk of ice—breathtakingly beautiful in layers of smoky gray and turquoise blue—takes on a distinct personality, giving her work the feel of majestic portraiture.

In the Coastal Marin Artists gallery: **Ellen Litwiler: Oceanic** Growing up in Muir Beach, where her studio is today, the dramatic coastline of Marin County inspired Ellen Litwiler's limitless curiosity about the natural world around her. After graduating from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, she spent twenty years working with scientists and artists, creating natural history museum exhibits. In this exhibition her liquid graphite art on clayboard express science and wonder for the significance of the health of our planet and the intricate balance of Earth and Ocean.

To Dennis Rodini,

I'm writing to express some concerns that I have regarding the expected installation of rumbles strips in West Marin. I understand that the statistics apparently show a reduction in potential accidents (though I don't know how the data was analyzed — since potential accidents can't really be quantified). But I am aware of the following:
 There are known — and widely documented — issues with noise, audible at a mile or further (improved, but not eliminated by a sinusoidal design).

There are known dangers to bicyclists and motorcyclists (and the others involved in accidents with them).

I understand that the intention here is to install center-line strips (not shoulder strips, which would be even more risky for bicyclists), but both the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) guidance recommends that agencies maintain 14 feet of pavement beyond the edge of the center line rumble strips where vehicles and bicycles are expected to share the lane. **That is not the case here.**

I'm also concerned that motorcyclists (and they are abundant!) may lose control riding over the strips may lose control and cause more accidents. (See links concerning motorcycle accidents below.)

They have been removed from some areas, at significant expense, after a year or more or public complaint.

There has been a pattern of going ahead with installation without opportunities for public comment, as appears to be happening here. I live one block over Sir Francis Drake in Inverness Park, where road noise is already an issue, and my partner lives on the edge of Bolinas Lagoon, where noise from Hwy. 1 can be heard.

I strongly believe that the affected public should have a real opportunity to engage in the decision as to whether and/or how this plays out. Because I'm quite sure that if this goes ahead without agreement on the part of the affected residents that will an expensive battle that may result in the ultimate removal of rumble strips.

I also hope that the BCPUD will engage in this to produce a satisfactory result.
