



Saturday September 24th
2 PM Preview talks by curators / 3-5 PM

We all drive through our coastal landscape and see lush crops in fields and cows grazing on the hills, we buy fine local cheese, fresh caught fish, organic produce and meat, but how many know of us know who the farmers and ranchers are and what their life is like?

This Bolinas Museum program spotlights the whole coastal region from Tomales and Point Reyes Peninsula to Marin Headlands. Fine food production has been central our coastal history since around 1834, and today coastal Marin is internationally recognized for quality products, visionary innovators, and commitment to land stewardship. The producers are supported and in turn provide jobs for a network of hundreds of people from truck drivers to chefs. They all depend on each of us to choose their fresh, locally grown, nutrient rich food.

On Saturday, the museum opens new exhibitions, curated by Elia Haworth and Sandy Dierks, in all five of the museum's galleries, including Bounty: Fine Food Production in Coastal Marin-1834 to the 21st Century, and three very different photography exhibitions: Lexicon of Sustainability: Visionary Principles, Art Rogers: Faces of the Land, and, in the history room, Photographs by M.B. Boissevain, plus a new selection from the Permanent Collection. Bolinas filmmaker Marc Sanchez-Corea has made a beautiful short film for the exhibition.

The opening also kicks off of the museum's extensive schedule of talks, tours and special events along with events created in partnership with many organizations, farmers, ranchers, scientists and sages. Bolinas Museum has published a full program of events that will be available throughout the region. This is a rare opportunity to get to know a significant and fascinating part of our coastal community.

Please join us this Saturday afternoon in the museum's courtyard. It is free and all are invited. Hors D'oeuvres of locally sourced delicacies are generously provided by Inverness Park Market, Coast Cafe and Beth's, all dedicated supporters of community and local agriculture. Beverages generously provided by Heidrun Meadery and Point Reyes Vineyards, Apple Garden Farm and Lagunitas Brewing Co. Come at 2 PM and hear insights about the exhibitions from the curators and Douglas Gayeton of Lexicon of Sustainability fame. For more information see bolinasmusum.org

Marc retired from his 32- year career as a news cameraman and editor for ABC news and turned to his own filmmaking. His background and experiences will surprise you.



Vandalism spree hits over a dozen signs in c. Update on Resource downtown Bolinas

Eighteen street signs were vandalized with spray paint in Bolinas last week. The affected signs included a stop sign, several no-parking signs, several parkparallel signs and signs prohibiting fires and camping on the beach; they were all located on Wharf Road and Brighton Avenue. Marin County road crews are in the process of removing the markings, work the county estimated will cost around \$8,500. While some Bolinas residents are critical of outsiders and have taken guerrilla measures in the past to restrict tourism, Robert Goralka, a transportation manager for the Department of Public Works, said the county is interested in holding vandals accountable for any incident, no matter the location. In an email, Mr. Goralka said Marin places a "very high priority on graffiti removal" where it causes a potential safety issue, such as obstructing the visibility of stop signs; interferes with the implementation of community objectives, such as parking regulation near the beach; features offensive language; or is placed in high-visibility locations.
