Please join us in the Bolinas Museum courtyard on September 30th 2-4 PM, at the farewell party for retiring Executive Director Vandy Seeburg

During her six-year tenure the Museum has flourished and her aesthetic decisions are evident to every visitor. Vandy and her artist-husband, Michael Gregory, raised their daughters Alice and Gracie in Bolinas, giving her a strong commitment to community. Emphasizing preservation of local history Vandy beautifully remodeled the Museum's history room—descendents of the earliest Bolinas settlers flocked to the room's re-opening party! She had invaluable oral histories digitalized and transcribed from old cassettes; co-authored the guide, Wharf Road; and organized memorable history tours.

She oversaw more than 120 varied exhibitions including "Bolinas in the 1970s...", Bay Area legend Gordon Cook; the inspiring women artists of Mithila, India, and Gee's Bend (whose art transformed their communities), to contemporary Native American art. More than seventy of the exhibitions featured or included Coastal Marin artists.

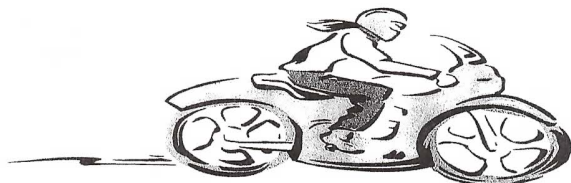
Among the grant awards she procured, the Irvine Foundation supported her Hispanic outreach programs. In addition to art talks, Vandy's ongoing series of free courtyard concerts and lively performances have drawn appreciative crowds, including the joyful Dia de las Madres/ Mother's Day Fiestas. Each year she organized the Museum's biggest fundraiser, the annual art auction and party where, this year, she was honored with a standing ovation.

Looking to the future Vandy worked with the Board on a long-range strategic plan. She initiated re-design of the logo and website, installed hardwood gallery floors, supervised preservation projects for our historic Museum buildings, procured a federally-funded historic collections assessment program, and much more. Dolores Richards, Vandy's predecessor who developed the Museum's high standard of excellence, recently spoke of her immense appreciation of Vandy's success.

Please join us on Sept. 30th at 2 PM in the Museum's courtyard: welcome the Museum's new Executive Director, Jennifer Gaitley, and share in a happy celebration and heartfelt thanks to Vandy, on her last day, for her years at the Museum—her vision, talent and energy. (Liz Robinson)

Since he was also an active citizen of the West Marin Community, as well as a trickster, musician, author and entertainer, the film will show the various aspects of his life and include comments by many people who knew him. As examples of biographical documentaries by Oscarwinner John Korty, two existing films will be shown. JOHN ALLAIR DIGS IN! and IMOGEN CUNNINGHAM, PHOTOGRAPHER. A few short clips from the Okamura video, already in production, will be shown unedited. The fund-raising plan will be presented and explained. **Bolinas Museum Opening Reception  
for three new exhibitions  
Sat. Sept 29 3-5 PM**

**In the main gallery: Reflections from the Lake:  
Morris Graves and Kay Russell.**

Curator Barbara Janeff has created a three part story: About Morris Graves, a very important mid-to-late 20th century painter who began with a group of Pacific Northwest artists including Mark Tobey. They were profoundly influenced by Asian art, religion and philosophy; About the 'Lake', Graves' remote and enchanting home for his last 35 years and now the Morris Graves Foundation where many Bay Area artists have been 'residents'; And how a residency at the 'Lake' influenced Kay Russell, a well known watercolor painter and teacher. It is a story of East meets West on the Pacific Rim and a 'new' American aesthetic.

**In the photography gallery: Andrea Camuto: Loss of Terrain.** Between 2005 and 2009, Andrea traveled throughout war ravaged Afghanistan. Each time she reconnected with women and families she had met on her first trip, following them to hospitals, prisons, and barren relocation centers. Her eloquent photographs give us glimpses of ordinary Afghan people, caught in war, oppression and poverty, trying to live, to protect their children and to hope.

**In the Coastal Marin Artists gallery: Rick Spring: Animals and Objects.** Bolinas resident, stonemason and stone sculptor, Rick turns rock into a butterfly or a muscular snake, pink marble into a tender piglet and granite into a floating bowl. Using hand tools, some electric, he says, "I learn as I work, liking challenges and solving problems... knowing sound principles, then stretching the ideas."

**In the history room: (continuing) Bolinas Water Source and Organic Waste Treatment.** 38 years ago, visionary understanding of our limited water source and innovative sewage treatment were pivotal in saving Bolinas from development and setting the course for community conservation. Do you know where and how our water comes to us and how our organic sewer treatment system works? Do you know who the people are who watch over these systems 24/7 for all of us?
