OPEN LETTER TO PARK BOARD AND COMMUNITY

September 6, 2012

Dear Mesa Park Board Members;

Though I am planning to attend the September 6, Mesa Park Board Meeting, I'd like to share some personal thoughts for your consideration, before we meet in person.

I congratulate you for accomplishing the HUGE job you set out to do, overcoming the

County's

bureaucratic hurdles, and surviving the usual intense, scrutiny of the community. I am grateful to be in the middle of the current controversy regarding crafts sales in the park, because I feel I can offer insights and a unique perspective, gained from my experience as a street-artist in Bolinas, for almost 35 years.

Decades of spontaneous sales, in the Park have always drawn the community and visitors off the sidewalk, to gather for social, musical, and playful interchange...No one has ever been in charge; problems have not occurred, and over the years, no slick fleamarket vendors from outside the community ever invaded the space. There is little financial gain to entice "professional" vendors, and no logical reason why beautification of the Park will change this picture. Personally, I set up my

give myself permission to stop my busy life for a day, and spend time with friends sharing art and ideas. My being there, also gives them, and others, a reason to stop, look and share, in the

realm of social and cultural exchange.

We have heard some of the suggestions regarding possible rules and regulations for crafts/yard sales, in the Park, that I will address, when we meet. These proposed restrictions are controversial to many in the community, and would likely prevent spontaneous, creative endeavors, (a beloved tradition), and would effectively destroy the very heart of the endangered spirit of Bolinas. "E Pluribus Unum" has resonated from the soul of Bo, for as long as I can remember. The Community has requested respect for the wishes of many.

I've set up my table in the Park, the past three Saturday's. The first day, three artists joined me. The second time, two came. Last Saturday, I was there alone. In the middle of Suthers; what is this revealing? September, I'll be there twice. Will anyone else show up?

I have been inundated by positive feedback from Community members requesting "let it be, as it's been." Why not consider this option? If a problem occurs, (unlikely), it's been suggested to "deal with it then". Please, stop by the Park this Saturday, so we can talk further, and you can see what is really happening.
