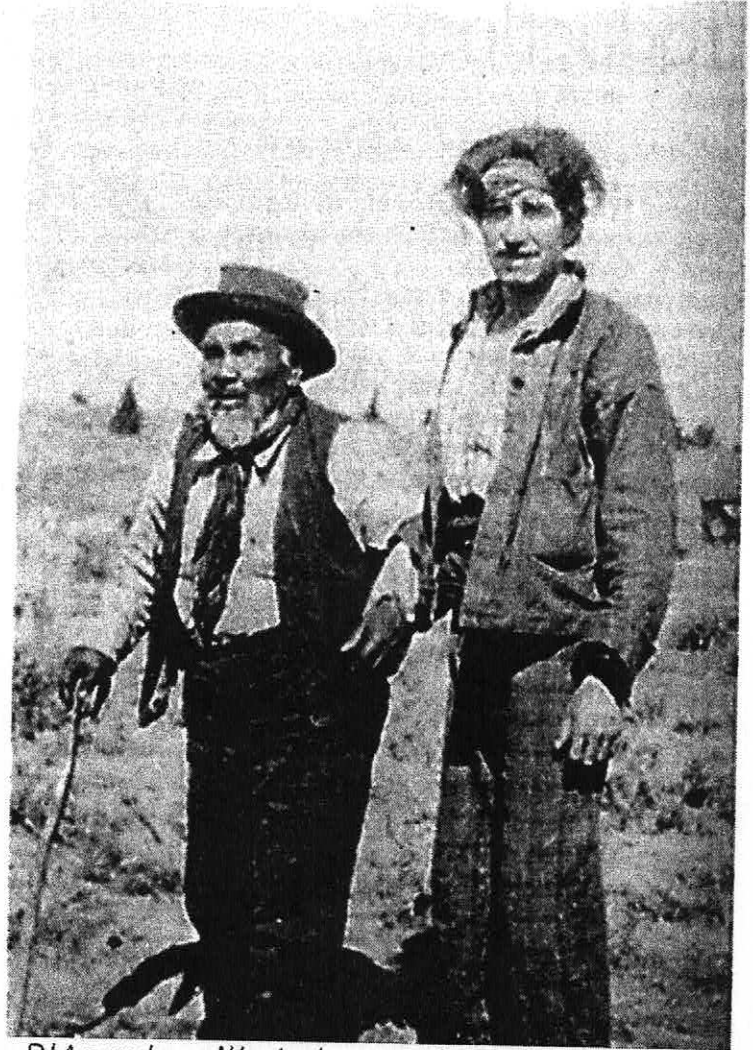
Who was Jaime de Angulo?

Come to the Bolinas Library Monday night, 9/11 at 7pm and learn more. Andrew Schelling will read from his biography, "Tracks Along the Left Coast: Jaime de Angulo and Pacific Coast Culture."

Jaime de Angulo (1887–1950) was a linguist, novelist, and ethnomusicologist in the western United States. Born in Paris of Spanish parents, he came to America in 1905 to become a cowboy, and eventually arrived in San Francisco on the eve of the great 1906 earthquake. He lived a picaresque life including stints as a cowboy, medical doctor and psychologist. He became a linguist and anthropologist who contributed to the knowledge of certain Northern California Indian languages, as well as some in Mexico.

DeAngulo lived on a mountain top in Big Sur before there were any roads and also lived part time in Berkeley. In addition to Pound and Jung, the affable de Angulo befriended D.H. Lawrence, Henry Miller, Harry Parch, Henry Cowell, Robinson Jeffers, and countless other poets, mystics, and scholars. As a Spaniard with a "spirit of wonder," he felt a special affinity with Native Americans and conducted studies by "going native."
