I have been involved in the graffiti movement for over 30 years. I am not saying this to cause dissent but to clarify my position on the "Green Wall" of Bolinas.

As a career artist and a paint expert I can say without hesitation that the green paint used on the wall is causing a massive toxic problem.

Let me explain; Spray paint is made from high gloss enamel. It dries with a very hard surface and last a very long time. The very fine spray covers solid without very much paint buildup. The best way to cover a very glossy and hard surface is to first sand the paint; sort of scuff it up so the next layer of paint can stick to it. If using a different kind of paint it's best to prime the surface with a universal primer before adding a finished layer.

Before I go farther I want to say in the last 10 years I did not see the graffiti peeling off the wall. On the many visits I made to Bolinas, I would go check out the Graff work on the sea wall. It was always an exciting art display and changed on a regular basis. But, again, I never saw any evidence of peeling paint.

Now as I walk by the wall it looks a mess. There is constant paint peeling off the wall and every time it's repainted it peels more. I have literally picked up a garbage bag full of large pieces of paint. The green paint is pulling off layers of paint a ¼ inch thick.

(I am speaking as an expert on paint and paint properties); when you use common water base house paint on an enamel surface the acrylic paint does not adhere to the wall. It is like mixing water and oil. They will never mix and the result will always be the same, a peeling wall. The water base paint is pulling layers very deep down, something that never happened before the green paint.

I do not know what committee got together and decided the wall needed to be painted. I don't know if it was ever brought to the community. Maybe if it was, there could have been a better solution. I am not saying we need to graffiti the wall, I'm saying there is a toxic problem now and it started from a short sighted individual /s. There could have been alternatives like a community mural painted by our town or a contest to bring a positive message to the ocean. Lets face it, forever there will be people going out there to spray paint, this probably won't stop. What needs to stop is the green wall night crew messing up the environment.

I am saying something because of the toxic problem this has caused. I think it's time for the silent to come out and look at this problem.

If you look at the graffiti movement over the past two decades it has made it's way into the art world. With exhibitions all over the world and San Francisco being one of the leaders of the movement it seems that some folks want to continue to place it in a criminal area. Many pieces of graffiti have ben commissioned all over the US (the world) and it has been the method to clean up neighborhoods where tagging is a problem. There is a difference between the ugly scrolls of nicknames and marks, TAGGING, and GRAFFITI. Graffiti is a lot more involved and

requires a skillful hand and a great imagination. Tagging is a crime and vandalism as graffiti is an art form. In most cities it has been noted that when a wall get a mural or a graffiti piece painted on it, there is usually no vandalism on it. Most street artist respect nicely done graffiti walls and don't want to disturb them. As a retired art teacher in the juvenile justice system I have seen my share of graffiti and tagging. As an artist I have shown my work in prestigious galleries.

Museums know the difference between the two and have had shows supporting the emergence of street art as a valuable art resource.

I think it's time to realize that graffiti is an art form and not a criminal activity. Maybe if we gave our artist places to paint we would see a better solution than what we are now facing.

Not sure what the folks around here think but that's my take on it...

NOTICE OF MARIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS HEARING Hearing on Amendments to the Marin County Code Title 22 (Development Code) related to Accessory Living Areas

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the Marin County Board of Supervisors will conduct a hearing on amendments to Title 22 of the Marin County Code related to accessory living areas. The hearing will be held on Tuesday, September 20, 2016.

The proposed Development Code amendments would define, clarify and modify the County's existing regulation of accessory living areas. A room with a wet bar in a single family residence or residential accessory structure would be defined as an accessory living area, and up to three of them per property may be made available for rent. The development code already allows rooms and accessory structures to have wet bars and to be rented without a permit, and no permit requirement is proposed in this Development Code amendment. The substantive changes to the current requirements are limited to restricting the number of wet bars that can be installed to a maximum of three per property and requiring that accessory living areas be leased for a minimum term of 30 consecutive days. While no income restrictions are proposed, accessory living areas are generally affordable by design and encouraging them serves as one strategy for providing more diverse housing in the County with the minimum impacts to local communities. Neither the Development Code nor these amendments apply in the Coastal Zone.




