

Expatriate Post: Dispatch to Boboland from a Small Town near France – VIII

Leave it to those theocrats to ruin a perfectly good epoch. Who would have thought an outdated calendar with an assortment of bumps and crevices could throw the human race into panic mode. For the record, however, I want it known that there are certain individuals I absolutely refuse to have around when the world comes to an end in 2012. **UPDATE ON THE TERRACE AVENUE SLIDE
REPAIR – OCTOBER 14, 2011**

To the Bolinas Community:

In response to many questions from the community about the status of the repair of Terrace Avenue at The County of Marin has provided the following update:

We have reached the design depth (65 feet below original road grade) to the bottom of the keyway and we should be starting to fill it in within the next week. Filling operations should take 2-4 weeks with final restoration work (road paving) immediately following that. The unexpected early rains have slowed things down a bit, but we are still on schedule to complete the job before Thanksgiving. The job is currently forecast to be at or below the original budget of \$1,452,000.
