I had the pleasure of watching a rough cut of local filmmaker, educator and skateboarder Clay Shank's "Four Rounds" last week at the Bolinas Commons.

Part one of a 4 part series, the film details daily life, full of hardship, family, skateboarding, and politics on the Crow Creek Reservation in North Dakota circa 2016. It was striking and heart-rending to see how rough things are in this poorest-per-capita place in the US, and to feel the immediacy of our genocidal past and its very real repercussions resonating now among people who are among the least-looked-after in our country.

"Four Rounds" has a raw, verité feel too it, and gives its subjects the space and time to speak for themselves. The film is generous with long, ambient footage of the trash-strewn landscape of the reservation, kids skateboarding and playing basketball, giving a vivid backdrop to insightful audio interviews with tribal elders, and making me feel like I was there.

This is an important subject matter, and one that Clay treats with respect, humor and humility. More to say, but I'll leave at that and just say that I highly recommend checking "Four Rounds" out.

Lucky for you, "Four Rounds," will be screened again, Sunday March 18th at the BCC. Weston Borg's short film "Community Sustainability" opens the night at 6PM. FREE.
